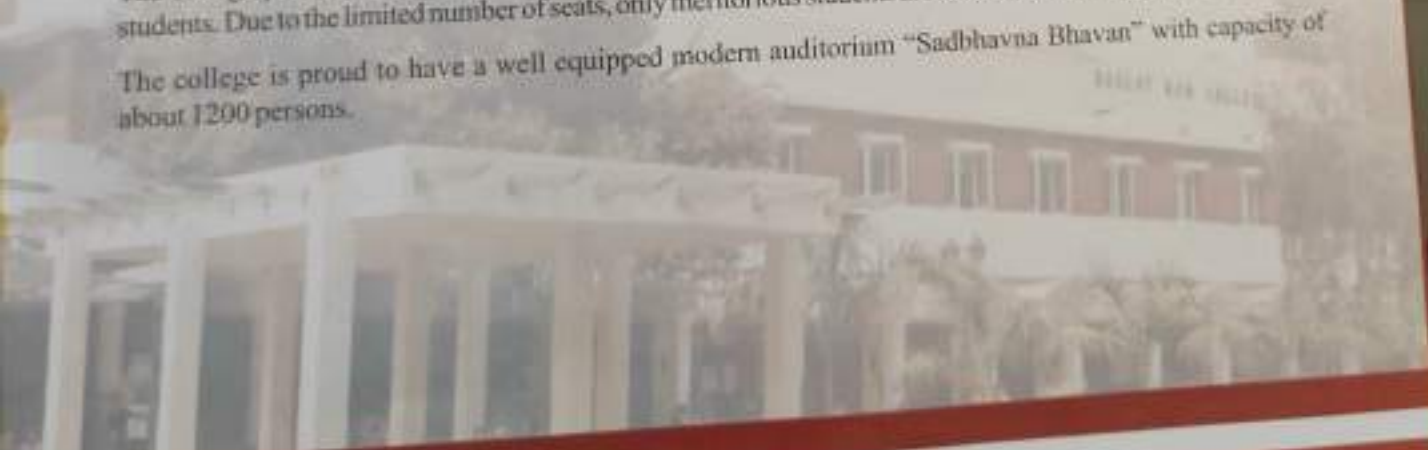
ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Daulat Ram college is a premier educational institution in Delhi founded by an educationist late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta in 1960. It is a prestigious women's college engaged in imparting liberal education to women. The college, a large constituent college of the University of Delhi, originally started as "Pramila College" at 22, Tilak Marg with thirteen members of teaching staff and two office staff with about 350 students. In 1964, the college shifted to its present premises in North Delhi University campus and was renamed as Daulat Ram College. The institution has since grown into a full fledged extended college of University of Delhi. The college has acquired a strong identity and has evolved into a prestigious women's college with its own distinct culture and traditions. It imparts education towards degrees at the Bachelors level in arts, commerce and science and Masters level in arts.

The courses in science were introduced in 1968 which led to the construction of the science block and well equipped science laboratories. The Commerce and M.A. courses in many subjects, as well as new courses in B.A. (H) and B.A.(Pass) were added subsequently. Further expansion of the college took place with the introduction of B.Sc. (H) in Biochemistry, Chemistry and Mathematics, addition of Nutrition and Health Education (NHE) and office management and secretarial practice (OMSP) as subjects in B.A. (Pass). The college building which was constructed in 1960s was further expanded to cater to the growing needs of the students. A new block of tutorial rooms, a modern seminar hall, new class rooms and science laboratories for Physics, NHE and Biochemistry were added. Subsequently, computer labs open to all students with internet facility have been added. Currently the college has add-on courses in foreign languages. At present there are 19 departments with over 3500 students on rolls, about 170 teaching staff and about 75 non teaching staff. The college has a well equipped computerized library, facility for gymnastics, table tennis, athletics and other games and holds a leading position both in academics and sports. Recently, a well-equipped Conference Hall with a capacity of 200 students has been built.

The college provides hostel facilities with an intake capacity of 200 students. It caters mainly to outstation students. Due to the limited number of seats, only meritorious students are selected for admission to the hostel.

The college is proud to have a well equipped modern auditorium "Sadbhavna Bhavan" with capacity of about 1200 persons.

I feel very privileged to welcome amongst us our **Chief Guest Shri. Rakesh Srivastava, Secretary, Ministry of Women & Child Development, Government of India.**

Shri. Rakesh Srivastava IAS (RJ 1981) prior to his appointment as Secretary, Ministry of Women & Child Development, was Member Secretary, National Commission for Backward Classes.

Shri. Rakesh Srivastava has done his masters in Physics before joining Indian Administrative Services in 1981. Prior to his present assignment as Secretary, Ministry of Women & Child Development, he was Member Secretary, National Commission for Backward Classes. Shri. Rakesh Srivastava served as Joint Secretary (Ports) in the Ministry of Shipping, Road Transport and Highways. Shri. Rakesh Srivastava served as a Director of Dredging Corp. of India Ltd. from 2007- 2012. He served as a Part-Time Official Director of Shipping Corporation of India from December 22, 2011 to February 1, 2012. He served as Government Nominee Director of Ennore Port Limited from June 29, 2006 to June 1, 2012. Daulat Ram College being the largest women college of University of Delhi, there could be no appropriate person as chief guest. Sir, we are honored to have you amongst us today.

Prof. Sushma Yadav is the Chair Professor, Dr. Ambedkar Chair in Social Justice at Indian Institute of Public Administration. Prior to this, she was Associate Professor in Delhi College of Arts and Commerce, University of Delhi. Besides this, she served as a member of Academic Council of University of Delhi and a member, Executive Committee Delhi Regional Branch of IIPA. She is the recipient of Rai Bahadur Gouri Shankar Memorial Medal and Maharsi Karve Memorial prize. With an experience of over 30 years of teaching and research, she has authored/edited number of books and presented a number of papers in National and International Seminars/Conferences.

At IIPA, she prepared and introduced a core course on Social Justice for 32nd APPPA Participants as well as a module on Social Justice for most of the in house training programs. Prof. Yadav has been the Course Director of the 35th and 37th MDP course. She also directed the First Two India modules of the foundation training programme for the Bangladesh Civil servants. She also coordinated I & II workshop on RTI sponsored by DOPT and ONGC.

Prof. Yadav also had an opportunity to represent IIPA as an intervener in the Regional Training Seminar organized by French National School of Administration (ENA) and the China Executive Leadership Academy of Pudong (CELAP) at Shanghai for the experts of the region to enhance their professional skills. She also represented IIPA at the Asian Public Administration Reform Forum organized by the International Institute of Administrative Science and Ministry of Personnel of the People's Republic of China on Trend and Development of Public Administration Reform in Asian Countries at Nanning, Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region, China.

Recently, Prof. Yadav was one of the members of IIPA's five member Delegation who visited CELAP for a workshop on "China India Forum" sponsored by the China Executive Leadership Academy Pudong, Shanghai.

At the congress, she has been elected the Vice Chairperson of the Research Committee (RC) 04 on 'Public Bureaucracies in Developing Societies' and the secretary of RC 35 on 'Technology and Development' for the next 03 years.

Presently, she is working on the philosophy of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar along with the issues of Social Justice with reference to Good Governance, Human Rights and Empowerment of the Depressed Sections of Society including

women for Inclusive Growth and Development. She is an important member of University Grants commission and have made significant contribution towards higher education.

I welcome you to your alma mater once again.

I take this opportunity to briefly present the highlights of the college annual report. A more detailed achievements and activities of the college are given in the subsequent pages of this report.

College has Hons. / General courses in Arts, Commerce and Science in 18 subjects at under graduate level and 7 subjects at post graduate level. This year college has admitted around 1235 students in different courses in the Bachelor's and 332 in Master's degree programme. The over all strength of students is 3970 in regular degree courses which makes it the biggest women college. Intake percentage in various courses were in the range of 91% to 97%. It has been noted that more than 50% students taking admission in the college are from other states outside NCR. A total 53 foreign students enrolled in the college are from different countries including Afghanistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Tibet, Uzbekistan and Bangladesh. The College has this year admitted 198 students in its hostel and admission is strictly as per merit.

The college offers Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma courses on self-financing basis in eight foreign languages viz Japanese, Korean, Chinese, German, Spanish, French and Italian. Nearly 800 students are enrolled in centre for foreign languages. In addition college holds contact programs for more than 1000 students enrolled in the school of open learning, University of Delhi.

The college witnessed one of the best results in University examinations and success rate of students amply reflect the academic strength and standing of the college. The pass percentage in different courses was in the range of 97% to 100%. We are proud of Tanushree Kashyap for securing 1st position in M.A. (Prev.) in Music and Cauveri Sharma, 1st position in M.A. (Final) Psychology and Iram Fatima, 2nd position in M.A. (Prev.) Psychology in Delhi University (North Campus). College selects all round best student taking into account academic performance, participation and involvement in co-curricular and extracurricular activities. The all round best student for 2018 goes to Ms. Ekta Chopra, Psychology Hons III year. This year the College has instituted a Special Prize to a student having attained International recognition in Academics/Extra Curricular/Sports. This special prize goes to Diskit Chonzom Angmo, B.A. Hons English, III year. Ms. Angmo is a national ice hockey player and has represented India in International Ice Hockey event. She has been awarded a "Exceptional Women who transcended barriers to be the first in their field" by Hon'ble President of India on 20th January 2018. We are proud of her exceptional achievement. Ms. Priyanshu Vasistha, Ms. Pinky Yadav, Ms. Neeraj Phogat, Ms. Mohini, Ms Mansi Pant and Ms. Prerna Joshi have been awarded University meritorious prize for year 2018 for attaining University positions in various semester examinations in science stream. In addition, students have bagged 116 proficiency prizes, 45 Instituted prizes and 16 merit scholarships in 2018.

The highlights of this year has been:

- (1) The College was accredited with 'A' grade by NAAC
- (2) The College started two new courses i.e. B.Sc. (Hons) in Physics and B.A. (Programme) in Physical Education in the current session.
- (3) College added a very important spatial component in its infrastructure:
 - (i) The Conference Hall: Since its inception, College has hosted many International Conferences; National Conferences; Faculty Development programmes, workshops, seminars and a number of talks for students of various departments.
 - (ii) The Zebra Fish Laboratory, The Drosophila Laboratory, Physics Laboratory were added under Star Innovation Projects funds.
- (4) College also added two more permanent faculties in Psychology Department this year and intend to continue doing so to fill the vacancies in various departments.
- (5) The Library has added two new braille computers and one braille printer for its Visually Handicapped students which was a long standing demand of VH students.



The year witnessed five national conferences in the College. Philosophy Department organized a national conference on "Holistic Yoga: H' (Health, Happiness and Harmony)" on 10-11 November 2017; Psychology Department on "Psychological Applications and Interventions: Reaching Out And Making A Difference" on 18-19 January, 2018; Sanskrit Department on "Challenges Before Media " on November 7, 2017; Gandhi Study Circle on "Gandhi and the Contemporary World" on January 31, 2018; and Eco Club of College namely 'Dhara' on "A multidisciplinary approach towards sustainability: A novel design" on January 23, 2018.

During the academic year 2017-18, Workshops were organized by Biochemistry Department viz. Zebra fish model system; English Department organized visual story telling along with practical clay modeling workshop, prevention of substance abuse among students. History Department organized panel discussion on Reclaiming Women's Voices: A Historical perspective and talks on the social implications of Ritual Practices in Ancient India etc. They also have initiated mentorship programme for their students. Philosophy Association organized interactive session with Dr. Stuart Gray, Professor of Politics at Washington and Lee University on "Political Philosophy in the Epic Mahabharata". The Political Science Association held a talk session on Constitutional Law and interactive session with Ms. Saloni Rai, an IAS officer and Rachit Rawat, an IFS officer of previous batch to interact with students. They also organized a talk session on the topic 'Changing Contour of Indian Foreign Policy' in which Prof. Harsh V. Pant from Kings' College, London was speaker.

College students and teachers enthusiastically participated in celebration of Independence Day, Basant Panchami and Republic Day. Students of various Societies, ECA, NCC and Departments such as Music, Hindi and Sanskrit helped in organizing these festivals. The Psychology Association saw the visit of U.S. delegation consisting of 18 students headed by Prof. Shirley Woika from Penn State University who gave enriching presentation on developmental issues in psychology. The Association also organized 'Mental Health Awareness Day', a Walk towards better future (a flash mob event) and a seminar on "Neither God, Nature nor Society" wherein Prof. Michael F. Mascolo, Academic Director, Merrimeck College, USA was invited. The department also conducted a National Conference on Psychological Application and Interventions. The Zoology Department also organized a talk on "Intellectual Property rights" by Prof. Rekha Chaturvedi.

The College has a NCC Unit-JAZBA of 160 students. The Unit under the enthusiastic support of its Caretaker celebrated International day of Yoga with Dr. Sunil Khetrpal. 95 cadets attended CATC Camp and they won 3 Gold medals, 5 silver medals and two trophies in various competitive events.

The College has on roll about 2000 NSS students who throughout the year conducted such programmes as Swatchhata Pakhwana programme, 'Sankalp se sidhi', 'Rally for River', National Unity Day, Voters' Day, Unity run and many more. The Unit is involved in voluntary services to cancer patients and children with special needs. They organized blood donation camps and self defence training programmes for our students.

The Co-curricular events organized by different cells like Cyber Cell, Debating Society, Dhara has been very useful and informative. The motivation given by enabling unit to its students has borne fruits. Ms. Anju of B.A. (P) III yr participated and won three medals including gold in National Para athletic meet in Delhi. The Unit is active in generating audio study material for its students. The film and photography society 'Sepia' throughout the year were engaged in covering various events of college. They also had organized documentary screening and discussion on Moksha and Texture of Loss. The film festival organized by society was dedicated to Ms. Deepti Naval, actress, director, painter and singer. Two day event was a huge success among students and staff. The Gandhi study circle organized a one day national seminar on "Gandhi and contemporary world" in addition to talks by such eminent persons like Prof. Bidyut Chakravory, Sh. Y.P. Anand and Sh. Ashok Vohra. The Gender Champion Club initiated last year has total membership of 142 students. They organized group discussions, debates, self defence camps, poster making and other programmes on day to day basis. The college saw visit of many eminent personalities from various walks of life such as academia, art, culture and politics. Some of the prominent dignitaries who visited College during the year are : Minister of State for Human Resource Development, Government of India Sh. Upendra Kushwaha; Padmashri Shri J.S. Rajput, Hon'ble Shri Shekhar Dutt, former Governor of Chattisgarh, Padmashri Dr. K.K. Aggarwal, Prof. Devesh K. Sinha, Dean of Colleges, University of Delhi; Mr. Sudhanshu Ranjan, Sr. Correspondent, Doordarshan; Dr. Randeep Guleria, Director

AIIMS; Ms. Deepti Naval, Actor, Painter and Director; Dr. Amarendra Khatua, Former DG, ICCR; Sh. Avinash Kumar Singh, Director Listen Amaya. Each one of the events left indelible mark on the students and will go a long way in educating and enriching them.

The Indian Dance Society 'Anhad' bagged prizes at ten different events all over Delhi University and outside Delhi University such as IIT Kharagpur. The Western Dance Society Zenith has made us proud by winning first and second prizes at 20 different institutes including at AIIMS, NIT Delhi, JECRC Jaipur. The Music Society Alahyaa and Dramatic Society Memesis mesmerized the Delhi University fraternity with their prize winning performances.

The Placement Cell of College organized for the first time Internship and Career fair 'Incrementum'. The career guidance and counseling session were organized throughout the year by Maths, Physics, Chemistry, Commerce, Economics, Political Science and other Departments to expose the students to various career opportunities available in formal and informal sectors. The Women Development Cell of College 'Pragati' organized writing and editing skill contest, Safe City, Workshop on Sexual Harassment and strengthened the ties with PALNA which takes care of orphaned children.

Dr. Savita Roy, Principal, along with faculty of Sanskrit and Music were awarded 'Sanskrit Samaradhaka Samman' by Delhi Sanskrit Academy on 10th August 2017. The Confederation of Indian University also felicitated and awarded 'National Skill Resources Development Award' to Dr. Savita Roy, Principal.

During the year 2017-18, Mrs. Sushma Arora (Dept. of Commerce) published six books; Dr. Padmshri Mudgal (Dept. of Biochemistry) one book; Dr. Pooja Anand (Dept. of Psychology) one book; Ms. Richa Kaur (Dept. of Commerce) one book and Dr. Sonia Mehta (Dept. of Philosophy) three books, one of which is a recommended book for undergraduate philosophy students.

The college faculty published 16 research papers in journals of International Repute and more than 93 papers were published in national journals.

I take this opportunity to thank administrative staff, laboratory staff and other karamcharis for their enthusiasm and constant support. My special appreciation to Shri Rajvir Giri of Biochemistry Department and Shri Satish Kumar Chauhan of Botany Department for their contribution to College-academic and corporate life. I thank the Teaching Programme Committee headed by Dr. Nidhi Gautam, Extracurricular Activity Committee headed by Dr. Rajni Sahni, Annual Prize Committee and NCC headed by Dr. Sonia Mehta, Staff Council Secretary Dr. Preeti Kapoor, NSS headed by Mrs. Sarita Jain, NSO headed by Dr. Kavita Sharma, Hostel guided by Hostel Committee members Dr. Asha, Dr. Sujata Raju and Ms. Manjula Rath, teachers incharge of different departments, Students advisory board convener, Dr. Preeti Malhotra, North East Cell headed by Ms. Anna Senrung. Conveners of the various committees for their zeal, participation and active support in organizing the various programme in the college. The college became poorer by bidding farewell to two teachers namely Dr. Neelam Pari Malkani and Dr. Renu Kishore, who gave more than forty years of valuable service to college before retirement. A special thanks to Dr. Kishore to have assisted us in screening committee as nodal college for Psychology and continued to help college.

I take this opportunity to thank Mrs. Suneeta Sudarshan and all members of the college Governing Body for helping college with various infrastructure and academic activities. The mission of college is to develop among girls, human intellect, personality, inter personal skills, while instilling in them the right value system so that they can face the challenges of life with confidence. To this end, the staff and faculty will always remain committed.

The History Association organizes its annual festival 'Perspective' every year. For the academic year 2017-18, the theme for the festival was 'Reclaiming Women's Voices: A Historical Perspective' which was held over two days. The purpose of our annual festival is to explore the new terrains in historiography, thematic as well as methodological. The festival began with an interesting panel discussion on 'Reclaiming Women's Voices: A Historical Perspective'. We invited four highly distinguished panelists and a Chair to speak in the panel discussion on 15th January 2017. The first speaker was Dr Lata Singh, Associate Professor, Centre for Women's Studies, Jawahar Lal Nehru University, New Delhi. Dr Lata Singh spoke about the tawaifs and the role of women in the National Movement and the methodological concerns in writing women's voices. The second speaker was Dr Charu Gupta, Associate Professor in the Department of History, University of Delhi. She spoke on the issue of sexuality and the restrictions imposed on it. The third speaker was Dr Smita



Sahgal, Associate Professor, Lady Shri Ram College, University of Delhi. She spoke of sustaining and critiquing violence through her case study of women characters in the Mahabharata. The fourth speaker was Prof. Sunita Zaidi, Retd. Professor, Department of History and Culture, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi, She spoke on Women's Voices during Medieval India. The panel discussion was chaired by Dr Amitabh Rajan, Retd. IAS, Former Home Secretary, Govt. of Maharashtra.

On the second-day of the festival, various inter-college competitions saw a large student participation in events such as Just A Minute, Photography, Self-composed poetry, Folk music and Folk dance.

History Association also organized a Talk on the theme "*The Social Implications of Ritual Practices in Ancient India*" held on 22nd September 2017. The speaker was Prof. Jaya S. Tyagi, Department of History, and University of Delhi. She spoke on the rituals of Ancient India and how these rituals affected women.

History Association also organized another Talk on the theme "*One Day in the Life of a Sufi: Hazrat Nizamuddin Auliya and his Chishti Tradition*" on 10th November 2017. In each academic session Political Science Association (PSA), **Republica** organizes various cultural and academic activities/events such as seminars, talks, workshops, film screenings, debates, nukkad natak, panel discussion, inter-college festivals, etc. with a view to develop and enhance analytical skills, creative thinking and comprehensive understanding of the discipline amongst students and thereby enrich and bolster a holistic academic experience in them. In the current academic session 2017-18, Republica began its work by electing its Union members which was followed by freshers' welcome held on 26th August 2017 with a theme 'BEATNIK'. This programme not only provided freshers' with an opportunity to show their talents and cultural diversity but also helped them to know their Department and become its part comfortably.

On 5th September 2017, the students have shown their gratitude towards teachers by celebrating teacher's day. On 7th September 2017, Republica organised a talk session on 'Constitutional Law' in association with

Success Mantra to get an understanding of the real impact of constitution, latest constitutional amendments & their impact and various procedures to make law more accountable.

PSA had organised an interactive session with Ms. Saloni Rai, an IAS officer and Rachit Rawat, an IFS officer on 15th September 2017 which saw huge response from students around the college. The speakers guided students how to form targets and to achieve their goals, manage stress and negative emotions and formulate strategies to crack the civil services examination by citing examples from their own experiences. PSA had also organised some career development and awareness workshops. For instance, on 13th September 2017, it had a workshop on Psychometric test and MBA as a career which was conducted by Dr Pramod Kumar, President ISB & M. An interactive session was also held with Mr. Pramod Singh, President, IAS Edge on November 1, 2017. He spoke at length about the skills, importance of accurate timing, will power, cited examples of eminent personalities who have cleared the civil services and thereby tried to inspire and motivate students to believe in themselves and face the challenges head on.

Furthermore Republica had organized a talk session on the topic: **'Changing Contours of Indian Foreign Policy'** on 26th September 2017. Prof. Harsh V. Pant from King's College London, who is also a distinguished fellow at the Observer Research Foundation, was the speaker. Prof. Pant engaged with the students by providing insights into the changing nature of India's Foreign policy in a globalized world, and the role India would play in the 'Asian Century'. Invigorated by the talk session, the students and teaching faculty raised several pertinent questions related with the topic. They left the Seminar Hall with knowledge, questions and perspectives.

The upcoming events of PSA during February and March 2018 include visit to Parliament in February to have first-hand experience of functioning of Parliamentary session and one day Inter-college festival scheduled on 17th February 2018. The theme of the festival is **'India and the idea of 'Modern''**. It will include a Panel Discussion on the main theme to have a comprehensive understanding of the topic. Professor



Manoranjan Mohanty, (retired), Department of Political Science, Delhi University and a senior member, Council for Social Development, Professor Deepak Kumar, Zakir Husain Centre for Educational Studies, JNU and Professor Maitrayee Chaudhuri, Centre for Study of Social Systems, JNU would be the esteemed panelists for the event. The other events of the festival would be conventional debate competition on the topic **'This house believes that Modernity is the symbol of Development'**; poster making competition on the sub-theme **'Modernity in Indian Tradition'**; Nukkad Natak on the sub-theme **'Modernity in Indian Society'** and also talent show.



The PSA programme in the current academic session will end with the farewell programme for the final year students.

Psychology Association, Daulat Ram College, is a progressive body that strives to work towards the betterment of its students by providing them ample opportunities to introspect, learn, engage and become better versions of themselves. It is fuelled by the famous quote of Oprah Winfrey, "Even the smallest steps move you forward". Hence, it aims at bringing glory to the college by nurturing students with right skills, right motives, and right faith and thus, encouraging them to indulge in right action.

U.S. Delegation of 18 students headed by Prof Shirley Woika from Penn State University visited our department on 18th July, 2017 and gave an enriching presentation on Developmental issues in Psychology.

Over the years the association has acted as a medium that turns dreams into reality through the joyful road of learning where destination stands second to journey. Like a parent, it makes sure that every new batch that joins becomes the part of our close-knit family. In the light of the same, the academic year 2017-18 began with the **Inaugural-cum-Freshers' Welcome Party** dated on 22nd August, 2017. Beating the heat of 40°C the room was beautifully decorated with bright colors and flowers which kept the "Summer Fiesta" theme alive. The new batch of budding psychologists dipping from head to toe in cool pastels, polkas, stripes, frills and flares were greeted by the teachers and senior students. Several dance and music performances followed by fun-filled activities, team building games and healthy competitions were conducted in order to familiarize them with the new environment. Titles like "Miss Freshher", "Miss Talented" and "Miss Sunshine" and "Miss Best-dressed" were awarded which not only allowed the new students to showcase their talents but also helped the department to know them better. Furthermore, in the **Investiture Ceremony**, the newly elected members of Psychology Association were handed the responsibility of maintaining the integrity of department and meeting everyone's expectations by figuratively pinning them badges. Thus, the day marked the beginning of new chapter with brand new plot and new promising characters.

Slam Poetry Competition was hosted for the psychology students for the very first time in the college on 30th August, 2017. It was an initiative that aimed to restore the art of spoken word without using any props, costumes or music. The competition based on "psychological" theme helped to learn the perfect recipe of emotions, creativity, sensitivity and understanding of the applications of this subject. The three prize holders were felicitated with certificates by the eminent judges.

On account of **Teachers' Day Celebration**, a cake-cutting ceremony was done. Handmade cards were presented to all the teachers to thank them for helping us in numerous ways and to express how grateful we were to have them as our mentors.

Building on the parallel lines of World Suicide Prevention Day and World Mental Health Day, Psychology Association in accordance with Psychology Resource Centre organized **Mental Health Awareness Day** on 13th September, 2017. It was to highlight the importance of mental health and resolve stigmas associated with symptoms, etiology and treatment of some common disorders. The program comprised of several events like slam poetry competition to provide the student a platform to freely narrate their experience without any fear of judgement and restraints of words. Nukkad Naatak and Perspectives-talk were done to create awareness about the prevalence and severity of mental disorders that may lead to suicide. Another major event was flash mob titled "A walk towards better future" where students rallied holding banners and

posters on suicide prevention and mental health. This program cleared out the taboos shadowing the minds of non-psychology students as well as appealed to them to harbor sensitivity, empathy and concern towards the mental health and wellbeing of the nation.

On 27th October, 2017 a developmental psychologist, author, editor and erudite Prof. Michael F. Mascolo, Academic Director, Merrimack College, USA was invited to conduct a **seminar on "Neither God, Nature nor Society"**.

A **workshop named "Aao Dilli Jaane"** was organized for outstation students to acquaint them with Delhi. The workshop emphasized to create a healthy environment and comfortable context so that everyone could solve their problems and suggest solutions to each other. It enabled the students to respect the diversity in Indian culture and enhance their understanding about the new environment. Formation of new bonds and clarity of misconceptions were other learnings that students benefitted from. Thus, this workshop tried to ease out the process of adaption for outstation students.

One event that stood out amongst all the other milestones was the **National Conference on Psychological Applications and Intervention** hosted by our college from 18-19th January, 2018 for the very first time. It was a much awaited two-day programme consisting of various events like panel discussion, paper presentation sessions, poster presentations and workshops by Dr Seema Gupta on "From Personal to Interpersonal Effectiveness" as well as by Children First Team on "Depression" and "Art Based Therapy". The panelists i.e. Dr S.P.K Jena, Dr Roma Kumar, Dr Chavi Bhagarva Sharma, Dr Rima Sehgal and Dr Deepali Rao shared insights about the scope and relevance of the subject and about their experience of psychology in practice. The research papers written by students as well as teachers were presented pertaining to the themes provided. These papers along with poster presentations were published in the journal "Applications of Psychology: Reaching Out and Making a Difference". The workshops provided the students across various colleges a detailed practical experience, an exposure that surpassed the contours of books and a fruitful lifelong learning experience.



On 25th January, 2018 Prof. Dana Gross, Professor of Psychology, Associate Dean of Interdisciplinary & General studies, St Olaf College, Minnesota, USA along with her students visited our department and gave an enriching presentation on "**High-Impact Practices in the Undergraduate Liberal Arts Context**". The presentation was followed by an interactive session between the students and series of workshops.

31st January, 2018 witnessed the **farewell of Dr Renu Kishore**. Talking in the words of Robert Frost, "She is not a teacher but an awakener". She is a scholarly developmental psychologist, professional counsellor and



senior reader with a very vibrant personality. A cake-cutting ceremony along with few cultural events was organized to thank her for being the parent figure of the psychology department. Debating Society

The Debating society (DEBSOC) is a vibrant platform with an aim to provide transformative learning to students in an atmosphere of reasoned argument and respectful discourse. They learn to express, evaluate and analyse issues/ideas and discuss solutions. They learn organization & clarity which helps them articulate their thoughts confidently & persuasively. The society organizes several issue based programmes in each academic session along with Daulat Ram Memorial Debate, an annual event, with a running trophy since 1985.

As has been its trend, the DEBSOC began its work by selecting a team of students for the Society for academic session 2017-18 and then elected its Union members from amongst the team. It was followed by the third edition of **Controversus**, the annual inter-college freshers' conventional debate held on 18th September 2017. The motion argued and debated upon was, **'This house believes that the judiciary should intervene to protect the rights of the LGBT community under the right to privacy'**. The debate was won by the team from DEBSOC of Daulat Ram College.

On 3rd November 2017, the DEBSOC in collaboration with ONGC organized an intra-college debate competition on the motion **'This house believes that the idea of a corruption free India is practically impossible'** as a part of Vigilance Awareness Week. Besides, the members have also actively participated





and won accolades and prizes in various debates and events, including Model United Nations, Parliamentary debates, and conventional debates organised by various colleges and institutions in and around Delhi.

Kaul's informative and motivational speech was attended by differently abled students from across the University.

On the 4th of September, 2017, distinguished dignitaries and conducted interviews of the visually challenged students at the post-graduation level. Most of the interviews were conducted by the Singapore based organization. In October, the college participated in a national level competition in collaboration with the NSS unit of the college.



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The latest ECA event was the celebration for India's 68th Republic Day which was also graced by the student exchange guests from the United States of America. For this event, all three Indian cultural societies, ie. Alahyaa, Annhad and Memesis came together in addition to the music department to celebrate not just the making of the constitution so long ago but also the extraordinary year that the Indian Supreme Court has had, with the introduction of Right to Privacy as a fundamental right and the abolishment of the Triple Talaakh law.

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On the 4th of September, 2017, distinguished dignitaries from 'Help the Blind Foundation' visited the college and conducted interviews of the visually challenged students enrolled in the college both at undergraduate and post-graduation level. Most of the interviewed students have been granted monetary scholarships from the Singapore based organization. In October 2017, the Enabling Unit organized a poster making competition in collaboration with the NSS unit of the college on the theme of disability.

One of our VH students, Anju, from BA Programme III year, in January 2018, participated at a national level Para-athletic event and won three medals, including one gold. On 25th January, 2018, the Youtube channel of Punjab Kesri News Network, Navodaya Times, conducted a live interview of the various VH students of our college, as well as of our principal, Dr Savita Roy. The visually challenged students shared the reality of the everyday struggle they go through in and outside the college premises, while our principal shed some light on how the administration is striving towards making the college premises friendlier to persons with disabilities.



Film and Photography Society-Sepia

The academic year 2017 -18 has been an eventful one for Sepia - The film and photography society of Daulat Ram College. It started on the 2nd of August with the yearly auditions which were a lot more elaborate this time, as compared to the previous year. A lot of fresh, motivated talent was picked up from the demanding selection process which provided all the participants with an opportunity to explore and bring to surface, their unique perspectives of the world and their capacities to exhibit that perspective in their pictures. The first round involved an on-spot photography assignment limited only in the given themes, not their interpretation. The second round had one on one interviews with the interested participants out of which, the best of the lot were filtered and absorbed into the little family of Sepia.



We had the fortune to screen 2 movies by the famous Documentary maker PankajBhutalia and engage in a very informative discussion about the same. "Moksha", which sheds light on the lives of a very specific demographic - the widows of/in Vindavan, was screened for the society members a day before his talk. On the day of the talk was screened "Textures of loss" which is about the traumatic emotional baggage that the residents of Kashmir carry with them and how they've come to deal with it. The talk followed by a discussion was attended by many students from different colleges and universities.

The last event in 2017 was the photo exhibition "Decipher 2.0" which turned out to be a huge success, with a footfall of approximately 1500 in just one day. Student guests from other societies of Delhi University showed immense interest in the exhibition and contributed with constructive criticism and appreciation wherever they felt the need.

2018 begins with a bang as we organise a Film Festival dedicated to the Amazing Actor Deepti Naval on February 2-3, 2018.

Finance and Investment Cell

1) Paper Presentation

The selected top 8 teams presented their papers in next round to our esteemed panel of judges constituting our teachers: Ms. Shikha Singh, Ms. Roopshikha and Ms. Richa Kaur. These extraordinary minds were remarkable in their thoughts and ideas.

2) Trading Freak

Gender Champion Club

The Gender Champion Club, Daulat Ram College has been established as per UGC Guidelines on initiative of MHRD, Government of India. Dr Kavita Sharma has been appointed as Nodal Teacher for the club, which



is responsible to impart gender awareness and sensitization about gender related issues. Gender equality and awareness is more than a goal in itself. It is a pre-condition for meeting the challenge of reducing poverty, promoting sustainable development and building good governance. Gender involves examining how biologically differentiated bodies accrue meanings as woman or man over time, and in relation to each other. It also involves looking at the complex ways in which masculinities and femininities may reinforce each other or also overlap. All the activities and programmes were held with the aim of experiences and spreading the message of no power and equality difference. This Gender Champion Club of Daulat Ram College has seen overwhelming response from the students for the same. Brief details for the same as follows:

Activities during the Session:

- 1. Group discussion on gender related issues.** On 13th September 2017, GCC organized a Group Discussion on Gender related topics. It was inaugurated by Dr Kavita Sharma and organized by selected Gender Champions of the college. They started it by giving an introduction of gender and gender related issues. According to Gender Champions, gender is a human construct with prejudices. People generally criticize rather than taking a stand. Further it was followed by a discussion on sex and gender. It was initiated by students, who brought forward the differences between sex and gender. According to her, sex is a predefined term whereas gender is something which is given by the society. And with it comes different gender roles, gender identity, ultimately creating prejudices and leading to discrimination.
- 2. Inter class debate on Constitutional Provisions regarding gender equality.** The event was conducted on 20th September 2017. It started with a small introduction by Zaresha Zunaid and Anjali Rajput regarding the discrepancies that still surround our system and the laws regarding women. Zaresha said that the position of India in providing legal help to its women is lagging way behind its counterparts. The debate started with Yusra who raised the point that there are many aspects of a women's life which are not considered worthy of providing legal help such as marital rape but are otherwise very serious issues. She had also put forward the point that there are many laws that women aren't even aware of and the laws are also one sided with men not being granted even an ounce of benefit of doubt. The audience shared their opinion about the topic. Some felt that the laws have provided a great stimulation to women and have empowered them. Some others argued that there is a dire need to change the thinking. They felt that the gender laws were not up to the mark and a lot of improvement needs to be done to enhance its usefulness. Another point raised was that laws need to be followed but we don't follow it because of the lack of consequence. People don't fear the laws and if we want people to follow the laws we need to install fear in them and tell them that defying these laws will have dire consequences.
- 3. Discussion on gender related issues with the Visually Handicapped.** "The loss of sight does not impair the qualities of mind and heart". This event was held on 27th September 2017. The main aim of the programme was to give a platform to the blind girls to share their experiences and thoughts. It was very



astounding to hear so much from them, even though they can't see they still faced the same gender differences and inequalities. It was started by Zaresha Zunaid and Anjali Rajput who gave an introduction focusing on the blinds and their problems in present day society. Shivali from Political Science Department raised the issue of discrimination they face not only in villages but in the cities as well. Also in and about the university area where everyone is educated. She added that discrimination happens to the ones belonging from educated families as well. Dr Kavita shared her experience with the visually impaired and told how talented they are. Under her there are almost eleven girls who have been getting trained for various sports and activities. Sunaina who is from the History department 2nd year shared her bus experience representing all the other blind students. They usually depend on the people at the bus stop to let them if the buses have arrived or not. But people are least bothered to help them or at least inform them and which makes them miss their buses on a regular basis. She is currently doing well in sports and is preparing for civil service. Usually blind girls or boys are not supported to go outside and pursue education, their family, near and dear ones fear. But we had Urmila from Hindi honors who shared how supportive her family is.

4. **EXPOSURE VISIT.** A visit to nearby areas of Daulat Ram College, Delhi University, was conducted by Mrs. Kavita Sharma. All the Gender champions took part in this. This visit was the result of an appalling incident narrated by an anonymous girl. She unfolded her contemptible experience when she encountered a man on a bike near Ramjas College, who tried to molest her by suddenly showing off his private part. This infuriated Dr Kavita Sharma and she called a meeting of Gender Champions to arrange a visit to that place in order to take strict actions against that person. The Gender Champions were divided into three groups who headed in different directions. As reported by the Gender Champions, the police surveillance was already there at that place. The presence of police entails that they were already reported about the incident.
5. **Self Defense:** This event was conducted on 4th October 2017. This programme was conducted by Madam Daisy, a fitness professional. It was started by Zaresha Zunaid and Anjali Rajput by giving a highlight on the importance of self-defense and physical fitness. Zaresha said Rape, molestation, kidnapping and murder are the most common forms of crime against women in India. The women in India are also vulnerable to acid attacks and eve-teasing. We have always seen that a woman is not well equipped to defend herself against an attacker. There is this saying; Self-defense helps women protect themselves and their family. Secondly it builds confidence in them and thirdly it teaches them discipline which transfers over to all the other areas of their life. Self-defense skills prepare one to fight rather than freeze. Now to practice self-defense one needs to be fit. Fitness does not only refer to being physically fit, but also refers to a person's mental state as well. If a person is physically fit, but mentally unwell or troubled, he or she will not be able to function optimally. Mental fitness can only be achieved if your body is functioning well.
6. **Poster making Competition depicting issues faced by Women in India:** This activity was conducted on 1st November 2017. All the students were provided with the sheets and asked to bring the other required materials for the same. A number of girls participated and made this event a success.
7. **Games and Fitness** This event was held on 8th September 2017. In this activity the girls were basically made to play few games like khokho, kabaddi etc. The aim of this activity was to bring unity among the girls, to let them experience some fun yet improve their physical fitness. Everyone had a lot of fun. Madam Daisy conducted the entire event.



8. **Talk about menstruation and menstrual issues:** This event was organized on 10 January, 2018 by Gender Champion Club of the college to raise awareness about Menstruation and menstrual issues which are common but are never talked about. Students were made aware about importance of this Biological process. Talk about Myths associated with such a necessary process in which students shared their own experience was the highlight of the event. Students were also made aware about PCOS and PCOD, which are increasingly becoming common due to unhealthy lifestyle prevalent these days.

Gender Champion Club of the college has seen mass participation of students in all events organized by it and strives to achieve the constitutional goal of promoting Gender equity, eliminate gender bias and empower its women to take on every challenge of life and to realize their full potential.

On 13th Sep 2017, a bilingual writing, editing and proof reading contest was organized where the students not only penned down their insightful thoughts about women's development issues, they also showcased their skills in editing a paragraph, revising and improving statements and also answering a subjective question.



Movie Screening

On 29 Sep 2017, a documentary film titled "Izzatnagri Ki Asabhaya Betiyan" was screened by the society. It was an informative film on honor killings and how some survivors are contributing to the society by becoming activists fighting against the system with help from the government.

The documentary filmmaker, Nakul Singh Sawhney, dared to take his camera in the lands where the rule of the 'khap' frightens the society. His film, is first of its kind in the documentary films category and follows the varying tragic stories of five protagonists and the 'justification' for those tragedies from the khap representatives themselves. It also showed the struggle of the few who dared to break away from the clutches of this suffocating system.

Self-Defense Workshop

On 24th Oct 2017, a self-defense workshop was conducted by the Rotaract Club. It was conducted in the morning slot. The aim of this workshop was to introduce the idea of being self-dependent and self-reliant with the help of martial arts. The instructors focused on practical aspects of self-defense and demonstrated some easy tricks that would be handy for all women in adverse situations.

Safe City Workshop on Sexual Harassment

On 24 Oct 2017, a lecture session was organized in the afternoon session. Ms Arushi, from Delhi University, emphasized the importance of saying 'no' to sexual violence. Finally an activity session was also organized to ensure that every participant has understood the message clearly.

Carrier Counseling Workshop

On 1 Nov 2017, a Carrier counseling workshop was conducted by Jamboree. FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

Chemistry Department

Faculty Development Program by Department of Chemistry entitled "From Chemistry of Life to Chemistry of Diseases: Understanding Clinical Biochemistry (UCB-17)

Department of Chemistry, Daulat Ram College organized a Faculty Development Program entitled "From Chemistry of Life to Chemistry of Diseases: Understanding Clinical Biochemistry (UCB-17) from 15 June to 22 June 2017. Dr Priti Malhotra was the convenor and Dr Divya Mathur was the coordinator of the program.

The overarching theme of the program was to discuss and understand the chemistry of biomolecules and their analysis, including new and novel analytical methods, how these molecules function and how this affects the biological functioning of the whole organism. The idea was to enrich the teachers with skills and knowledge in teaching biochemistry to the chemistry students. Faculty members and researchers from Delhi University colleges, and other universities such as Gargias University and Amity University attended the FDP.

The FDP was inaugurated by Prof Rita Kakkar from Department of Chemistry, DU. The inaugural lecture was delivered by Prof Shrikant Kukreti from Department of Chemistry, DU on **Nucleic acids and Proteins**. Dr Vishwajeet Rohil from Vallabhbhai Patel Chest Institute gave lecture on **Blood Diagnosis, Anaemia and Urine Diagnosis**. Prof R K Saxena, Department of Biochemistry, DU gave a talk on **Enzymes in Chemical Industry**. A tour to Patel Chest Institute was conducted for the participants where they were introduced to the process of blood analysis performed in a pathology lab.

The teachers thoroughly enjoyed the lecture by Prof D Sundar from Department of Biochemical Engineering and Biotechnology, IIT Delhi on **Gene Therapy**. Dr Sushama Talegaonkar from Department of Pharmaceutics, Faculty of Pharmacy, Jamia Hamdard gave a talk on **Liposomes and Drug Delivery**. Prof A K Prasad, Department of Chemistry, DU enlightened the teachers about **Biocatalysis in Green**



Chemistry. Prof Anil K Mishra INMAS, DRDO gave a lecture on **Radiation in Clinical Biochemistry.**

Apart from lectures there were also hands-on exercises based on blood analysis and gel electrophoresis. The participants also gave presentations on various topics given to them by the panel of UCB-17.

Prof. Roderick Wayland Bates from National University of Singapore (NUS) gave the Valedictory lecture on **Online Methods in Chemical Education** and distributed the certificates to the participants.

Commerce Department

Faculty Development Program on Goods & Service Tax

The Department of Commerce, Daulat Ram College organized two days Faculty Development Program from 26th to 27th December, 2017 on **"Implementation of Goods and Services Tax"** for faculty members, professionals and research scholars in the college. The program was organized to create awareness of the latest developments in the GST to the teachers, professionals, research scholars etc. and intended to give an opportunity for discussion and exchange of ideas on GST and its practical application for effective implementation. The program received an overwhelming response from more than 35 participants from different colleges and universities including Jammu & Kashmir university. The programme was inaugurated by CA Upender Gupta, Commissioner, GST, CBEC (Chief Guest), Prof. Kavita Sharma, Head, Department of Commerce, University of Delhi (Guest of Honour), CA Ashok Batra, Eminent GST Expert, Dr. Savita Roy, Principal and Dr. Indu Jain, FDP Convener.

In second session, resource persons, CA Ashok Batra and CA Atul Puri gave their lectures on different topics of Goods & Service Tax, such as Different Types of Supplies & Time of Supply, Place and Valuation of Supply. They shared their knowledge with participants through examples, which helped participants to understand the concept.

On second day, we were joined by resource persons, CA Rohini Aggarwal, GST Consultant and CA Ankit Jain, Tax Consultant, who gave lectures on GST-Input Tax Credit, Reverse Charge Mechanism, Taxability of E-Commerce, Anti-Profiteering.

The modules of the skill development course were: Isolation and Characterization of DNA, Estimation of cholesterol in various oils, Synthesis of valuable organic molecules



via MCR and its Chromatographic identification, Preparation of chemical preservative free hand sanitizers and their comparison with commercial sanitizers. Green synthesis of silver nanoparticles from natural extract and preparation of anti-ageing cream from nanoparticles, Evaluation of SPF in various sunscreen lotions and their comparison, Quantification of antioxidant properties of fruit juices and Computational Chemistry.
