PROJECT ITMINAAN

With the aim of "Bread for Every Breath", Project Itminaan was launched on **4th June, 2020** to eradicate hunger. The initiative aims to ensure that each individual goes to sleep with itminaan (contentment). Till date, we have successfully fed **32,400 animals**. In the current session, we have a dedicated team of **49 volunteers**, who work hard everyday to help further the vision of the project.


PROJECT ITMINAAN ANNIVERSARY

The National Service Scheme unit of Daulat Ram College celebrated the successful completion of one year of Project Itminaan, on **4th June 2021**. A virtual event was organised to commemorate this milestone and to honour the efforts of all those involved in this initiative over the past year, with **71 volunteers** in attendance.



WEBINAR ON ANIMAL RIGHTS WITH MR. NIKUNJ SHARMA

NSS DRC organised a webinar under Project Itminaan: Bread for Every Breath in collaboration with **Mr. Nikunj Sharma**, the CEO of **Mercy for Animals India** on **25th August 2021**. This webinar was organised in light of International Dog Day, with **75 volunteers** in attendance. Mr. Sharma engaged in a meaningful discussion with the volunteers, sharing his expertise on a variety of topics including animal rights, zoochosis, movements against animal abuse, and legal acts that prevent cruelty against animals among others.



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FEED A STRAY ACTIVITY


NSS DRC organised an activity titled, **'Feed A Stray'** under its hunger alleviation initiative, Project Itminaan: Bread for Every Breath. The activity was held on the account of **International Dog Day** and it took place on **26th August 2021**. It saw the enthusiastic participation of NSS DRC volunteers as well as other students who stepped up to extend a hand of compassion to stray dogs in their locality. Through the combined efforts of **204 volunteers**, an impressive tally of over **710 strays** being fed was achieved.



WEBINAR ON WORLD FOOD DAY WITH MR. DOLA MOHAPATRA

NSS DRC conducted a webinar in collaboration with **Mr**. **Dola Mohapatra**, the Executive Director of **Rise Against Hunger India** and the Co-Founder of WorkMatterz on 17th October 2021. The event was organised in the light of **World Food Day**. **71 volunteers** attended the webinar. He started by highlighting the effects of world hunger caused by insufficient intake of nutrients, which adversely impact the global community. He emphasized that by being considerate of our food choices, reducing food wastage and taking action by supporting, donating and volunteering for healthy eating, everyone can make a difference.





AWARENESS POSTS

World Rabies Day is observed on 28th September to mark an annual global initiative to raise awareness about rabies and enhance prevention and control measures for the disease. To do our part, we posted two awareness posts on the official Instagram handle of Project Itminaan. The first post talked about what is rabies, its symptoms, aftereffects and prevention. The second post aimed to bust some common myths related to rabies.


PROJECT AVNI

Over the year, the unit has organised a variety of activities under the aegis of Project Avni to help reach the values that the project was founded on.


PAPER BAG MAKING ACTIVITY

National Service Scheme unit of Daulat Ram College organised **Paper Bag Making Activity** on account of **World Paper Bag Day** on **11th-12th July 2021**. The volunteers were given a detailed guide for making paper bags through a step-by-step instructions video stating precise measurements and procedures. A total of **1485 bags** were made with the efforts of **314 volunteers**, which were distributed to nearby vendors and shopkeepers. This helped to spread the message of sustainable living among the masses.




OZONE DAY PLANTATION DRIVE

NSS DRC conducted a Plantation Drive on the occasion of International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer to take a small step towards protecting the ozone layer. It was held from 15th-16th September 2021. 207 volunteers came forward to be a part of this initiative. Students from across the country volunteered to plant saplings and through their collective efforts, the plantation drive spread to numerous cities. 778 saplings were planted, helping in the conservation of the Ozone layer. All COVID-19 safety protocols were duly observed throughout the conduction of this activity. The Plantation Drive was a success as the volunteers confidently took the initiative forward and sincerely contributed to an important cause.



POLY-FLOWER MAKING ACTIVITY

NSS DRC organised 'Poly-Flower Making Activity: Reusing Polythene Bags at Home' from 24th to 25th September 2021. The basic aim of conducting the activity was to reiterate the point that throwing plastic wastes in river bodies is not the way to go and that we can creatively utilise plastic to save the environment. 94 volunteers enthusiastically participated and created beauty out of what we usually refer to as 'waste'. They managed to make a total of 577 poly-flowers of various vibrant colours, such as black, white, blue, red, yellow, and purple, among many others.





RIVER DAY WEBINAR WITH MR. DHARMESH BARAI

NSS DRC organised an insightful webinar on **26th September 2021** on **'Save Rivers and Water Bodies from Human Intervention'** in collaboration with **Dharmesh Barai**, to help raise awareness about the significance of rivers and ways to protect them. **88 volunteers** attended the webinar. Mr. Barai shared his beliefs about how the youth of our country are a force to be reckoned with, and they are the ones who hold the responsibility and power to save the environment and give back to society. Mr. Barai reiterated the point that change begins with us.

TOTE BAG MAKING ACTIVITY

NSS DRC organised **Upcycle Your Clothes: Tote Bag Making Activity** on account of **World Cotton Day**. The activity aimed at raising awareness about the harmful impacts of plastic bags, and encouraging people to use sustainable alternatives like cloth bags instead. The activity was held on **7th October 2021**. **162 volunteers** took part in the initiative and used old clothes to make **298 tote bags**. This activity was a success as volunteers demonstrated great enthusiasm and took significant steps towards the bigger cause of reducing, reusing and recycling.



MAKE YOUR OWN TOY ACTIVITY

NSS DRC organised an activity called **Make Your Own Toy** on **18th November 2021**. The activity encouraged people to recycle old, discarded materials and promote upcycling. The activity saw the participation of **63 volunteers**. Through their combined efforts, **93 toys** were prepared. The activity was a success owing to the enthusiastic participation of the volunteers. It also gave volunteers a chance to hone their creative skills.






KITE MAKING ACTIVITY

NSS DRC organised a **Kite Making Activity** on the occasion of **Makar Sankranti** on **14th January 2022**. It was conducted with the aim of motivating people to recycle waste material and promote upcycling. With the participation of **147 volunteers**, **292 kites** were made which showcased the creative streak of volunteers who made kites out of old, discarded newspapers. The kites helped volunteers channel the spirit of the festival of Makar Sankranti, while also contributing to the welfare of the planet.


PLANT FOR TOMORROW

NSS DRC conducted a plantation drive under a newly launched initiative **"Plant for Tomorrow"**. Plant for Tomorrow is a **monthly plantation drive** that aims to send the message that planting a tree is just the beginning, one has to care for the sapling so genuine environmental benefits can be achieved. The first instalment of Plant for Tomorrow started from **February 5, 2022**, and continued till **March 5, 2022**. **43 volunteers** came forward to be a part of this initiative. With their efforts, **183 saplings** were planted. The launch of Plant for Tomorrow was a glowing success, for it was able to go beyond a normal plantation drive the saplings weren't forgotten after being planted, they received the utmost level of love and care.



AWARENESS POSTS

To reach a wider audience, we turned to the official Instagram Handle of **Project Avni**. Our awareness posts included **Plants that release high levels of Oxygen, Students' guide to waste management, A view of a UN panel report on climate change, Protection of Rhinoceros, etc.** We also posted **informational content on World Ozone Day, World River Day, World Migratory Bird Day, National Energy Conservation Day, World Wetlands Day, etc.** These posts helped us spread awareness among our audience in order to raise consciousness about our environment.




SWACHHTA PAKHWADA

NEIGHBOURHOOD CLEANLINESS DRIVE

National Service Scheme Unit of Daulat Ram College organised a **Neighborhood Cleanliness Activity** under Swachhta Pakhwada, a government initiative from **10th to 12th September, 2021. 82 volunteers** came forward to clean their surroundings, widening the reach of the initiative to include **50 cities** which included Delhi, Gurugram, Jaipur, Haridwar, etc.





CAMPUS PLANTATION DRIVE

The National Service Scheme unit of Daulat Ram College organised a **Campus Plantation Drive** on **13th September 2021** under the Swachhta Pakhwada initiative, as a part of Project Avni. The Vice Principal of DRC, Dr. Sarita Nanda, our Programme Officer Ms. Rita Rani, along with **16 volunteers** took part in the plantation drive, and managed to plant a total of **10 plants** in the Daulat Ram college campus. Plants such as Ashoka, Tulsi, Snake plant, Aloe vera, Neem and other air purifying plants were planted.

AWARENESS POSTS

Under Swachhta Pakhwada, we posted **"A Colourful Guide to a Cleaner Planet"** which talked about different dustbins. The post highlighted the relevance of green, blue and black dustbins and how waste should be segregated before disposal in order to ensure proper ways to manage the waste.






The Abling unit is a team under NSS DRC that strives to work for the specially abled students and professors. The work of the Abling unit involves connecting empathetic volunteers with the Visually Challenged Students (VCS) in order to assist them with completing their assignments, recording audiobooks, filling out college forms and acting as scribes during examinations, amongst other things. College tours are also arranged for the Visually Challenged Students. The unit has successfully installed KIBO XS, a VCS assisting device in the library. In the ongoing session of 2021-22, a total of **765 volunteers** have been arranged for assistance, and the tally is expected to cross one thousand.

MOVING TOWARDS INCLUSION






MAY

ANTI-COVID TASK FORCE

The session began on a grim note, as we battled the second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic. In May 2021, NSS DRC collaborated with other NSS units of Delhi University and came up with an **Anti-COVID Task Force**. The Task Force remained functional from **8th-11th May 2021** with the aim to stand united in the face of unprecedented times. A total of **31 NSS DRC volunteers** took part in this noble initiative.





COVID HELPDESK

A team of **167 dedicated volunteers** at NSS DRC started working towards the noble cause of saving lives under the **'COVID Help Desk'** initiative by NSS DRC from **17th May-20th June 2021**. A significant amount of progress was made and as a result, multiple lives were saved.

MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH

The pandemic highlighted the need of taking care of one's mental health, especially in challenging times. To lift up the spirits of those around us, NSS DRC observed the Mental Health Awareness Month. A reel making activity was organised on its account on the topic **'Fighting Against COVID-19'** on **27th May 2021**, and saw the participation of **24 volunteers**. Informational posts were also shared, to spread awareness about mental health.

COVID-19 VACCINATION AWARENESS INSTAGRAM LIVE

The National Service Scheme unit of Daulat Ram College organised an informative Q&A session in collaboration with **Dr. Chandrakant Lahariya**, under the **Young Warrior Initiative** by UNICEF India. Dr. Chandrakant has spent 13 years with the WHO, and is the lead co-author of the book 'Till We Win: India's Fight Against The COVID-19 Pandemic'. The event was conducted as an Instagram live on the topic 'COVID-19 Vaccine Awareness' on 22nd June 2021, and was attended by more than 280 viewers.





WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY CELEBRATIONS

A Plantation Drive was organised on account of World Environment Day on 5th June 2021. Volunteers were encouraged to foster the spirit of a greener Earth and make the world a better place to live in by planting saplings in their homes. 357 volunteers took part in this noble cause and helped us make the earth greener and cleaner by planting 400 saplings.





PANEL DISCUSSION ON INDEPENDENCE DAY






AUGUST


5-DAYS FITNESS CHALLENGE


EMBRACING THE WELLNESS MANTRA WEBINAR


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WEBINAR ON A 360° GUIDE TO WOMEN'S HEALTH

PEN PAL ACTIVITY






WEBINAR ON INDIAN AIR FORCE DAY


REUSING WASTE TO MAKE ART ACTIVITY

CLOSING CEREMONY



MONOLOGUE COMPETITION






WEBINAR ON GENDER BASED VIOLENCE



ORIENTATION 2022




REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATIONS




SUSTAINABLE MENSTRUATION WEBINAR

SYMPOSIUM






MARCH
