THE JOURNEY OF INDIA'S WOMEN'S ICE HOCKEY TEAM

- Diskit C Angmo

A passionate story of how a sport is born and how its future is going to be.

Myself Diskit C Angmo belong to the first generation of female Ice Hockey players in the country. I play as a defence in the team and am also the Spokesperson of Indian Women Ice Hockey Team.

I dream of a bright future for the sport, something that the nation would be proud of in the coming years. My mission, like others in my team, is to polish my skills and to inspire the next generation of girls to take up the sport.

Ice hockey as a professional sport might not be that celebrated in our country that worships other sports. Forget celebrated, most people are oblivious of the fact that in a tropical country like ours, Ice Hockey is a professional sport. That is just one of the many challenges we face as a team, on an everyday basis.

It's not about story of the challenges me and my teammates face but how we perceive these obstacles. For us, it is an opportunity to work for something bigger than our personal lives. For a passion, we hold dearly to our hearts. There isn't any specific reason for why I started playing Ice Hockey, and I firmly believe that there need not be perks attached to something that one starts with. It came on to me naturally.

In winters, when temperatures drop to as low as -20 degrees, the lakes freeze and children pick up their winter gear to enjoy ice sports. I was in my pre-teens when my father, a police officer, started nudging us to get up and go out and get some blood gushing in our veins. And at 6 AM in the morning, I used to wail when asked to go out and play. Little did I know, that this little push to get out of the comfort zone, would become my life's passion one day.

Winters in Ladakh is the time when even the locals run away from the deep freeze. We, the hockey players, rejoice in the chill. The fierce winters here can freeze one to death, but we eagerly await this unfriendly phase of the year to shape our dreams of performing on ice – for the love of ice hockey. The three winter months are the only time out of the year when the ponds are frozen; our only opportunity to do something thrilling in otherwise mundane lives.

I realise it's best to accept what comes in one's way. I was pushed into the rink, rather, the snow. Initially, I along with other girls, did figure skating just for the fun of it. Gradually, I realized, I was a natural on ice. Soon, Figure Skating led to hockey and the Ladakh Winter Sports Club became our favourite hangout. At the age of 15, determined to try the sport that other Ladakhi boys were playing, me and the other girls came up with a plan.

Most of us learnt to play the sport using borrowed equipment from the men's team. Slowly and steadily, we skated our way through the ice. Spectators made fun of us. We would tie blades to the bottom of the boots and try and skate. Through chilling winds and snow, using borrowed equipment, we practiced on frozen lake for a 40-day odd period. We had to make our own ice rink at Gupuks lake outside the city to be able to practise. We designated weekly shifts for this. First, we had to drive down at 8pm, dig some of the ice to get the water from the lake. Through buckets, mugs and pipes we would spread the water across. Then we would come back at 3am to repeat the process. By 7am the rink would be ready for us to play.

Our hard work took us to our first international tournament in 2016 , The Challenge Cup of Asia in Taipei. Thanks to the collective efforts of young Ladakhi women determined to play the sport and the Ice Hockey Association of India, we formed the first ever, Indian women's National Ice Hockey Team – a team of 20. Challenges abound – some players in our team didn't have passports, some had exams, for some the parents objected to travelling that far.

This was the first time when we stepped on an Olympic sized ice hockey rink, and it left us baffled. That did not dampen our spirits. We weren't sure about the official rules and learnt them as the tournament progressed. Despite all odds, the experience in Taipei was like no other. Our debut IIHF tournament in 2016 triggered a hunger to win. Losing was not disheartening but actually helped us grow. We gained experience and knowledge. There was a lot of support we got from other teams as well. We understood that to win, we needed good equipment and a lot of time on ice to practice. Unfortunately, the constraints of little training time on the ice, availability of ice, lack of equipment and funds were and remain obstacles.

We had our first taste of success at the 2017 Challenge Cup of Asia, where we secured a dramatic 4-3 win in our second match versus the Philippines—our first victory at an international tournament. After the final whistle, there were tears of joy. At that one moment the words were not enough to express the happiness we had within ourselves.

I was also lucky to win the Best player of the Match and also got The Best Player of the Tournament.

In 2018, when we finally earned the opportunity to go to Canada for the World Female Hockey Festival, we realized that 'Passion Has No Boundaries'. The experience was invaluable.

In 2019, we went to Dubai for The Challenge Cup of Asia here our dreams were becoming into reality. We were able to win Bronze Medal for the country. For once, our achievement meant something to people other than the ones in our team. But then because of Covid the tournaments got cancelled for 2 years consecutively. After 2 years of waiting we got an opportunity to participate at Union Women Ice Hockey Championship, Dubai in 2021. It was quite a long time that we didn't compete at an international level but we really worked hard and were prepared, that is how we were able to win Silver Medal in that Championship. Truly, there is no better feeling in the entire universe than the soul stirring flow of emotions of pride, with national anthem being played in the background.

The past few years have been amazing. The experience was invaluable. Currently, we are more optimistic than ever. We have made peace with the fact that the biggest obstacles to success in our lives are the barriers our mind creates. And we have trained ourselves to overcome that.

The IIHF Asia and Oceania Championship (formally the IIHF Challenge Cup of Asia) was held at Bangkok, Thailand from 30th April to 7th May 2023.

There were eight participating countries Group A- Thailand, Singapore, UAE and Malaysia
Group B- India , Iran, Kuwait and Kyrgyz Republic
