
Title of the event: Anti-COVID Task Force


Title of the event: Plantation Drive


Title of the event: 10-Day Beginner Yoga Workshop


Title of the event: COVID-19 VACCINATION AWARENESS INSTAGRAM LIVE


Title of the event: 'Negative Effects of Victimization of LGBT Adolescents'


Title of the event: Self-Love: The Art of Embracing Your Flaws and Value Yourself


Title of the event: Feed a Stray Activity


Title of the event: 5-day Indoor Workout Challenge


Title of the event: NEIGHBORHOOD CLEANLINESS DRIVE

Title of the event: YOGA FOR NUTRITION



Title of the event: Project Itminaan, a hunger alleviation programme

Report: The motto of the Project, 'Bread for Every Breath' reflects the unit's commitment to the cause of making tireless efforts till the dream of a world where no one goes to sleep on an empty stomach is realised. Under the Daily Stray Feeding Programme of the Project, volunteers are encouraged to step forward and extend a helping hand to the animals around them in need. Every day, they feed strays in their vicinity. In the session that ran from September to December 2022, 53 volunteers actively participated in the programme, feeding animals like dogs, cows, squirrels, horses, peacocks, amongst others. Till this session, a total of 48,218 animals have been fed. An open Food Donation Drive was organised by the unit from 14th to 15th June, 2022. All donations which were collected throughout the course of the collection drive were donated to 'Missionaries of Charity', a children's orphanage based in Civil Lines in Delhi on 4th July, 2022. 9 volunteers represented the unit in their visit to the Orphanage, where they donated the food items that were collected.


Title of the event: Plantation Drive

Date: From 15th September to 16th September 2021

Number of students participated: 207

Report: NSS DRC conducted a Plantation Drive on the occasion of International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer under Project Avni to take a small step towards protecting the ozone layer. It was held from 15th September to 16th September 2021. 207 volunteers came forward to be a part of this initiative. Students from various cities and states volunteered to plant saplings and through their collective efforts, the plantation drive spread to numerous cities. Saplings of different plant species like Curry tree, Tulsi, Money Plant among others were planted. 778 saplings were planted to improve oxygen levels in the air, helping in the conservation of the Ozone layer. All COVID-19 safety protocols were duly observed throughout the conduction of this activity. The Plantation Drive was a success as the volunteers confidently took the initiative forward and sincerely contributed to the preservation of the Ozone layer.




Title of the event: MOVING TOWARDS INCLUSION WORKSHOP

Report: NSS DRC conducted a workshop in collaboration with Sai Swayam Society on 23rd September 2021, to commemorate the International Day of Sign Languages. 89 volunteers attended the webinar. The speaker of the day was Ms. Meera Chetan Bhatia, Founder and CEO of Sai Swayam Society. She was accompanied by Ms. Srishti and Ms. Tanu, expert trainers of the Indian Sign Language (ISL). Ms. Meera talked about the importance of sign language in the school curriculum for inclusivity. She engaged the attendees in a live sign language learning session, covering alphabets, salutations, colours, days of the week, months of a year, numbers and general introductions in ISL. The expression was extremely insightful as the speakers highlighted the role of body language and facial expressions in sign language.

Title of the event: Webinar on "Save Rivers and Water Bodies from Human Intervention"

Ms. Mitushi Ajmera is a certified wellness coach and India's first Pilardio Instructor. Ms. Mitushi introduced the attendees to the 6 pillars of a healthy body. These are involvement with nature, a positive attitude towards life, complete nutrition, a well-hydrated body, good sleep, and regular exercise. In addition to this, she also imparted various ways of switching over to a healthier lifestyle from a sedentary one.



Title of the event: Clean India Initiative

Date: 19th October, 2022

Number of students participated: 51

Organizing unit/collaborating agency: NSS DRC

Report: The Cleanliness Drive took place on 19th of October, 2022 in the North Campus area of the university. A sum of 51 volunteers under the valuable guidance of NSS Teacher's Committee, with utmost zeal and determination cleaned up more than 200 kg of waste, collected from the areas of Patel Chest, Roop Nagar, and the college premises. The drive was carried out in an immensely systematic and organized manner. The volunteers were first divided in a group of 3, with each team working on one of the three target areas. The garbage collected included leaves, packaging material, plastic as well as paper waste such as cardboards, newspapers and magazines leftovers. Subsequently, the garbage was meticulously divided into two separate bags depending upon their biodegradable or non-biodegradable nature. Finally, in order to ensure the proper waste disposal, the entire waste was handed over to the garbage vehicle from Municipal Corporation of Delhi.

Title of the event: Reusing Waste to Make Art

Report: NSS DRC organised an activity titled 'Reusing Waste to Make Art' from 20th to 21st October 2021. The activity was organised as a part of the Clean India Initiative. An initiative by the Government of India, the programme is aimed at creating awareness, mobilisation of people and ensuring the involvement of individuals in the Clean India initiative. 115 volunteers participated in the activity. The aim of the activity was to reduce the concentration of Single-use plastic (SUP) in the environment in a creative way. With the combined efforts of the volunteers under NSS DRC, a variety of creative and innovative artworks were created that incorporated the use of SUP and other waste materials. Volunteers used various waste materials like plastic bottles, glass bottles, plastic containers, polythene bags, etc. to create various artworks. Through this activity, the volunteers took a step towards creating a cleaner environment.



Title of the event: Connecting empathetic volunteers with the Visually Challenged Students (VCS)

Report: The Abling unit is a team under NSS DRC that strives to work for the specially abled students and professors. The work of the Abling unit involves connecting empathetic volunteers with the Visually Challenged Students (VCS) in order to assist them with completing their assignments, recording audiobooks, filling out college forms and acting as scribes during examinations, amongst other things. College tours are also arranged for the Visually Challenged Students. The unit has successfully installed KIBO XS, a VCS assisting device in the library. In the ongoing session of 2021-22, a total of 765 volunteers have been arranged for assistance, and the tally is expected to cross one thousand.

Report: National Service Scheme Unit of Daulat Ram College conducted an invigorating webinar on 25th November 2021, in the light of International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. A total of 91 volunteers attended the webinar. Ms. Gurbani Kaur and Ms. Sreya Layek from Girl Power Talk were the speakers for the day. The speakers enlightened the volunteers about how violence against women is deeply rooted in society and culture. They also highlighted ways in which individuals can help out victims of abuse, like being empathetic towards them and spreading information about rights.


Title of the event: 'Breast Cancer and cervix Cancer'

Date: 4th February 2022

Organizing unit/collaborating agency: Dharamshila Cancer Foundation and Research Centre

Report: NSS DRC observed World Cancer Day on 4th February 2022 by organising a webinar in collaboration with Dharamshila Cancer Foundation and Research Centre on the topic 'Breast Cancer and cervix Cancer'. Over 300 volunteers attended the webinar. Prof. (Dr.) Ramesh Dawar, Vice President of Dharamshila Cancer Foundation and Research Centre and Dr. Pragya Singh, Senior Manager - Projects at Dharamshila Narayana Superspeciality Hospital, were the speakers for the event. The webinar started with Dr. Ramesh Dawar briefing the audience about breast cancer, its predisposing risk factors, and preventive measures one can take to lessen its occurrence. Dr. Pragya Singh talked about cervix cancer and how to prevent it.


Title of the event: PLANT FOR TOMORROW

Date: February 5, 2022, and continued till March 5, 2022

Number of students participated: 43

Organizing unit/collaborating agency: NSS DRC

Report: NSS DRC conducted a plantation drive under a newly launched initiative "Plant for Tomorrow". Plant for Tomorrow is a monthly plantation drive that aims to send the message that planting a tree is just the beginning, one has to care for the sapling so genuine environmental benefits can be achieved. The first instalment of Plant for Tomorrow started from February 5, 2022, and continued till March 5, 2022. 43 volunteers came forward to be a part of this initiative. With their efforts, 183 saplings were planted. The launch of Plant for Tomorrow was a glowing success, for it was able to go beyond a normal plantation drive - the saplings weren't forgotten after being planted, they received the utmost level of love and care.



Title of the event: Sustainable Menstruation and Use of Menstrual Cups

Date: 11th February, 2022

Number of students participated: 82

Organizing unit/collaborating agency: Sirona Hygiene Foundation

Report: NSS DRC organized a webinar on the topic 'Sustainable Menstruation and Use of Menstrual Cups', in collaboration with Sirona Hygiene Foundation on 11th February 2022. 82 volunteers attended the webinar. Dr. Aarushi Kehar Malhotra was the speaker for the event. She is a Public Health Advocate with a master's degree in public health, involved in health education, healthcare research, and spreading awareness. She briefed the audience about menstruation. She explained the concept of sustainable menstruation, that is, using products that benefit both- the body and the earth. She talked about the various chemicals that go into making a sanitary napkin, their non-biodegradable nature and how a girl uses an average of 16,000 sanitary napkins in her lifetime. She suggested safer alternatives like menstrual cups.
