The Association organised its annual festival **Darśana** on 10th February 2020. In the first session, Bhikkhuni Thong Niem from Vancouver, Canada was invited to give a talk on "**The Status of Women in Buddhism**". The session was interactive with students asking a variety of questions related to the personal transformation as well as academic journey of the Buddhist Nun, who has written a PhD thesis on the same theme.

In the second session, various inter-college competitions were organised to give platform to students to actualize their hidden talents and enhance their creativity. The following competitions were held: Turncoat Debate on "The Art Transcends the Artist", Cinephiles, Open Mic and Weave a Story. All the events were well participated and attended.

Inter College Competitions:

1. Turncoat Debate: Association organized bilingual Turncoat Debate with the objective to provide a platform to undergraduate students where they could use their linguistic and creative skills of constructing argument for both sides of the motion. The motion before the house was - "This house believes that the art transcends the artist." The students from different colleges across various Universities took part in the event and made it a huge success. 20 participants from 13 colleges participated in the event.

2. Open Mic Competition: The main aim of this event was to provide a platform to students wherein they could express themselves. This objective of the event was clearly fulfilled by the participants who performed various art forms such as self-composed songs, poetries and even stand-up comedy by reaching out to everyone in the audience. 20 participants from 17 colleges participated in the event.

3. Weave a story (A story weaving competition): The purpose of the competition was to encourage students to use their imagination, linguistic skills and creativity to bring out the story - teller in them and instill the tradition of storytelling. The participants were given different themes on the spot such as 'Philosophy in practical life', 'Existential angst', 'Religion-Life Interface' and others. Many of the participants were able to captivate the audience with their imaginative stories. 16 participants from 6 colleges participated in the event.

Two Day Workshop on Short Film making

The Department Association organized a Two Day Workshop on Short Film making with Dr. Krishna Sankar Kusuma, Faculty member, A.J.K. Mass Communication Research Center, Jamia Milia Islamia University, Delhi on 17th and 19th February 2020 in Daulat Ram College. The objective of the workshop was to equip the faculty as well as students with the nuances of film making through easily available tools and softwares in mobile phones. The workshop was divided into four technical sessions. In the first session the students learned about the various intricacies of short film making and were taught different tools used in the process. The students were then given the task to capture sounds which Dr. Kusuma and his team evaluated in the second session. In the third session, held the next day, student groups were encouraged to make short films. Details of the course:

- 1) Description of the course: 2 days In-House Skill Development Program was organised to familiarize first year students with the usage of digital platforms and applications like G Suite and its features, Google classroom, Google Meet, Google calendar, Google docs, forms, etc. E-Resources like Swayam, Delhi University Library System, INFLIBNET, NPTEL, CEC, E-PG Pathshala, Archives.org, Open access books and journals databases, plagiarism, copyright issues, public domain resources etc. were discussed to enhance the learning experience of students. 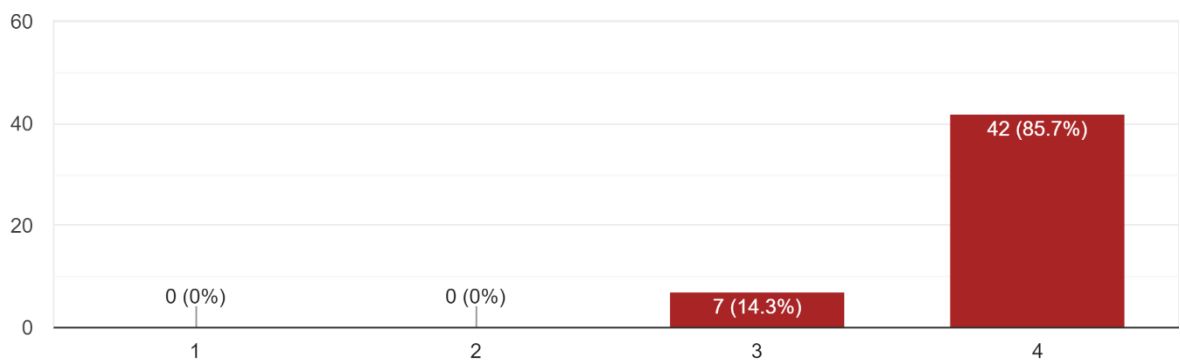

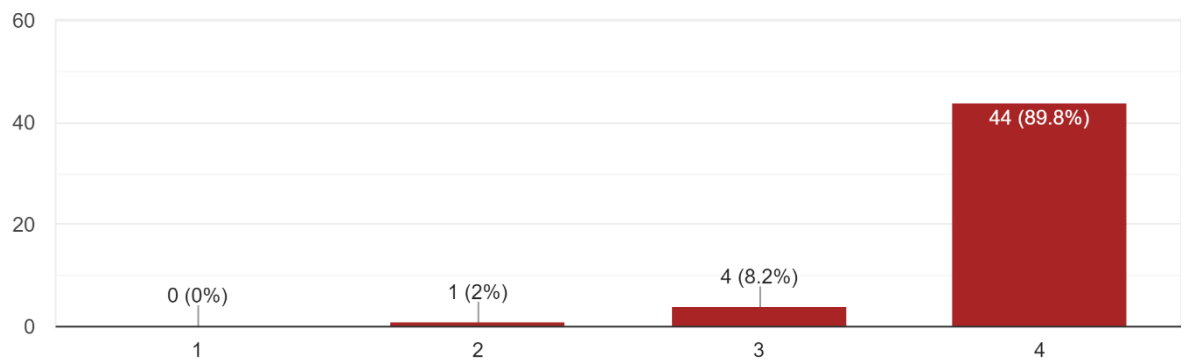

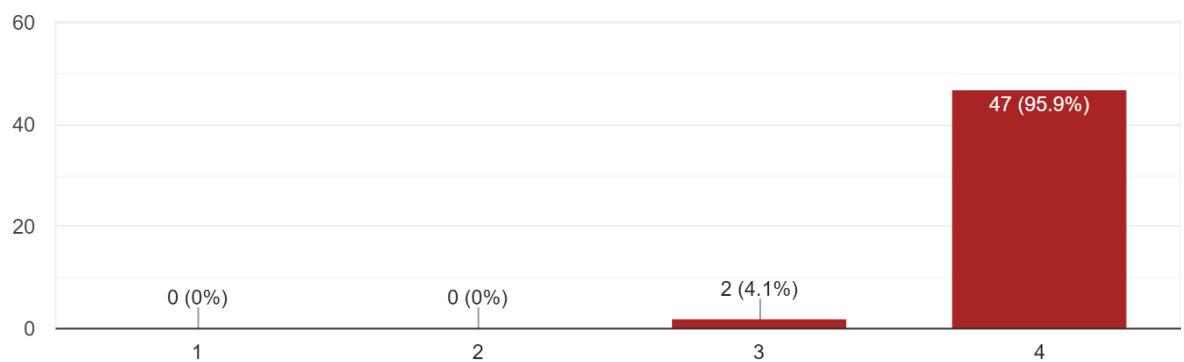

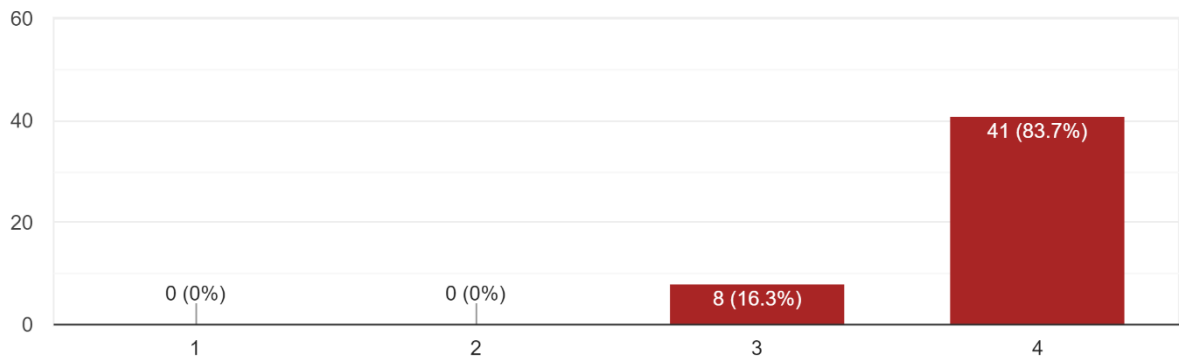

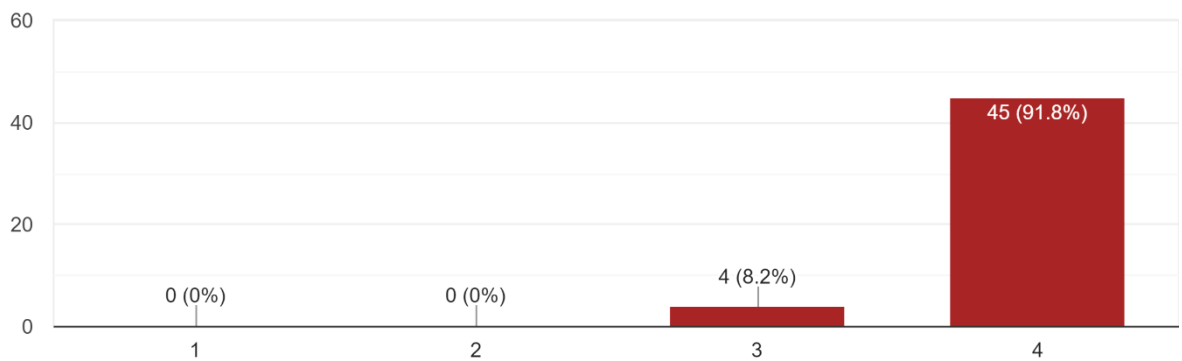

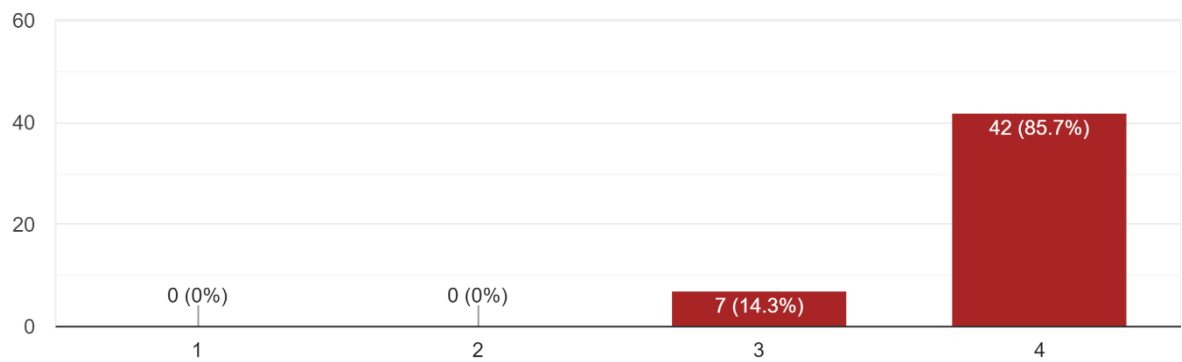

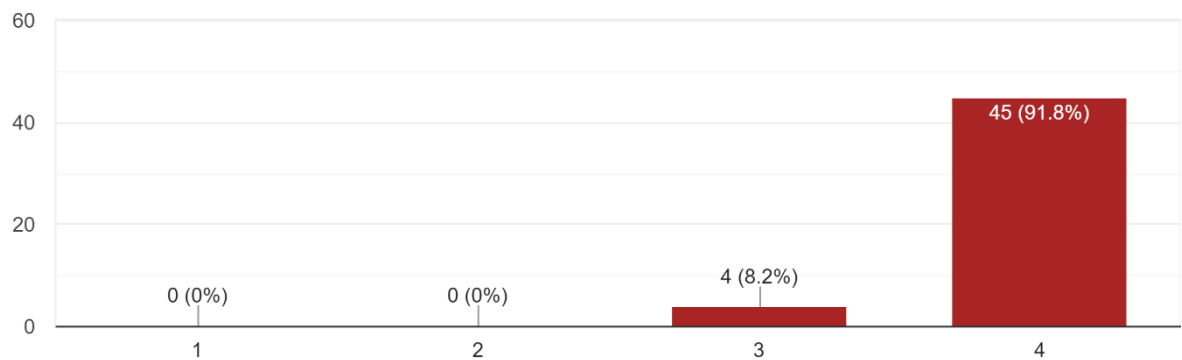
