OUTCOMES	This workshop enhanced faculty capacity to teach entrepreneurship using experiential and innovative methods. Participants learned to integrate resources like TeachingEntrepreneurship.org, Business Model Canvas Hackathons, and interactive exercises to foster creativity, problem-solving, and entrepreneurial thinking among students. The workshop emphasized guiding students from idea generation in earlier semesters to structured business plans by the 4th year, preparing them for potential incubation or implementation. Faculty also gained insights into aligning courses with practical learning outcomes, promoting industry collaboration, and building institutional support systems, thereby strengthening the overall entrepreneurship ecosystem within the college.

EVENT SUMMARY:

Inaugural Session

The inaugural session commenced with the ceremonial lamp lighting. This was followed by the felicitation of Prof. Rajni Abbi and Prof. Amita Gupta, acknowledging their valuable contributions and presence at the workshop.

Prof. Rajni Abbi delivered an insightful address on entrepreneurship, emphasizing its growing significance in today's dynamic economic landscape and the need to cultivate an entrepreneurial mindset among students. The Principal, Prof. Savita Roy, then addressed the gathering, highlighting the institution's focus on promoting entrepreneurship through academic initiatives and encouraging faculty to integrate innovative practices into teaching.

Prof. Amita Gupta elaborated on the vision and motto of DSSEED, providing an overview of its initiatives and their key objectives. She briefly discussed how these efforts aim to strengthen entrepreneurship education and create a supportive ecosystem for aspiring entrepreneurs. Prof. Amita Gupta provided a brief overview of all the Generic Elective (GE) papers on entrepreneurship, highlighting the structure, objectives, and learning outcomes of each course. She explained how these papers are designed to progressively develop students' entrepreneurial skills, from understanding fundamental concepts to applying them in practical, real-world scenarios. She also mentioned that DSSEED is in the process of introducing new new Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) papers on entrepreneurship, aimed at broadening access to entrepreneurship education for all students. Unlike the earlier framework, where only students pursuing a minor in entrepreneurship could enroll in specialized papers, these new SEC offerings allow students from diverse disciplines to engage with entrepreneurship courses.

Session by Mr. Neeraj Mittal

Mr. Neeraj Mittal emphasized key aspects of strengthening entrepreneurship within academic institutions. A major takeaway was the need for a well-defined roadmap for entrepreneurs, which ensures clarity of vision, goal setting, efficient resource utilization, and risk minimization, thereby enhancing the likelihood of success. The workshop also highlighted the critical role of business incubators as support systems that provide mentorship, infrastructure, funding guidance, and networking opportunities to help startups grow and scale.

Discussions further identified multiple drivers of entrepreneurial growth in institutions, including hackathons, innovation challenges, incubation applications, and industry collaborations, which serve as measurable indicators of progress. The integration of entrepreneurship into national frameworks like NAAC and NIRF reflects its increasing importance in higher education.

The workshop stressed that establishing an Entrepreneurship Cell alone is insufficient; institutions must adopt best practices, encourage interdisciplinary learning, and build strong industry and alumni networks. It also underscored that funding and market access are essential for sustaining incubators, while challenges such as limited resources and weak linkages must be addressed through strategic efforts and institutional commitment.

Session by Ms. Komal Chikkara

Ms. Komal Chikkara actively engaged participants through interactive tools such as Mentimeter, which enabled real-time responses and fostered a collaborative learning environment. This approach helped facilitators gauge participant understanding and tailor discussions for greater effectiveness.

The session focused on innovative resources and experiential learning methods to teach Entrepreneurship I and II more effectively. A variety of activities were introduced to enhance creativity, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills among students. These included the Effectuation Card Game, which teaches decision-making in uncertain environments, and the Failure Revenue exercise, which encourages learning from setbacks. The Marshmallow Challenge promoted teamwork and iterative thinking, while the Business Model Canvas Hackathon enabled participants to design and present business models in a dynamic setting.

Other engaging techniques discussed were Reverse Pitch, emphasizing problem identification, the Idea Napkin Exercise for concise idea development, and Entrepreneurship Role-Play for real-world simulation. Additionally, tools like the SCAMPER Technique and Six Thinking Hats were highlighted to encourage innovation and multi-perspective thinking. Overall, the workshop underscored the importance of integrating practical, hands-on approaches to make entrepreneurship education more dynamic and impactful. She emphasized the importance of leveraging **TeachingEntrepreneurship.org** as a valuable and structured resource for effectively designing and delivering entrepreneurship courses. This platform was highlighted for its practical tools, activity-based modules, and ready-to-use content that can enhance classroom engagement and experiential learning.

Session by Prof. Anjali Gupta:

Prof. Gupta discussed Generic Elective (GE) papers for semesters 5 and 6, with a strong focus on aligning the curriculum with practical and outcome-based learning. Faculty members were encouraged to move beyond theoretical instruction and adopt approaches that build real-world entrepreneurial competencies among students.

A key emphasis of the workshop was on the progressive development of entrepreneurial thinking throughout the academic journey. Prof. Anjali Gupta discussed the guidelines for the Entrepreneurship track for Semesters VII and VIII. It was suggested that by the 7th semester, students should be equipped with a well-defined and viable business idea, reflecting their understanding of market needs and innovation. Furthermore, by the 4th year, students are expected to refine and formalize their ideas into structured business plans, clearly outlining feasibility, scalability, and implementation strategies. This progression ensures that students are not only conceptually prepared but are also ready to take their ideas forward for incubation or real-world application.
