#### ABOUT THE COLLEGE

#### DBT Star College NIRF Rank 26

India Today Rank: Science 7; Commerce 13; Humanities 15

Daulat Ram College is a premier educational institution in Delhi founded by an educationist Late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta in 1960. It is a prestigious women's college engaged in imparting liberal education to women. A large constituent college of the University of Delhi, the college, originally started as Pramila College at 22, Tilak Marg with thirteen members of teaching and two non-teaching staff and about 350 students. In 1964, the college shifted to its present premises in Delhi University north campus and was renamed as Daulat Ram College. The institution has since, grown into a full-fledged extended college of University of Delhi. The college has evolved into a prestigious women's college with its own distinct culture and traditions. It imparts education towards degree at the bachelor's level in Arts, Commerce and Science and Master's level in arts.

The courses in science were introduced in 1968 which led to the construction of the science block and well-equipped science laboratories. The commerce and M.A. courses in many subjects, as well as new courses in B.A. (H) and B.A. (Pass) were added subsequently. Further expansion of the college took place with the introduction of B.Sc. (H) in Biochemistry, Chemistry and Mathematics, in addition to Nutrition and Health Education (NHE) and Office Management and Secretarial Practice (OMSP) and subjects in B.A. (Pass). The college building which was constructed in the 1960s was further expanded to cater to the growing needs of the students. A new block of tutorial rooms, a modern seminar hall, new class rooms and science laboratories for Physics, NHE and Biochemistry were added. Subsequently, computer lab open to all students with internet facility was also added. Currently the college has add-on courses in foreign languages. At present there are 19 departments with about 4200 students on rolls, about 180 teaching staff and 75 non-teaching staff. The college has a well-equipped computerized library, facility for gymnastics, table tennis, athletics and other games and holds leading position both in academics and sports. Recently a well-equipped conference hall with a capacity of 200 students was built.

The college provides hostel facilities with an intake capacity of 200 students. It caters mainly to outstation students. Due to limited number of seats, only meritorious students are selected for admission to the hostel.

The college is proud to have a well-equipped modern auditorium, Sadbhawna Bhawan, with capacity of about 1200 persons.

### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT 2021 59<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL DAY

The academic year 2020–21 was unique in more than one sense. Firstly the college completed 60 years of its existence. It was also the year when the world witnessed the worst pandemic ever faced by mankind. As a result, the students and the teachers were suddenly forced to switch over from the physical mode of teaching-learning to the virtual mode. The education sector saw a revolutionary change when the government announced National Education Policy 2020 which intends to bring far reaching changes in the higher education system. The process of promotion of teachers and non-teaching staff, pending since 2007, was also resumed. The College also undertook sincere efforts to appoint non-teaching staff on vacant positions. Hence, I said that the academic year 2020-21 was a unique year in many ways.

The Covid-19 pandemic, which started in the month of March 2020, continues till date. Amidst the fear of second wave and in view of the guidelines issued by the Government of India, it is not possible to celebrate the annual day in the college. However, I would like to put on record the highlights of the achievements of the college during the year 2020-21. A detailed report of the various activities of the college is given in the subsequent pages of this annual report.

In the current academic year the admission process was completely online. Despite being in Covid pandemic situation, there was huge demand for seats in Daulat Ram College. Students from all over India applied for 18 different courses in the Humanities, Science and Commerce stream. In the session 2020-21 college has admitted 1492 students at undergraduate level and the admission cut-off ranged from 91 to 98.66 percent. 393 students were admitted in the post graduate programmes in seven different subjects. In addition, students had shown great interest in the Centre for Foreign Languages where we have certificate, diploma and advanced diploma courses in seven foreign languages viz Japanese, Korean, Chinese, German, Spanish, French and Italian. These add-on courses are also open to the students other than those of Daulat Ram College. More than 700 students are enrolled in the foreign language courses. Hence the total number of students enrolled for the academic year was over 5500. The increase in the number of students is attributed to the 10% increase on the account of reservation for economically weaker sections as mandated by Government of India. The task was dedicatedly executed by the admission committee headed by Dr Sarita Nanda and Dr Sujata Raju.

Although the year was full of challenges, the college teachers modified their teaching pedagogy and trained themselves to reach their students through online classes. College conducted online training sessions to enable teachers to learn and adapt to the latest in digital technology. Students were given dedicated email IDs to attend their online classes. They were trained to handle ICT tools through a series of webinars with online training sessions so that their online classes were seamless. After a week of training, the teaching learning activities took place through the online mode only. Thus, during the

pandemic, the role of teachers of Daulat Ram College was commendable. The entire process of admission, teaching, internal assessment, practical laboratories, examination and their evaluation and results went online. College teachers compiled and provided all the reading materials to their students. The visually challenged students were provided with recorded reading materials by NSS and faculty members. The university conducted Open Book Examinations and special webinars were conducted to teach them on how to attempt Open Book Examinations.

The students of the college have achieved great heights in both academic and extracurricular activities. Special mention may be made of those who became position holders in Delhi University. Minakshi Verma, Pooja Yadav and Neha Aggarwal of Mathematics (H) II Year secured First Position in the North Campus, Delhi University while Devanshi Thakur of Psychology (Hons) III Year also secured First Position in the North Campus of the University. Besides these, many other students also excelled in their academic performance and brought laurels to the college.

College selects All Round Best Student of the Year taking into account academic performance and involvement in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. The All Round Best Student of the Year is awarded to Arjita Jhingran, student of Psychology department, third year.

College NCC has done tremendously well during the year. It is a matter of great pride to announce that 15 NCC cadets from the college participated in the PM Rally on the occasion of the Republic Day. Dr. Suparna Jain Thakur, Assistant Professor of Psychology department successfully completed Precommission NCC officer's training at OTA Gwalior and was commissioned the rank of Lieutenant on December 14, 2020. On completion of the course, she was awarded 'the Commandant's gold medal for standing first in the order of merit'. Further, she was awarded the 'Best ANO of the Course' trophy and 'the Sharma Cup' for standing first in academics during training.

The Placement Cell of the College, under the guidance of Dr. Kalpana Vaish, offered placement to students in different well-known Indian and global companies which includes Wipro, Deloitte, Byjus, Chegg India, Tresvista, Larsen & Toubro, Fincart, Teach for India, EY GDS, etc. A total of 68 students and 134 students received job offers and internships respectively. The highest CTC offered was 6.4 LPA.

The backbone of any institution is its non-teaching staff. I convey my special thanks to the administrative non-teaching staff without whose constant support we could not have conducted the examination process which included conduct of examinations, evaluation, result and distribution of degrees. The accounts section also continued to work for timely release of salaries, medical bills etc. Best employee award of the year is awarded to Mr. Apurv Singh and Mr. Amit Jamwal.

Since the pandemic is still in air and it is not possible to celebrate the 60th year of establishment of this college, the Annual Day celebration will be rescheduled in the next academic session.

#### **Academic Activities**

Faculty Development Programme

July 21 - 23, 2020

The Department of Commerce, under the convenorship of Dr Sushma Arora, organised a 3-day e-FDP on *Empowering Teaching-Learning Process using Google Classroom and other ICT Tools: A Comprehensive Practical Approach* from July 21- 23, 2020. The sessions were conducted on the Google Meet platform from 11.00 AM to 1.00 PM each day, and witnessed enthusiastic participation from 130 DRC faculty members. The sessions on all 3 days were conducted by resource persons Dr Bhavya Ahuja Grover and Dr Nikhil Kumar Rajput, serving as Assistant Professors in the Department of Computer Science at Ramanujan College, University of Delhi.




On Day 1, both resource persons meticulously guided the faculty members on ways to utilise the Google Classroom for effective online teaching. The faculty members were provided hands-on training on various aspects of Google Classroom, such as creating a classroom, ways for students to join a Classroom, and the various aspects involved in sharing course materials and assignments through Google Classroom. They also highlighted the useful features accessible in

Google Classroom that are created using a G-Suite account instead of a personal Gmail account. At the end of the session, the faculty members submitted a quiz and an assignment on the topics covered during the day.

On Day 2, Dr Bhavya Ahuja Grover explained additional features in Google Classroom, such as creating rubrics (developing and sharing the criteria on the basis of which assignments are to be evaluated), google comments (a feature that enables teachers to share feedback with students), copying a previously archived classroom and the method to generate a Google Meet link for live online classroom interaction with the students. At the end of the session, the faculty members submitted a quiz and an assignment on the topics covered during the day.

On Day 3, Dr Nikhil Kumar Rajput covered several applications that are useful in effective online teaching, specifically Google Docs, Google Sheets, WikiPages and Digital Signatures. He also guided the faculty members in using the menu options and add-ons in Google Docs and other G-Suite applications. At the end of the session, the faculty members submitted a quiz and an assignment on the topics covered during the day.





#### Skill Development Programmes (for Students)

To facilitate the digital transition, *In- House Skill Development Programs* were organised in two rounds across all departments under the aegis of the *IQAC* under the convenorship of Dr Pooja V. Anand. The SDPs aimed to train students on different ICT and digital platforms to empower students to attend the online classes with ease and confidence. It was an attempt to help students handle the new digital platforms in the absence of physical classes during the Pandemic.


#### **Learning Outcomes:**


Webinar on Art and Science of Mentoring

#### 2. Role of Police in Pandemic


June 6, 2020

The webinar witnessed enthusiastic presence of 700 national/international participants.


## 3. Skill Enhancement Techniques amidst COVID-19 June 13, 2020

ELICIT (B. A. Programme Committee) comprises of different discipline combinations which provide a multidisciplinary platform and perspective to the students. 208 seats were duly filled across combinations in the admissions process. A series of Orientation Programmes were initiated under the various Discipline combinations. All students joined using their College IDs. The first year students across the combination were warmly welcomed to Daulat Ram College. They were taken through the various salient aspects of Daulat Ram College, which is a NAAC 'A' accredited College situated in the North Campus of Delhi University. The vibrant college life, including both academics as well as extracurricular activities, was presented. The various forums of student engagement and activities like the NSS, NCC, Sports etc were mentioned as well as the rich student societies of Dance, Music, Quiz, Debate, Theatre etc.

The Course Structure of the B.A. Programme was presented along with the Discipline Core Papers, AECC and Language papers to be undertaken during Semester I. 

## Biochemistry

Association In-charge: Dr. Padmshree Mudgal

The Biochemistry Association's inaugural lecture was organised on November 25, 2020. We were very fortunate to have with us Dr Debojyoti Chakraborty and his team who have been pioneers in indigenously developing CRISPR based COVID-19 detection kit which is now popularly known as Feluda. Dr Chakraborty is a senior scientist at CSIR-IGIB, New Delhi. He has been the recipient of CSIR Young Scientist Award [2020], Merck Young Scientist Award

[2019] and Lady Tata Young Investigator Award [2019] in recent years. His team Member Dr Sneha Gulati has been an active member of his group in developing the covid19 detection kit. Dr Chakraborty first introduced the CRISPR methodology and its importance in today's time. Dr Sneha Gulati followed up by presenting the utilization of CRISPR methodology in developing the Feluda based diagnostic kit for COVID-19 detection. They are now developing the home-based kit for this infectious disease. Question and answer session followed the talk. About 100 people registered for the talk out of which 69% were students and 31% were faculty members of various colleges. Most of the participants suggested that the webinar was very informative and they would want to have more of such lectures on COVID-19.



The Biochemistry department annual festival BIOMANIA 2020-21 was held on February 13, 2021 over zoom meet. In our effort to sensitize the students towards important environmental and sustainability issues facing the world today, the Biochemistry department organized an intra college contest: "The Innovation Challenge: Create a better future" under the convenorship of Dr Padmshree Mudgal and Dr Leena Vig. Student teams were invited to submit write-ups proposing innovative ideas for solutions to different areas of sustainable development viz., Disease prevention & Health Care, Human potential Development, Resource Conservation, Business plan and Product development, Environment Protection, Waste utilization and

value addition. Five best teams were selected for presenting their ideas in front of invited judges. Shri Nimish Kapoor, Scientist-E, Vigyan Prasar and Mr. Ishteyaque Ahmad from Greenpeace organization were our esteemed judges for the student contest. Best three teams were awarded prizes. As a part of this program, we had an engrossing talk on sustainable agriculture by Mr. Ishteyaque Ahmad. The participating student teams showed keen interest and presented their innovative ideas with much appreciated confidence and enthusiasm. In addition to valuable feedback given to each student team by our judges, recommendations for further perusal of their interesting ideas were also shared. Further avenues and opportunities offered by Vigyan Prasar for spreading science to society were also shared which was exciting for students and faculty alike. There was a total of 44 participants in the Biomania contest. About 60 people attended the Biomania 2020-21 event out of which ten were faculty.






The departmental election to elect the first year representatives was held on January 11, 2021.

#### **Events Organized**






First position: Deshna Jain, Economics of Crime beyond law and order


#### Webinars

departments. Attractive prizes were given to the winners. These events helped students learn how to innovate and make their favourite dishes healthier and nutritionally balanced.



faculty of the department Dr Indu Bahadur, and Dr Renu Kishore, following which cultural programs were held and the function ended with the release of a commemorative booklet.




### Zoological Society - Koshika



The Chief Guests for the festival was Mr Neeraj Arora, Advocate, Supreme Court and Guest of Honour was Mr Shubham Gautam, Cyber Security Expert. Neeraj Arora described what *encrypt* actually is, and how encryption is used as a weapon. He talked about hacking of Facebook, Instagram and WhatsApp and also explained measures to counter them.

Annual newsletter of Cyber Cell Cybernetics 2020 was e-launched. It included write-ups and articles by students on topics related to the cyber world and its applications.

The cell organised a talk by Mr Ajit Kumar (Director, King Digital Private Limited) on the topic *Careers in Digital Marketing*.

The new session was marked by a well-attended webinar on *Cyber Hygiene*. The resource person was Mr Rahul Tyagi, co-founder and VP of Lucideus. Discussing the best cyber hygiene practices, Mr Tyagi recommended and stressed the need for the young people to be careful while entering the cyber world.

Career Endeavours conducted a webinar on *Demystifying MBA- India or Abroad*. The resource person was expert career counselor and mentor, Mr Alok Bansal who provided insightful information regarding demand in the industry and other challenges that students aspirants might come across.



Over more than 50 young learners from University of Delhi took part in an international webinar on Machine Learning on August 8, 2020, organised by our Cyber Cell. It was panelled by Ms Neha Jaiswal, founder of Science Canvas. The webinar incorporated an introduction to Data Science, machine learning, coupled with a comprehensive mini project and programming language Python. Participants were given ecertificates.

On August 29, 2020, the Cyber Cell organized a webinar on *How to become a Data Analyst?* The webinar was graced by two subject experts Mr.Tushar Ojha and Mr. Sachin Thigale. Mr. Thigale briefed the participants about business intelligence, collecting and transferring data from various platforms to tableau, creation of workbooks and worksheets.

Observing the *Vigilance Awareness Week* (October 27 to November 2), Cyber Cell organised a session by an Advocate, Ethical Hacker and Cyber Professional, Mr Manoj Kumar Ahlawat. Mr. Manoj explained the cyber security principles of *Prevent, Detect and Recover*.

The cyber cell organized another webinar on *Careers and Employability in the UK* which received appreciable participation from students. This webinar cleared the doubts of those willing to and looking for employability in the United Kingdom.

On the request of the faculty members, Cyber Cell also organised an informative webinar on *The New Privacy Policy of WhatsApp versus Other Apps*. On June 28, 2020, a webinar was organized on Impact Of Covid-19 on *Startups And Global Economy* with Mr. Nitesh Kaushik, Entrepreneurship Development and Placement Specialist at UNDP, India. Mr. Kaushik provided the students with real-world insights and an understanding of the mechanism beyond the books.

Another successful webinar was executed on July 20, 2020 with Ms. Devika Narain, a globally renowned entrepreneurial wedding planner and designer. She has designed some of the most opulent weddings including that of Virat Kohli and Anushka Sharma.

An International webinar on *Government Policies And Challenges To Entrepreneurship* was organized on September 2, 2020. The objective of the workshop was to give our students an insight into the world of business strategy development and educate them on various aspects of running a profitable business.



### Finance & Investment Cell

The Finance and Investment cell of the college is co-convened by both the commerce and economics departments. FIC organized a 'Research Paper Writing Competition' on September 22, 2020 on the topic *COVID-19: A strategic opportunity for sustainable development*. 2020. The goal of the competition was to encourage critical thinking, strengthen research ability, and refine the participant's analytical approach and time management skills. A certificate of participation was given to the participants.

The FIC organized a webinar on *Career Options Available in the Financial Market Domain* in collaboration with BSE Institute, Delhi on October 17, 2020. Sanjeev talked in depth about the equity markets discussing the basic trading terms and the trading process supported by practical examples.

The FIC collaborated with Dynamic Financial Market Institute to serve and assist the students to acquire some key learnings and skills during the pandemic. It is a Delhi based training center whereby the modern generation stock market trainers and financial advisors equip the candidates with tools and techniques useful for financial planning in today's financial and economic scenario. DFM Institute offered a course on *Mutual Funds Analysis* and internship program to students which commenced on 1st July 2020. With 4 hours of theoretical learning and 30 hours project work which was segregated into 15 small projects of 2 hours each, the students were able to understand and equip themselves with immense knowledge and practical understanding of the dynamic stock market.

The FIC organised STRATINNOVA- An Online Case Study X Bplan Competition in two rounds. There were around 390 registered participants. The first round conducted on October 25, 2020 was a case study competition on an Ed-Tech company that judged the participants' analytical, logical, reasoning, research and decision- making skills as they had to provide solutions to the company's problems. The second round, held on October 28, was based on preparing a presentation on the first round case study problem and construct a Bplan. The participants presented their business plans to the honorable judges via google meet. There were three judges: Aditya Arora (CEO of FAAD NETWORK PVT. LTD.), Aman Sadique (Analyst) and Praney Thapa (Sr. Manager in Unacademy). FIC had partnered with CASE CONNECT CLUB as KNOWLEDGE PARTNER and DARE2COMPLETE as ONLINE HOSTING PARTNER. The judges announced the results of STRATINNOVA and two teams were declared as winner and runner up.

The FIC conducted its recruitment drive from September 18 - 20, 2020 and inducted 9 new members in the finance team.



Gandhi Jayanti which included address by Principal Madam, bhajans and dance performance by students, announcement of winners for various events conducted by GSC earlier.



College aims to become a Zero-Discharge campus. Thus it has set up a recycling unit on campus which houses a paper recycling machines and leave shredder machine. This machines help to make recycled paper and leave shredder machine helps to make manure. The functioning of recycling unit is improving day by day with manufacture of tons of manure which is used in house or sold outside, preparation ceramic pots with medicinal/antipollution plants, making of white and brown recycled paper, use of these papers for painting. Ceramic pots and paintings are being used as gifts for our guests in the college. Students can do their internship here and can earn NSS hours by participating in its functioning.

Ever since its inception in 2016 this unit has been used to process shredded leaves into manure, recycle paper and cartons, provide potted plants for gifting and also provide folders, paintings, and carry bags made from recycled paper. Students and Community workshops are held

regularly. Two workers are getting employment in this unit. It is also providing study material for 2 Ph.D students who are enrolled with us. We have also added a soil testing machine to maintain the quality of the manure made.







### ZEBRAFISH LABORATORY FACILITY

(Under IQAC)

The zebrafish lab facility in Daulat Ram College was set up in October 2015, jointly by Biochemistry and Zoology Departments in collaboration with CSIR-IGIB, Mathura Road, Delhi, and Sansriti Foundation Delhi. The facility has been funded by Star Innovation projects DU, Star College project DBT, Govt. of India, and Innovation projects DU. It was developed with the aim of providing an alternative *in vivo* non –invasive model system for science education, teaching and research.

Students of Biochemistry (Hons), Zoology (Hons) and Life Sciences join the lab as interns and work on research projects during their free time and holidays. This opportunity provides students with experiences wherein they can explore and discover the nature and process of scientific research using the zebrafish model system. Small internship programs are also conducted for school students.

#### DROSOPHILA RESOURCE CENTRE

(Under IQAC)

Drosophila Resource Centre was set up in the Department of Biochemistry almost 10 years ago. The centre is funded by DBT Star College Project. It aims to teach the basic principles of genetics using *Drosophila* as a model system. Almost 250 students have been trained since its inception. Students of different life science streams such as Botany, Biochemistry, Life Sciences and Zoology from DU and Punjab University have been trained at the centre. A lab manual on 'Rediscovering Genetics' has been published in 2016 that covers the range of experiments performed by the students at the centre. The students have been immensely benefited by this training which is reflected in their selection and perusal of higher education in genetics from prestigious places. The centre also provides stocks and support to many colleges of Delhi University and AIIMS.

In the 2020-21 session, due to COVID-19 pandemic, online practicals were carried out for the students using recorded videos and images.
