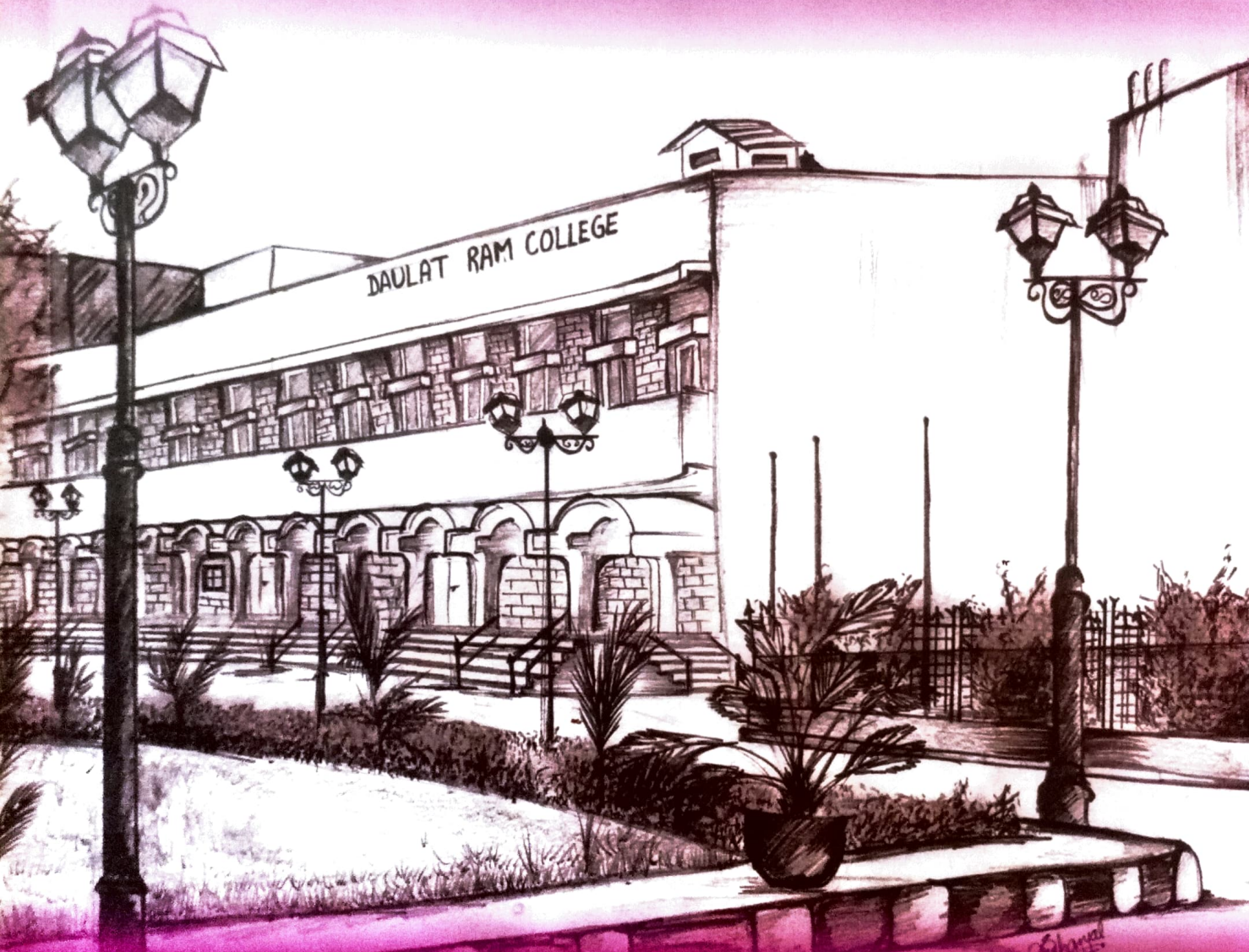

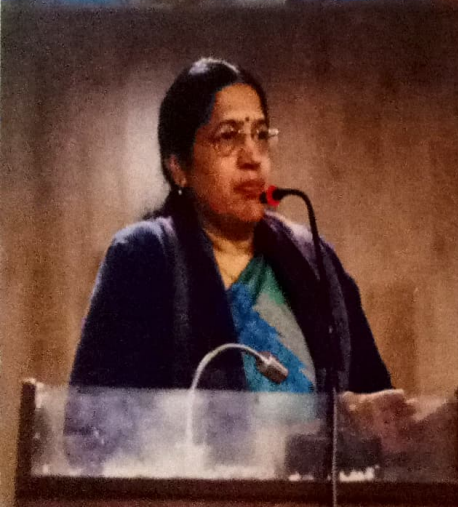
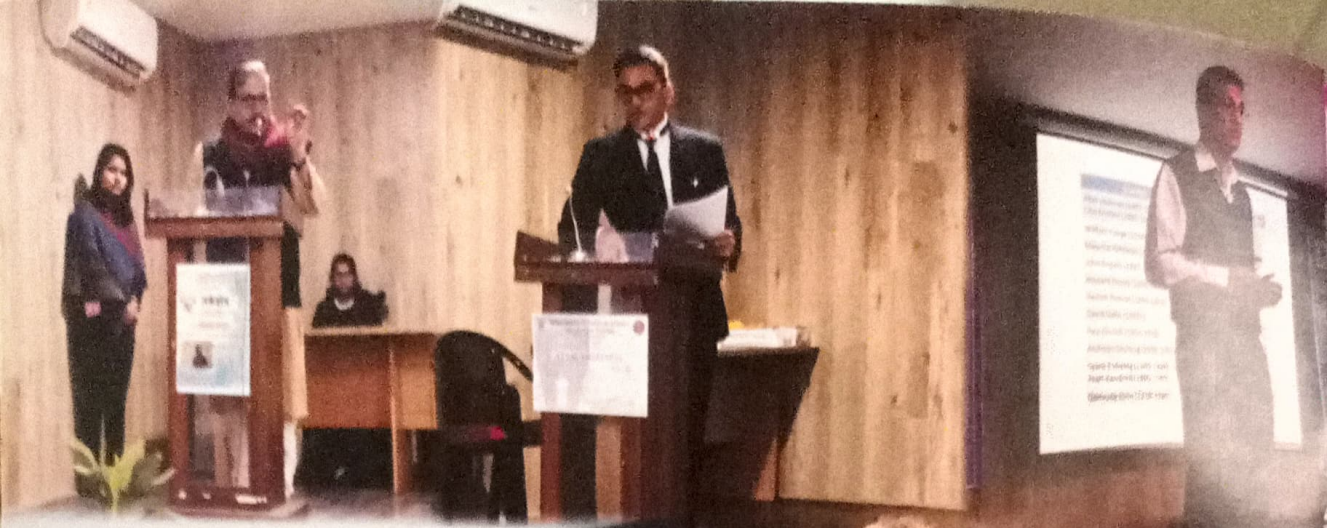

## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Daulat Ram college is a premier educational institution in Delhi founded by an educationist late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta in 1960. It is a prestigious women's college engaged in imparting liberal education to women. The college, a large constituent college of the University of Delhi, originally started as "Pramila College" at 22, Tilak Marg with thirteen members of teaching staff and two office staff with about 350 students. In 1964, the college shifted to its present premises in North Delhi University campus and was renamed as Daulat Ram College. The institution has since grown into a full fledged extended college of University of Delhi. The college has acquired a strong identity and has evolved into a prestigious women's college with its own distinct culture and traditions. It imparts education towards degrees at the Bachelors level in arts, commerce and science and Masters level in arts.

The courses in science were introduced in 1968 which led to the construction of the science block and well equipped science laboratories. The Commerce and M.A. courses in many subjects, as well as new courses in B.A. (H) and B.A. (Pass) were added subsequently. Further expansion of the college took place with the introduction of B.Sc. (H) in Biochemistry, Chemistry and Mathematics, addition of Nutrition and Health Education (NHE) and office management and secretarial practice (OMSP) as subjects in B.A. (Pass). The college building which was constructed in 1960s was further expanded to cater to the growing needs of the students. A new block of tutorial rooms, a modern seminar hall, new class rooms and science laboratories for Physics, NHE and Biochemistry were added. Subsequently, computer labs open to all students with internet facility have been added. Currently the college has add-on courses in foreign languages. At present there are 19 departments with over 3500 students on rolls, about 170 teaching staff and about 75 non teaching staff. The college has a well equipped computerized library, facility for gymnastics, table tennis, athletics and other games and holds a leading position both in academics and sports. Recently, a well-equipped Conference Hall with a capacity of 200 students has been built.

The college provides hostel facilities with an intake capacity of 200 students. It caters mainly to outstation students. Due to the limited number of seats, only meritorious students are selected for admission to the hostel.

The college is proud to have a well equipped modern auditorium "Sadbhavna Bhavan" with capacity of about 1200 persons.

On behalf of all professors and staff of Daulat Ram College which is accredited 'A' grade by NAAC and has star status. I am privileged to welcome amongst us our Chief Guest His Excellency Jagdishwar Goburdhun, High Commissioner of Mauritius, inaugural guest Shri Manoj Tiwari, Hon'ble Member of Parliament Lok Sabha and our alumni Ms. Radha Chaudhan, IAS and currently CEO of Gem Portal, GOI.

His Excellency Jagdishwar Goburdhun is currently the High Commissioner of Mauritius in India. He is also accredited to Singapore, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and Nepal, with residence in New Delhi. High Commissioner Goburdhun has had a long and successful career in Public Service. He has been Minister of Health of the Republic of Mauritius in 1983 and from 1986-1990. During his tenure he won the United Nations Gold Award in Community Health. He has also been Minister of Cooperatives and Handicrafts from 1990-1995.

His Excellency High Commissioner has had the very active public life as executive member of Sewa Shivr as founder member of Human Service Trust, as founder member of Mauritius Planter Agriculture Cooperative Society. He also created 45 community Health Centres in Mauritius and 5 in Rodrigues island. High Commission Goburdhun is known for having legalized traditional medicine including Ayurvedic and Chinese Medicines. He is also known for having constructed the Indian Ocean Cardio Surgical Centre as SSR Medical Hospital purely on self help basis.

He was elevated to the rank of GOSK by the President of the Republic in 2016. He has a close link with India. His Grandfather went to Mauritius on 4<sup>th</sup> June 1878 from Azamgarh District of Uttar Pradesh, India

Currently, He holds the Overseas Citizenship of India (OCI) status. Sir, we are honored to have you amongst us today.

Shri Manoj Tiwari is Member of Parliament from northeast Delhi constituency. Before joining politics, he had made his name in cine world and is a born singer. His melodious and effortless singing in local Bhojpuri language is very popular. He has done his schooling from Shri Kamlakar Chaubey Adarsh Seva Vidhyalay Intermediate College, Varanasi. He continued graduation from BHU (Banaras Hindu University), Varanasi. He has a degree in M.P.Ed (Master Of Physical Education).

Manoj Tiwari extended his support to the Delhi Bharatiya Janata Party and officially joined it in Sep. 2014. He was appointed as Member, Standing Committee on Transport, Tourism and Culture, Member of Consultative Committee, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and is also Member of Court of Jamia Milia Islamia University. When college was facing infrastructure issues, he walked in the college to extend help in its reconstruction. He has supported the college in making its building more accessible for PwD students by sanctioning financial support through MPLAD fund. He is down to earth and very humble person and accessible to public.

Ms. S. Radha Chauhan is an officer of the Indian Administrative Service (IAS), 1988 Batch, She studied Botany (H) & graduated from Daulat Ram College in the batch of 1981-1984. She has held several key positions both at State and central level and has vast experience in the field of planning, administration, education, e-



Governance, digital technologies, public procurement, project formulation and management. Some of the notable assignments, led by her during her three decades in public administration, include the unique identification project "Aadhar", in the capacity of Deputy Director General of UIDAI, drafting of the ICT Policy for School Education and the Mission Mode Projects on School Education, in the capacity of Joint Secretary to Government of India. The same has currently been operationalized as Shaala Darpan across schools in India.

Ms. S. Radha Chauhan is currently the Chief Executive Officer, Government e-Marketplace SPV under the Department of Commerce, Government of India, wherein she is heading the transformative initiative to achieve a paradigm shift in the public procurement space of India. Prior to GeM, Ms. Chauhan, was President and CEO, National e-Governance Division (NeGD), wherein she steered and coordinated the prestigious Digital India initiative of the Government of India.

Ms. Chauhan is also a keen researcher and has authored and presented multiple academic papers on e-Governance Policies from various perspectives, in Global Platforms. She had also led the International Conference on e-Governance (ICEGOV - 2017), the first of its kind to be held in India, in March 2017. This conference has led to creation of the innovative e-Governance Fellowship Program in India, in collaboration with Academic Institutions across the globe. Ms. Chauhan had helped us to initiate the purchase through GeM portal.

I take this opportunity to briefly present the highlights of college report. A more detailed achievements and activities of the college are given in the subsequent pages of this report.

The College saw induction of new members in our Governing Body. We welcome Prof. T.K.V. Subramanian, Mr. Vijay Kumar Sondhi, Mr. Mukesh Mohan Goyal, Mr. Ashwin Chadha, Prof. Shri Prakash Singh and Prof. Annapoorni S. as members of Governing Body. We look forward for their guidance and cooperation in taking college to greater heights.

Daulat Ram College has undergraduate courses in 18 subjects and postgraduate courses in 7 subjects. In addition, it has a Centre for Foreign Languages wherein we give certificate, diploma and advanced diploma in seven foreign languages viz Japanese, Korean, Chinese, German, Spanish, French and Italian. These are add on courses and our students derive maximum benefit out of these courses. In the session 2018-19, College has admitted 1962 students at undergraduate level and 350 students at post graduate level. The overall strength of students in the college is 3970 in regular degree courses which makes it the biggest women college. Intake percentage in various courses were in the range of 91% to 97%. It has been noted that more than 50% students taking admission in the college are from states other than Delhi NCR. 50 foreign students are enrolled in the college and they are from different countries including Afghanistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Tibet, Uzbekistan, Bangladesh etc. The College has admitted 25 PwD students this year strictly as per merit.

At DRC, we believe in imparting holistic education. In addition to formal education that we impart within existing University frame work, we engage students in connecting themselves to grass root level. Our students have done commendable work with Seva Bharati and Palna. The students are working under the guidance of experience Professors and learning life skills. The efforts of dedicated faculty is reflected in the University examination results. The pass percentage in different courses was in the range of 97 to 100%. We are proud of Nandini Puri for securing 1<sup>st</sup> position in M.A. (Prev and Final) in Pol. Science and Kamlesh for securing IIIrd position in M.A. (Hindi) in Delhi University (North Campus). College selects all round best student taking into account academic performance, participation and involvement in co-curricular and extracurricular activities. This year's prize for all round best student goes to Rahesha Sehgal of B.A. Program. The College has instituted Prof. Madan Mohan Prasad memorial prize which is for a student having attained International recognition in Academics/Extra Curricular/Sports. This special prize goes to Akanshya Satapathy of Bio Chemistry (Hons). Ms. Satapathy is renowned Oddisi dancer and has been performing in India and abroad for past 10 years. She has



conducted several workshop internationally & most recent being in Bhutan and Srilanka. We are proud of her exceptional achievement. For the first time in the history of this College 14 students of our College have been awarded University Meritorious Award 2018-19 by University of Delhi. In addition students have bagged 101 proficiency prizes, 47 Instituted prizes and 21 merit scholarships and 8 instituted scholarship in 2019.

The academic year 2018-19 witnessed surge of academic activities by teaching faculty of college. More than 150 research articles were published by them. Our senior faculty members are also engaged in "Integrating Traditional Indian healing practices with Contemporary Western health systems" organized by Psychology department under convenership of Dr. Meetu Khosla and Dr. Rajni Sahni sponsored by ICSSR and "North East India - Exploring Philosophy, Culture and environmental sustainability" under convenership of Dr. Sonia Mehta and Ms. Anna Senrung sponsored by ICPR and P.A. Sangma Foundation. In these conferences more than 250 papers were presented from different courses. A National Conference was organized on "North East India - An Untapped Tourism Industry". The science Professors of College joined hands to organize INSPIRE Camp under the aegis of DST, GOI. Around 150 school students from various schools of Delhi actively engaged themselves in hands on activities and interactive session with leading scientist such as Prof. Deepak Pental, Ex-VC of DU, Bhatnagar awardees such as Prof. Ajay Ghatak, Prof. Akhilesh Tyagi, Ex-Director National Institute of Immunology and Prof. Chandrima Saha. Students found the five days science camp a phenomenal journey providing them with new perspective on the importance and beauty of science. I congratulate Dr. P. Mudgal & Dr. Chitra Bhasin who have made it a success.

The activities of departmental association were enriched by eminent speakers and experts which helped students broaden their horizon. The year saw completion of 50 years of academic excellence of Botany Department. The talk by Dr. Chitrashree Ghosh of Dept. of Environmental Studies, DU on "Environmental Biotechnology: A Bio Remediation Perspective" was very informative. Dr. Christopher Pierret, Associate Consultant, Researcher Dept. of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, Mayo Clinic, USA conducted workshop and lecture demonstration on Behavioral Studies in Zebrafish model system when he visited Psychology Dept. Under Psychology Resource Centre of College, Positive Psychology Centre headed by Dr. Pooja Anand had organized (1) Faculty Development Program on 'Positive Education: Developing Skills for Teaching, Learning, and Well Being'; (2) Skill Development Program on "Self Positive: Developing Skills for Self Development and Well Being"; and (3) National Paper Presentation Competition on 'Positive Psychology: From what's wrong to what's strong'. College saw a number of eminent visitors such as Prof. Kavita Sharma, Head of Dept. of Commerce, Prof. Raj Kumar, Head, English Dept. Prof. Ravni Thakur from Dept. of East Asian Studies, DU, Prof. Najaf Haider from JNU, Dr. Krishna Kumar JNU, Prof. P.C. Jha, head of Dept. of Operational Research, Prof. Shobha Bagai, CIC, DU, Vidushi Uma Garg, vocalist and an exponent of Kirana Gharana, Prof. Avinash Khare, eminent physicist and researcher, Vice Chancellor Sikkim Central University, Dr. R. Raman from SSPL Lab of Defence Research and Development Organization, Prof. K. Thyagarajan an authority in Quantum Photonics, Mr. Vivek Narayan Joint Secretary, Supreme Court, AOR Association, Dr. Vageswari Deswal from Faculty of Law, Justice Shri Kirti Singh (former judge Supreme Court), Prof. Sudhir Kakar, Prof. Roy Moodley, Prof. Jeggking, Dr. Hitendra Nagpal and many more. Approximately 92 eminent professors, scientist, speakers, jurists, administrators, thinker and politician visited College in different programme during the year.

The College has vibrant societies and cells. They supplement the academic activities and nurture the talented students in their pursuit to excellence. The Cyber Cell, Debating Society, Entrepreneurship Cell, Eco Club-Dhara, Finance & Investment Cell, Gandhi Study Circle, organized a number of activities for the benefit of students. The poetry society organized an annual poetry fest 'Rage-e-Sukhan' in which poets from Hindi, English and Urdu participated. ECA Committee provided a platform to the students of College to exhibit and enhance their talent in the field of Indian and Western Music, Classical and Folk Dance, Drama, Debate. Fine



Arts, and Creative Writing. Annhad and Alahyaa have been bagging prizes all over India. Students celebrated Independence Day and Republic Day with great enthusiasm.

The Placement Cell of College under the guidance of Dr. Indu Jain organized Internship and Career Fair "Incrementum 2.0" for the second consecutive year which saw participation of 42 companies. Nearly 100 students of IIIrd year are already placed during current academic session and many more are being placed now. This is in addition to students placed through Placement Cell of University. The College has undertaken the expansion of its recycling unit which recycles the paper and other organic wastes. The aim of this unit, headed by Dr. Sarita Nanda is to make campus zero waste discharge unit. I also thank Dr. Sarita Nanda who along with her team have filed the AQAR for past two years.

The college has approx. 2000 students enrolled in National Service Scheme(NSS)

The aim of NSS is to work among and with people, to develop a desire to serve the weaker section of the community and to gain skills in democratic leadership. With this objective NSS Centre of Daulat Ram College under the able guidance of Mrs. Sarita Jain organized for its Students Self Defence Workshop, Senior Citizen Day, National Unity Day, Swachta Pakhwada, Blood Donation Drive, Voters Forum Campaign etc. The students rendered their services in Youth for Seva movement, Bharat Uday Abhiyan, Plantation drive. This unit collaborate Student Union and other Societies for its activities.

The National Sports Organization of DRC Wing has been educating youth through sports and physical training. The Sports Board along with Students' Union organised the Fresher's Sports Spark Hunt Week for the first year students on October 3, 2018. Around 500 students participated in different events such as kabbaddi, kho-kho, shot put, 100 metre and 200 metre race, three-legged race, Table-Tennis and a special race for the differently abled students. The Economics Department was recognized as the best performing department. DRC went to international arena by participation of Ms. Nasreen, B.A. (P) IInd year and Ms. Praveen Nisha, BA,(H) Hindi IInd year who represented India in Asian Kho Kho Championship held in London U.K. in September 2018.

The NCC students under the supervision of its caretaker Dr. Suparna Jain participated in Combined Annual Training Camps (CATC-2018), Advanced Learning camp, Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat campaign. Ms. Kajal Tyagi, SUO secured gold medal in CATC 2018, gold medal in excellence in the field of NCC given by Swayam Sidha. JUO Km. Dolly secured silver medal in CATC 2018.

I will fail in my duty if I do not acknowledge the rich contribution made by Dr. Nirmala and Dr. Sunita Joshi in nurturing the Biochemistry Department. The contribution of retired non-teaching staff Sh. R.P. Sharma and retiring Mrs. Jaya Chaudhary cannot be acknowledged simply in words.

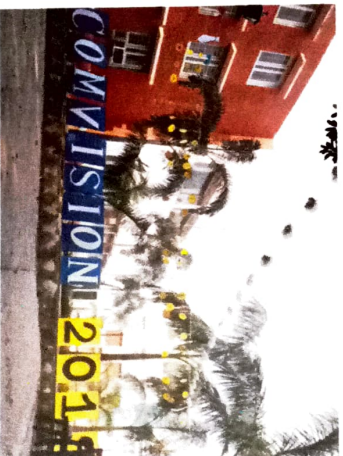

Keeping up the tradition, this year DRC MUN is once again being organised on 6th and 7th April 2019.

Besides this ÉCLAT conducted **Seminars** on a wide range of topics to ensure that students are abreast with the latest events and skills in the field of their interest and to improve their career prospects. Seminars and Workshops were organised in collaboration with **Unique Shiksha and Eminent Strategy** to name a few on diverse topics such as "Cracking Civil Services Exam", "Facing Interviews and Group Discussions", "CAT Quant made easy" etc.

Thus, team ÉCLAT endeavours to take the Department of Economics to newer heights in 2019.

Last but not the least, to foster inter-disciplinary interaction, the Economics and Commerce Associations jointly conducted a two day SPSS Workshop (8-9 June, 2018) and a week long Skill Development Program on SPSS from 18th-24th December 2018. The purpose of the workshop and the SDP was to familiarize students with an econometric package and to foster an environment of research among our students.



## English Department

The Department of English believes in an interdisciplinary pedagogical approach and encourages the students to engage with literary texts in the form of performances, readings, film screenings and talks. To facilitate this, the department hosts the Study Circle activities which take place in the Activity Period on Wednesdays and is one of the most eagerly awaited events of the week. In the Study Circle, students and teachers regularly engage in interactive sessions with experts in the field.

In January 2018, a lecture was delivered on "Introduction to Renaissance Literature" followed by a presentation on the graphic anthology "This Side That Side", which discussed the Partition, through visual narratives. On 13<sup>th</sup> March, 2018, A.P. Payal – Assistant Professor at Kamla Nehru College – delivered a talk titled "Utterly Butterly Indian" – wherein she discussed the figure of the Amul Butter girl as a chronicler of the life and times of the nation. The sessions were enthusiastically attended not only by the English honours students but also BA Programme students.

On 30<sup>th</sup> January 2018, as a pioneering effort, the department organized an Orientation Programme for the MA students, who attend tutorial sessions every Wednesday in the college. The MA students appreciated the programme as it allowed them to interact with the entire department. In the Orientation, they were informed about the Internal Assessment procedures, the assignments and the presentations.

Faculty members often accompany groups of interested students to literary events in and around the city. On 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2018, students were taken to Hansraj College for a Seminar on the Partition. On 4<sup>th</sup> February 2018, students were taken to a Shakespeare performance contest organised in IP College, by the Shakespeare Society of India and on 15<sup>th</sup> February 2018, students were taken to watch *Macbeth* at NSD. On 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> February, 2018, faculty members accompanied students to the India Habitat Centre for two talks – one by Gayatri Chakravarty Spivak on translation and another by Ngugi wa Thiong'o, the Kenyan writer, on his latest book *Secure the Base*.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> April, 2018, at the Farewell function for the outgoing batch of students the Department of English released the first ever digital version of its annual magazine *Expressions*. The magazine also included, for the first time, photographs and contributions by MA students.





On 21<sup>st</sup> August, 2018, the new Students Union of The English Literary Society: *Literati* was elected with Dimple Madaan as President, Prachi Mishra as Vice President, Rushali Lekhi as Cultural Secretary and Aastha Saini as Joint Secretary.

At the beginning of the July-November 2018 Semester, the Department of English, under IQAC, organised an Orientation Workshop on “Academic Reading and Writing”, from 23<sup>rd</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> July. The workshop aimed at explaining to First year English Honours students the need for clear and coherent expression of ideas and thoughts. It introduced the students to the conventions of Academic Writing, familiarising them with its nuances and codes such as paraphrasing, summarising, citing sources, avoiding plagiarism etc. Dr. Anjana Neira Dev, Associate Professor, Department of English, Gargi College conducted the inaugural session of the workshop.



Under IQAC, the Department also organised a ten-day Lecture Series on the “History of English

Literature” from 20<sup>th</sup> August to 30<sup>th</sup> August, 2018, to introduce the First, Second and Third year students to the literary, cultural, historical and social backgrounds of the papers they are going to study in the three years. The event began with a lecture on “Dalit Literature” by Prof. Raj Kumar, presently Head of the English Department, University of Delhi. The other invited Guests were Dr. Rudrashish Chakraborty who discussed the “Renaissance”, Dr. Tapan Basu, who enlightened the students on the background of the “American Literature” and Prof. GJV Prasad, who discussed the “History of Indian English Literature”. Topics such as “Neo classical Literature”, “Romantic Literature”, “Victorian Literature”, “Modernism”, “Post-modernism” as well as “Indian and European Classical Literatures” were covered by the teachers from the English Department of Daulat Ram College.

As part of the Study Circle Activities of the Department, there were talks by Guest speakers on topics such as Black Feminism, Visual Culture and screenings of the cinematic versions of the texts which students study as part of their syllabus, such as “The Color Purple”.

On 5<sup>th</sup> September, 2018, the Freshers’ Welcome was enthusiastically organised by the Second and Third year students as well as the faculty members. The theme for this year’s Freshers celebration was: “Aspirations” and coincided with the celebration of Teacher’s Day.

In addition to the above-mentioned activities, our students have also been participating in events across the University in order to enrich their academic skills and interact with other students. In this regard, Vatsala Singh, a Second year English honours student participated in the Oceanvale Workshop organised by Kirorimal College from 24<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> September, 2018. She presented a paper titled “John Milton’s Paradise Lost: Narrative Unconscious through an Absent Presence”. Urvashi Negi, a Third year student of English honours, participated in the Skill Development Programme organised by the Department of Psychology,





Daulat Ram College in the first week of June, 2018. The seven day workshop aimed at providing a brief insight into the introductory concepts of Positive Psychology following which students were required to team up with a faculty member and work on a research paper over a period of five months. The workshop concluded with a National Paper Presentation on 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2018. Urvashi presented a paper titled "Positive Psychology and Charles Dickens" and Vatsala Singh, a Second year student presented a paper titled- "Psychology of Popular Media Culture: a Positive Approach to Adolescent Suicidal Behaviour".

Tonmoyee Doley, a Third year student, presented a paper titled: "Leke Doying: The Origin and the Lifestyle of the Mishing Tribe of Arunachal Pradesh and Assam through the Oral Literature Tradition", at the International Conference on North East India: Exploring Philosophy, Culture and Environmental Sustainability held in our College on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> of January, 2019.

Our students also attended a seminar titled "On the Contemporary: The Lessons of Modernism" organised by the Department of English of SGTB Khalsa College on 31<sup>st</sup> October, 2018.

The department is proud of the academic achievements of our students who are position holders in Delhi University: Tripti Aggarwal (First in semester III and IV combined), Dimple Madaan (Second in semester III and IV combined). We also have a position holder in North Campus: Vatsala Singh (Third in semester I and II combined)

Another highlight of this year has been the exceptional achievement of our student Diskit Chongxom Angmo in the field of Women's Ice Hockey. Participating in various National and International level Championships, she received The First Ladies Award from the President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind in January 2018. In February 2018, at the occasion of the College Day, she was awarded a "Special Prize" for her outstanding achievement and we are thankful to the college for instituting this award as recognition of her achievements.

## History Association – Perspective

The Department of History organises various academic and co-curricular events every academic year as part of our continuous effort to provide students with alternative spaces for learning, and for close interactions with historians who excel in various fields. During this academic year, History Association organised several events. The first event was a panel discussion on 11<sup>th</sup> September, 2018, and the theme of the panel discussion was, '*India and the World: A Historical Perspectives*'. The panel consisted of four well-known historians, who spoke on different aspects of historical connections between India and the world, and how these connections shaped our history. Dr. Anirudh Deshpande, Associate Professor (Department of History, University of Delhi) chaired the panel discussion, and he opened the proceedings by speaking about the role of Indian trade, and its significant contribution in the rise of the modern world. The first speaker was Dr. Parul Pandya Dhar, a well-known Art historian (Department of History, University of Delhi). Her presentation looked at historical connections between South Asia and South-east Asia since the ancient period, and the 'flow' of itinerant people, texts, objects, religions and ideas between these two regions. She used visual images such as paintings and sculptures, as her sources during the presentation.

Dr. Anshu Malhotra, Associate Professor (Department of History, University of Delhi) spoke on women and religion, and practices of religiosity such as fasting and chastity which are shared by women and religions throughout the world. The last speaker was Dr. Ravni Thakur, Associate Professor (Department of East Asian Studies, University of Delhi), and she spoke on the historical connections between Indian and Chinese civilizations. According to her, Buddhism was the most important historical connection between the two civilisations.

The Department organised its annual festival 'Perspective' on 12<sup>th</sup> October, 2018, and the theme of the festival was '*Mughal Court Culture*'. Prof. Najaf Haider from Jawaharlal Nehru University was the key note speaker, and he delivered a lecture titled, '*The Lives of Two Mughal Clerks: Govardhan Suraj Dwaj and Balkrishna Brahman*'. He spoke about the role of clerical and scribal class in the administration of the Mughal state. During the festival, the department also organised many inter-college competitions such as paper presentation, online photography, quiz, just a minute and slam poetry.

The department, as a part of its holistic approach to teaching organised an academic excursion to the National Museum, New Delhi on 15<sup>th</sup> November, 2018. Around 100 students from History Honours and BA







Programme (History) participated in the trip. Students were exposed to archaeological artefacts, sculptures, paintings and numismatics from various historical periods from South Asia and beyond.

The department's students also participated a workshop organised by INTACH, a premier body that is dedicated to conserve and promote heritage, organised a College Heritage Volunteer Workshop held on 18 January 2019. Dr. Smarika Nawani and six students( Nikita Kumari and Nikita Singh from III year; Rishika Raj and Upasana from II year; Anjali from Iyear of BA(Hons) History course and Sanskriti Jha from B.A. (Prog)-I year were part of the group)had an enriching session during the workshop.

On 13<sup>th</sup> February 2019, the department organised an ambitious symposium on the theme '*Subaltern Studies and Beyond*' with a large participation. The event was organised in three sessions with speakers from various academic background. The first session was chaired by Dr. Brinda Bose (Jawaharlal Nehru University). Dr. Charu Gupta (University of Delhi) presented a paper titled, '*Subaltern Sexualities and Vernacular Archives*', and Dr. Ravikant (CSDS) delivered a visual presentation titled '*Caste on Hindi Silver Screen*'. The second session was chaired by Dr. Prabhu P. Mohapatra (University of Delhi). The first panellist, Prof. Raj Kumar (University of Delhi) presented a paper titled, '*Towards an understanding of Dalit Historiography*'. The second speaker, Dr. Khalid Anis Ansari (Glocal University) presented a paper titled, '*The post-minority Condition: Reflections on the Pasmanda Muslim Discourse*'. The final speaker of the session Dr. Vasudha Pande (Lady Shri Ram College for Women) presented a lecture on '*Jangal Satyagrahas in Kumaun: Between Incendiarism and Nationalism*'.

The final session of the event was chaired by Dr. Rohit Wanchoo (St. Stephen's College). Jibran Anand (Research Scholar, University of Delhi) presented a paper, '*Beyond Subaltern History Writing: India and ILO*'. The second speaker Sayar Singh Chopra (Research Scholar, University of Delhi) presented a paper titled '*Representation of Subaltern Voices in Tribal Literature: A study of Few Selected Contemporary Tribal Fiction*'. The final speaker of the event, Dr. Shilpi Rajpal (Jamia Millia Islamia) presented a paper titled, '*Case Notes: Medical History from Below in Colonial North India*'.

Following past tradition, our department continues to organise Book Barter during various department and college event throughout the academic year. Similarly the department will publish its annual newsletter '*Al-Maazi*' to encourage students to write research papers, reports and other creative writings.

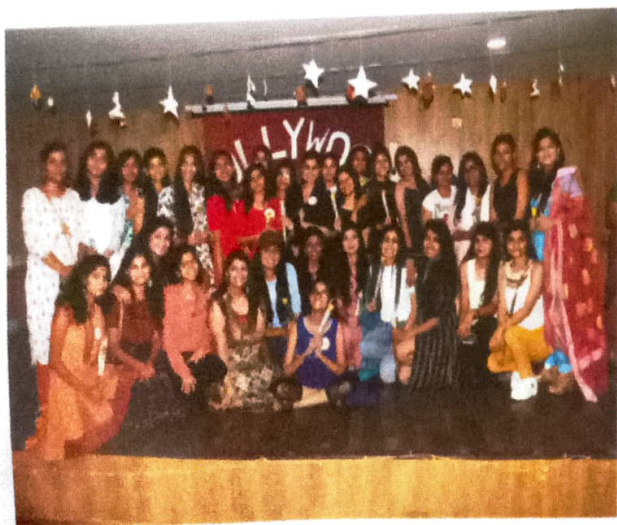

Superconductors using liquid Nitrogen or liquid Helium at extremely low temperatures, Raman spectroscopy, Mobile radiations, National standards of mass & length, Cesium atomic clock etc. Overall the visit was very valuable and a good learning experience for all

Physics Department had organized a seminar under IQAC on "Application of Optoelectronic Devices in Day to Day Life" on October 5, 2018. This seminar was organized with a theme to give the students an opportunity to broaden the horizons of their mind by introducing them to fundamental physics involved in making an optoelectronic device. It also provided the details of few applications of optoelectronic devices in daily life. Students were also informed about the latest research going on in the area of optoelectronics for the development of fast and reliable devices. The event was organized under the supervision of Dr. Savita Roy as Convenor, Dr. Onkar Mangla as Co-Convenor and Dr. Pooja Jain as IQAC Observer. The seminar started with welcome note by Dr. Savita Roy, Principal, Daulat Ram College. She also introduced the speakers to the audience. Dr. R. Raman, Scientist, Solid State Physical Laboratory (SSPL), Delhi presented the opening lecture entitled "Material Characterization", wherein he give a broad overview of the different material characterization technique with emphasis on the Raman spectroscopy. Prof. K. Thyagarajan, Department of Physics, School of Engineering and Applied Sciences, Bennett University, (Greater Noida,) delivered the next lecture entitled "Quantum Photonics", wherein he provides a detailed study of quantum phenomena related to the photonic devices. The students of B.Sc. (H) Physics I and II years were the participants in this seminar. The seminar was attended by about 69 participants (63 students and 6 faculty members). On the basis of the feedback obtained from the students, the seminar was found to be quite beneficial giving an insight of the present and future applications of optoelectronic devices.

Keeping the above quotes as the motivation, COHERENCE, the Physics Association organized a competition on "Best Out of Waste" on October 10, 2018. The competition was a platform for the students to showcase their talent in up-cycling the waste materials for making the usable items.

Physics Department was also a part of the DST INSPIRE Science Camp organized by Daulat Ram College from December 17-21, 2018. In this camp experiments based on optical phenomena and Digital Electronics had been demonstrated by the teachers to the students of various schools participated. The students were also given hands-on experience to perform these experiments and to understand the basic physical principles acting behind these experiments.

Physics Department organized In-house Skill Development Program under IQAC on "Basic Electronics Skill and Applications" from December 24-31, 2018. This Program provided an opportunity to explore electronic components, a hands-on training for fabricating PCBs leading to assembly of electronic circuits and mini-instruments used in day to day life. Dr. Omwati Rana was the Convener of the program and Dr. Sunita Gupta was the IQAC Observer. The students of B.Sc. (H) Physics I and II year were the participants. The number of participants registered for the program were 20. On the basis of the feedback, the program was found to be a very good platform providing an enlightening exposure to the various aspects of the electronics devices.

The Department visited the 23<sup>rd</sup> edition of International Engineering and Technology Fair IETF 2019 at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi on February 4, 2019. 37 students along with 2 faculty members. (Dr. Onkar Mangla and Dr. Tarun Choudhari) visited it. Organized by Confederation of Indian Industry (CII), it showcased specific industry sectors like –Environment and Pollution control, Robot and Factory



automation, Artificial Intelligence, Gaming technologies etc. The students participated with enthusiasm and learned about various upcoming technologies.

*Coherence* organized its technical fest *Celeste* on February 7, 2019, hosting a plethora of events tending to the technical tastes of one and all. The day began with the Inaugural Ceremony presided over by Principal Madam Dr. Savita Roy; followed by various competitions namely Vision: where the participants presented their papers on scientific topics, Extempore, Uptown Funk (Pop quiz), Pinnacle (circuit design competition), and Accio Horcrux (treasure hunt). It turned out to be one of the main attractions of the fest drawing a large number of students. Students from various colleges took part. The whole day was filled with learning and fun.

## Psychology Association

The Psychology Association of Daulat Ram College is a platform for students and faculty to come together and give shape to theoretical and practical insights learnt academically, into relevant social and contemporary realities. The field of Psychology is placed in a tumultuous time with rapid change occurring in the very fabric of our societies and our environment, giving rise to resultant psycho-social structures which are very different from traditional conceptualisations. The Association has at its forefront the imperative demand of making young psychologists aware and sensitive to these changes and dialectics.



The activities through the year have been garnered to seeking out and exposing the students to the best from Industry, Practitioners and Academics across the world. Along with internal calendar event activities like the Fresher's welcome and Farewell to departing batch, the year has been witness to two major Conferences, Competitions, Workshops talks and some very environment friendly practices.

The year 2018, saw the first National Conference on Psychology being organised in the Department of Psychology by Dr. Preeti Kapur (Convenor) and Dr Pooja Anand (Organising Secretary) on **Psychology Applications and Interventions: 'Reaching Out and Making a Difference'** from 18-19 January, 2018. A two-day event, it consisted of panel discussions, parallel paper presentation sessions, poster presentations and workshops by industry stalwarts like Dr. Seema Gupta, IMT Ghaziabad, Children First Team, "depression" and "art-based therapy". Research papers by students as well as teachers were presented and later selected papers were published in the form of a Book entitled "**Applications of Psychology: Reaching Out and Making a Difference**" authored by Dr. Preeti Kapur and Dr. Pooja Anand.

On 25 January, 2018 Prof. Dana Gross, Professor of Psychology, Associate Dean of Interdisciplinary and General studies, St Olaf College, Minnesota, USA along with her students visited the department and gave an enriching presentation on "**High-Impact Practices in the Undergraduate Liberal Arts Context**". The presentation was followed by an interactive session between the students and series of workshops.

31 January, 2018 witnessed the end of an epoch with the retirement of **Dr. Renu Kishore** who served the College and Department of Psychology in particular with her vivacious presence in her many roles. The farewell was a warm well attended ceremony which saw alumni come in from various places in Delhi to bid her adieu. An especial mentor, a friend and colleague to many, the ceremony in the Department was warm, fun filled, with activities specially made for her. The warmth and memories she shared were captured and shall be forever an ideal for others to follow. Dr Kishore presented the Department with a list of Permanent teachers since inception which is proudly displayed in the Department and stays a marker of memories inscribed.

Two workshops, one on '**Career Prospect and Opportunities abroad**' (21 February 2018) as well as on '**Are humans inherently evil**' by Ms Alex Snee, Webster University, USA (19 March 2018) were organised in the Department, facets which resonate with the young student population. The farewell to outgoing batch of 2018 was witness to environment friendly practices of no plastic usage which saw students bring their own cutlery.





The next academic year of July 2018-19 began with a ritual of welcome, with the Association holding its Fresher's Party on 28<sup>th</sup> August 2018, based on the theme 'retro'. Going back to the past to welcome the future helped initiate the new entrants into the ethos of the Department. An investiture ceremony was conducted to present the elected representatives with Badges of the Association. The talk was much appreciated for its hands-on, realistic insight into the nature of clinical problems and tools available.

The Department also witnessed the first of its kind of International Conference on ***"Integrating Traditional Indian Healing Practices with Contemporary Western Health Systems"*** was organised in the Department on Jan. 8-9 2019, by Convenor, Dr Meetu Khosla and Co-Convenor, Dr. Rajni Sahni. Sponsored by the ICSSR, the Conference was an amalgamation of the best practitioners, academicians and researchers from across the globe as well as participants from the length and breadth of the country. Attended and Chaired by stalwarts in the field of healing across the Globe and India like Prof Sudhir Kakar, Prof Roy Moodley, Prof Valery Chirkov, Prof Jeff King, Prof. Meena Sehgal, Dr. Jitendra Mohan, Dr. Jitendra Nagpal, Prof. SPK Jena and others from across India, the Conference acknowledged the presence of multiple healing systems which need to work in tandem to create convergence, if psychology needs to provide an answer to the many ills of mind and body in contemporary society.

In deliberations spanning two days, sessions presented traditional indigenous practices from Japan, native American healing systems, to Samoan immigrants in Australia; the length and breadth of integrating western treatments with ethnomedicines and traditional practices were discussed by students, researchers and practitioners sharing findings and challenges. The Conference saw participation by delegates across allied fields of not just psychology but also philosophy, sciences and the applied disciplines. Students, research scholars, practitioners & teaching faculty from various colleges of Delhi and other universities such as Amity University, Ambedkar University, JNU, BHU, NIMHANS, IIT-Delhi, Tata Institute of Behavioral Sciences, Mumbai, Christ university; International universities such as University of Washington, USA, University of Toronto, Canada, University of Sydney, Australia, University of Saskatchewan, Canada, Trinity College, John Hopkins University were represented in the two day event.

Keeping with the need for interface with sectors beyond corporate and academic, The Association organised a talk by Teach for India, one of the global forerunners in the developmental sector. Ms. Devangana Misra, Head Recruiter, Teach for India addressed the student body on ***Identifying and Dealing with Intellectual***



*Disabilities in Educational Institutions* A recipient of the prestigious Elise Todd Klausen Scholarship Columbia University alumnus Ms. Misra had worked in the area of Autism in Hong Kong before joining Teach for India. She shared her perspectives and experiences of learning in India and educational realities of such children in low economic backgrounds on the 16<sup>th</sup> of January 2019.

A talk was organised on 18<sup>th</sup> January 2019 where the invited speaker, Prof. Valery Chirkov, Professor of Psychology at the University of Saskatchewan, Canada, who studies culture, its relation with human motivation, well-being, philosophy and the methodology of socio-cultural research and has published two books on *Fundamentals of research on culture and psychology: Theory and methods* (2016, New York: Routledge) addressed the students about educational opportunities in Canada.

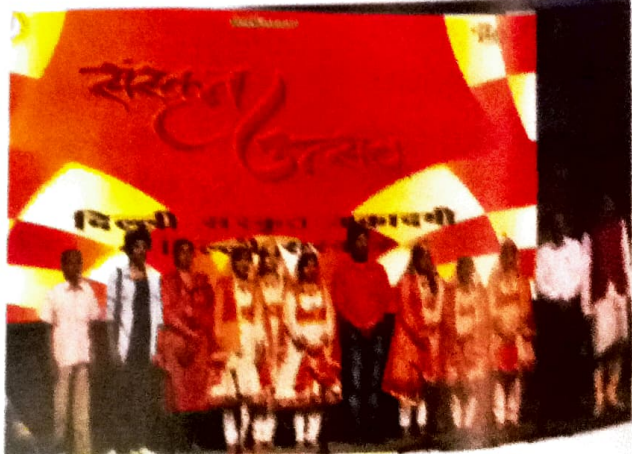

## Zoological Society – Koshika

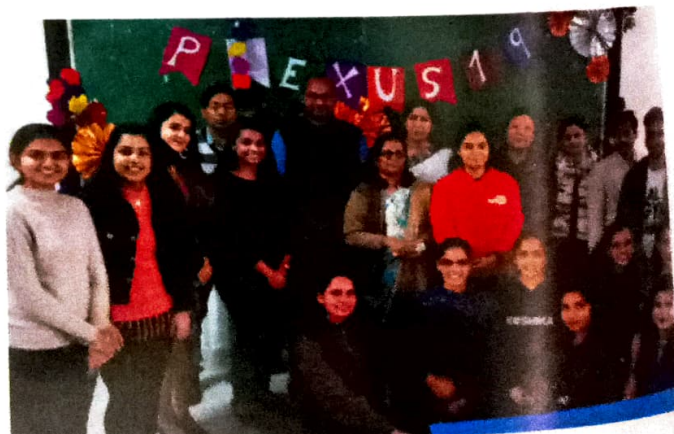

Under IQAC, we successfully organised a week-long Skill Development Program relating to "Cyber Crime, Law & Security", from 1st to 7th June 2018. The program began on a promising note with the honoured presence of Dr. Uma Shankar Pandey (OSD, School of Open Learning, University of Delhi), who after lighting the lamp and inaugurating the SDP, gave a mind-boggling presentation on Internet of Things. It was an eye-opening session which alerted us to the possibilities of inter-connectivity in future. Next event was introduced by Ms. Saneya who gave a contextual introductory lecture to the screening of the multi award-winning documentary "Zero Days" about the virus Stunext and the loopholes in cyber security.

Day two began with an informative lecture on Cyber Crimes by Ms. Raman Arora and Ms. Vani Kanojia. An invigorating workshop on Social Media was conducted on the third day by Ms. Chitsimran, Executive Engineer in TATA Power -DDL. Next up was a presentation by the distinguished faculty members Dr. Santosh Sain, Dr. Kusum Lata and Dr. Kamna Vimal on "Social Media: Possibilities and Challenges". Convenor, Cyber Cell, Ms. Sushma Arora gave an engaging overview of Cyber laws as contained under Information Technology Act, 2000, which was succeeded by an even more interesting session on Cryptography. The sessions were complemented by a Q&A round at the end in which the students sought further clarifications on the topic of their choice. On the penultimate day of the program, Ms. Vasudha Thirani, Senior Policy Associate at Digital India Foundation gave a presentation on "Blockchain Technology" which was well attended by the students.





The Cyber Cell, Daulat Ram College organized a workshop in association with the Ministry of Communication and Information Technology on 31st August, 2018 to enlighten the students about the well known Digital India Campaign, one of the noblest initiatives of the Government of India.

The honorable Principal, Dr. Savita Roy inaugurated the event by lighting the lamp along with the chief guest and the convenor. The event was graced by some eminent dignitaries who are a part of the Digital India Campaign. The chief guest was Dr. Dinesh Kumar Tyagi, CEO, CSC E-Governance Service India Limited. He explained to the students the crux of the Digital India Campaign and how it goes beyond internet and networking to help the citizens of the country by developing techniques that can make their lives easier.

The guest of honor, Ms. Bhagwati Jamnal, Manager Education, gave the students the opportunity to watch an informative documentary which centered on the positive effects of the Digital India Campaign in rural India. She also explained the significance of Common Service Centers (CSC) and their benefits to the rural population, especially rural women.

Cyber Cell, in association with UNIQUE SHIKSHA organised a seminar for UPSC aspirants on 5th Sept. 2018. The event was graced by an enthusiastic audience composed of inquisitive students and teachers. The seminar was addressed by Mr. Amrit Singh Chopra, Director and Pedagogy Expert, who shared his valuable tips and experience with the students, breaking the myths surrounding the UPSC exams and helping them understand the employment and career opportunities provided by the government.

On 26th September 2018, The Cyber Cell, Daulat Ram College organized a workshop on "Identification of Fake News on the Internet". The workshop was headed by Mrs. Parul Jain, an alumna, Daulat Ram College and a Freelance Journalist and Media Educator.

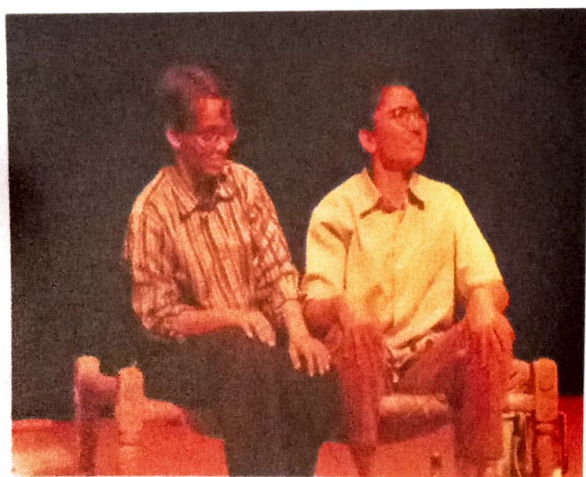
## Memesis – The Theatre Society

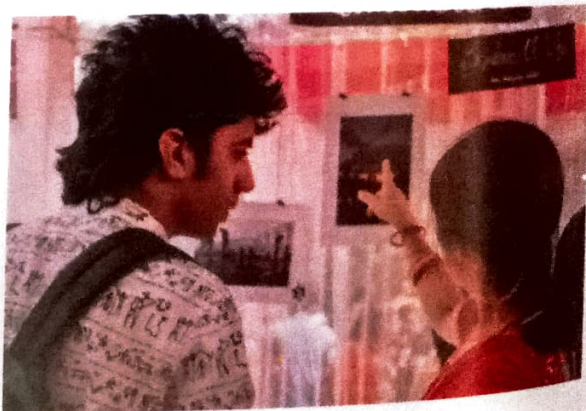

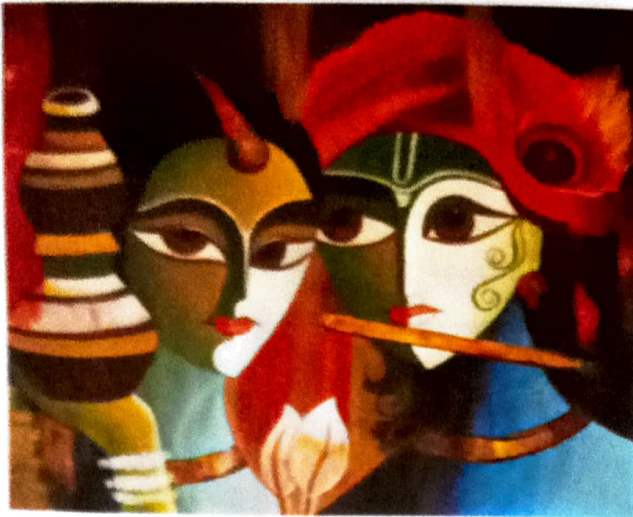

## Recycling Unit

Daulat Ram College aims to become zero discharge campus. Thus it has set up a recycling unit on campus which houses a paper recycling machine and leaves shredder machine. The functioning of recycling unit is improving day by day with manufacture of tons of manure which is used in house or sold outside, preparation ceramic pots with medicinal/antipollution plants, making of white and brown recycled paper (use of these papers is for painting). Ceramic pots and paintings are being used as gifts for our guests in the college. Students can do their internship here and can earn NSS hours by participating in its functioning. Ever since its inception in 2016 this unit has been used to process 25 tons of shredded leaves into manure, recycle 60Kg of paper and cartons, Sold 700 potted plants, 58 folders have been made from recycled paper and 30 Paintings. To deal with these challenges and create an identity for themselves individuals must be equipped with certain crucial skills. Keeping this in mind and in line with the "Skill India" initiative, Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi has been organizing many in-house skill development programs for its students since 2015. The College successfully organized three programs in Summer, 2018 and four programs in Winter, 2018. All these courses were of one week duration.

## SUMMER BREAK 2018

1. **Self-Positive: Developing Skills for Self-Development & Well-Being** Organized by Positive Psychology Center (under Psychology Resource Centre, Under IQAC)

**Course Coordinator: Dr. Pooja V. Anand Duration: 1<sup>st</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> June, 2018**

**Number of participants:** 30 from various departments of the College

**Objectives of the Skill Development Program:** The objectives of the program were to: Equip the students with various key strengths and skills to effectively deal with life challenges; Empower the students through skill training so as to develop in them the competency to mentor their peers; Develop key skills for experiencing a meaningful and flourishing life; Empower students to not only be responsible about their happiness and well-being but also the happiness and well-being of others.





The program consisted of sessions on developing strengths for happiness and well-being, being emotionally intelligent, mentoring, effective communication for positive relationships and personal growth and development. Resource persons were Dr. Pooja V. Anand, Dr. PreetiKapur, DrKshitiWason and Dr. SudhaShashwati. All sessions were conducted in workshop style rather than lectures to provide hands-on training to the participants related to all aspects of developing a positive self. Two modes of assessment were employed. These participants got the opportunity to present this work at the National Paper Presentation Competition which was organized by the Positive Psychology Center on 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2018.

**2. CYBER CRIME, LAW & SECURITY, Organized by CYBER CELL, DRC June 1-7, 2018, (Under IQAC)**

**No of Participants :** 25

**Objectives:** (1) To provide an understanding towards the cybercrimes and to familiarize the participants with the application of cyber laws in general. (2) To impart the knowhow of virtual world and its root level working and also the tips to maintain privacy on Social Media. The program began on a promising note with the honoured presence of Dr. Uma Shankar Pandey (OSD at Campus of Open Learning, University of Delhi), who after lighting the lamp and inaugurating the SDP, gave a mind-boggling presentation on **Internet of Things**. The students were next shown screening of the multi award-winning documentary "Zero Days" about the virus Stunext and the loopholes in cyber security.

Day two began with an informative lecture on Cyber Crimes by Ms. Raman Arora and Ms. Vani Kanojia. It was followed by a session on E-Wallet. organized by Department of Chemistry, Daulat Ram College

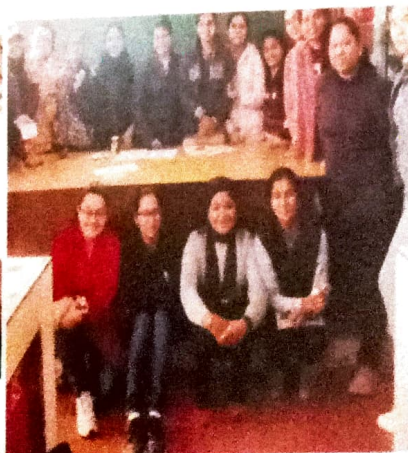

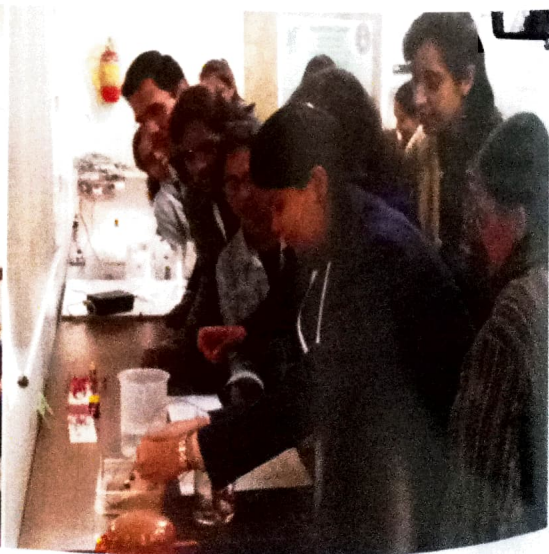

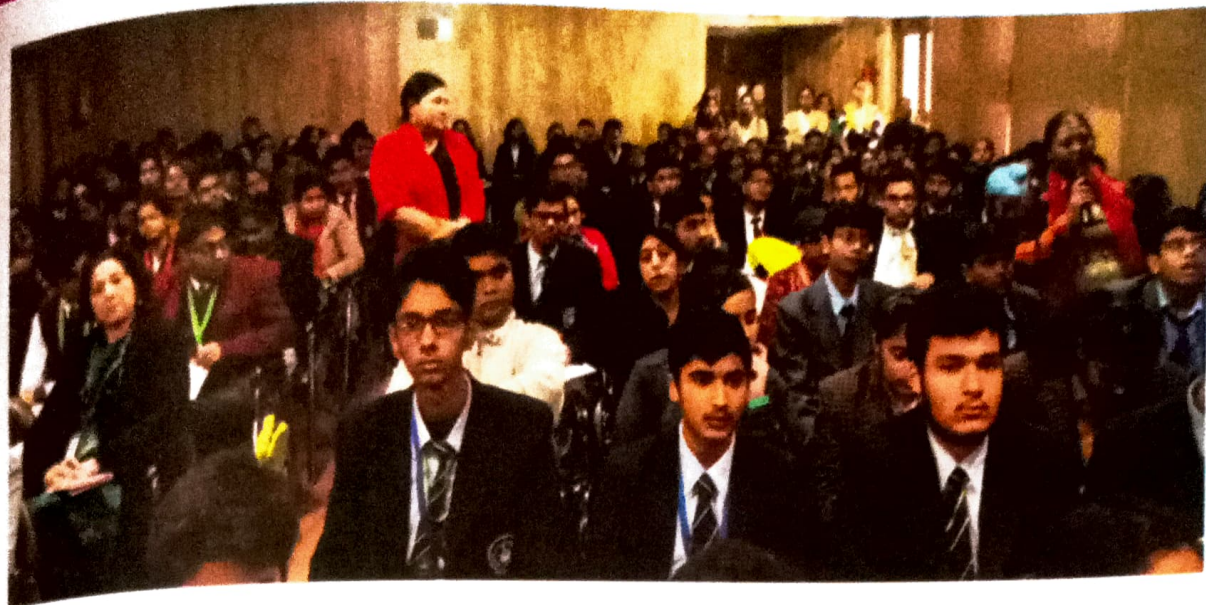
## DST INSPIRE SCIENCE CAMP 2018

The camp was organized with the aim to expose the young minds to the exciting world of science and technology and stimulate the spirit of curiosity, learning and innovation. Around 150 students from various schools of Delhi NCR region actively participated in the camp.

The five day INSPIRE camp included lecture cum interaction sessions of Eminent Scientists who took students on an exciting journey of topics as varied as Einstein theory, Cell biology, proteomics, genomics, astronomy, Scientific discoveries, green chemistry and Sudoku Puzzles. Eminent Scientists included ex-Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi, Prof. Deepak Pental, Bhatnagar laureates Prof. Ajoy Ghatak, and







Prof. Akhilesh Tyagi, Ex- Director National Institute of Immunology, Delhi Prof. Chandrima Shaha, and senior Professors from departments of Chemistry, Biochemistry, Physics & Astrophysics, Mathematics and Zoology. The Positive Psychology Center was established with the aim of developing the strengths of the students and teachers of the college as well as to enhance their happiness and well-being. With this aim the Center regularly organizes various activities. For this session (2108-2019), the Center aimed to carry out the activities in the form of a longitudinal framework. This framework was conceptualized as a three-step framework. In the first stage teachers from various departments were trained through a one week faculty development program on positive education. **Aim and Objectives of the Faculty Development Program**

In the 21<sup>st</sup> century the buzz word is 'skill development'! How are we to achieve this goal in any educational setting? 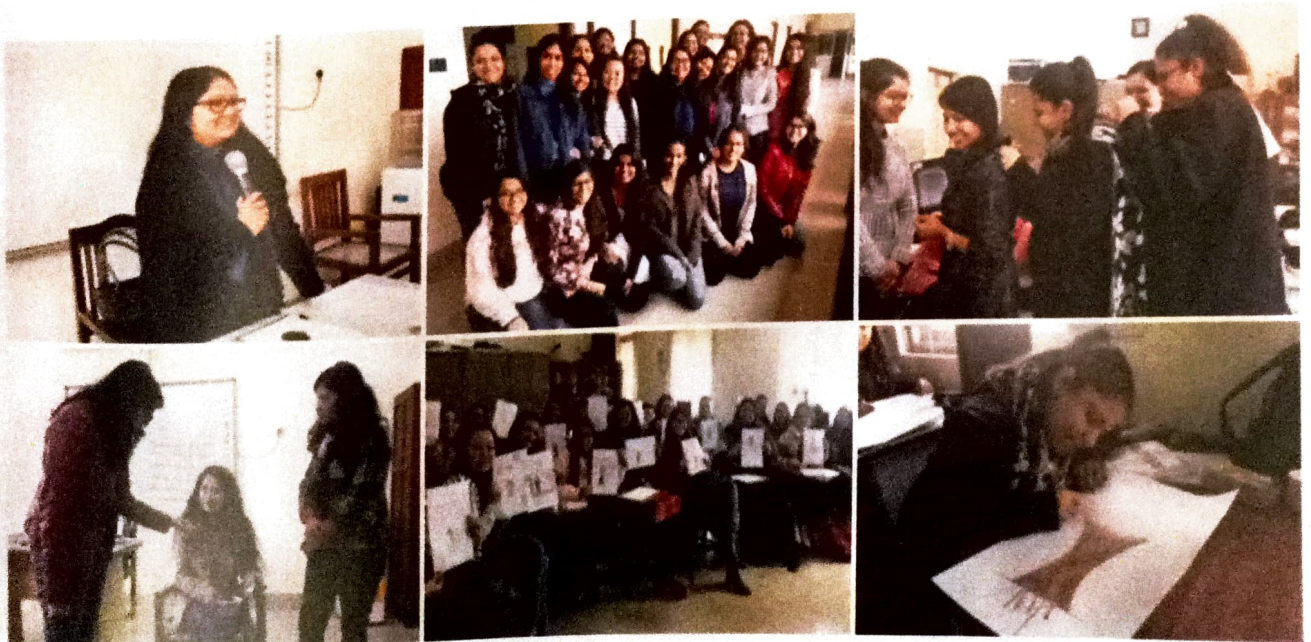

# ZEBRAFISH LAB FACILITY

(UNDER PSYCHOLOGY RESOURCE CENTRE, UNDER IQAC)

The zebrafish lab facility in Daulat Ram College was set up in October 2015, jointly by Biochemistry and Zoology Departments in collaboration with CSIR-IGIB, Mathura Road, Delhi, and Sansriti Foundation Delhi. The facility has been funded by Star Innovation projects DU, Star College project DBT, Government of India, and Innovation projects DU. It was developed with the aim of providing an alternative *in vivo* non-invasive model system for science education, teaching and research.

Students of Biochemistry (Hons.), Zoology (Hons.) and Life Sciences join the lab as interns and work on research projects during their free time and holidays. This opportunity provides students with experiences wherein they can explore and discover the nature and process of scientific research using zebrafish model system.

Zebrafish lab facility organized a Summer internship program from 1<sup>st</sup> -30<sup>th</sup> June for Bachelors and Masters students of other Colleges and Science departments of the University. A total of 13 science students from different Colleges of Delhi University and two Masters students of Zoology Department, University of Delhi attended the internship program. In addition, 10 Zoology (Hons) students of Hindu College attended a one-week workshop on 'Zebrafish as a Model System' from 4<sup>th</sup> -9<sup>th</sup> July, 2018.

Zebrafish lab facility also serves as a resource center to provide zebrafish and embryos to other colleges departments and research institutes to support teaching and lab practicals.

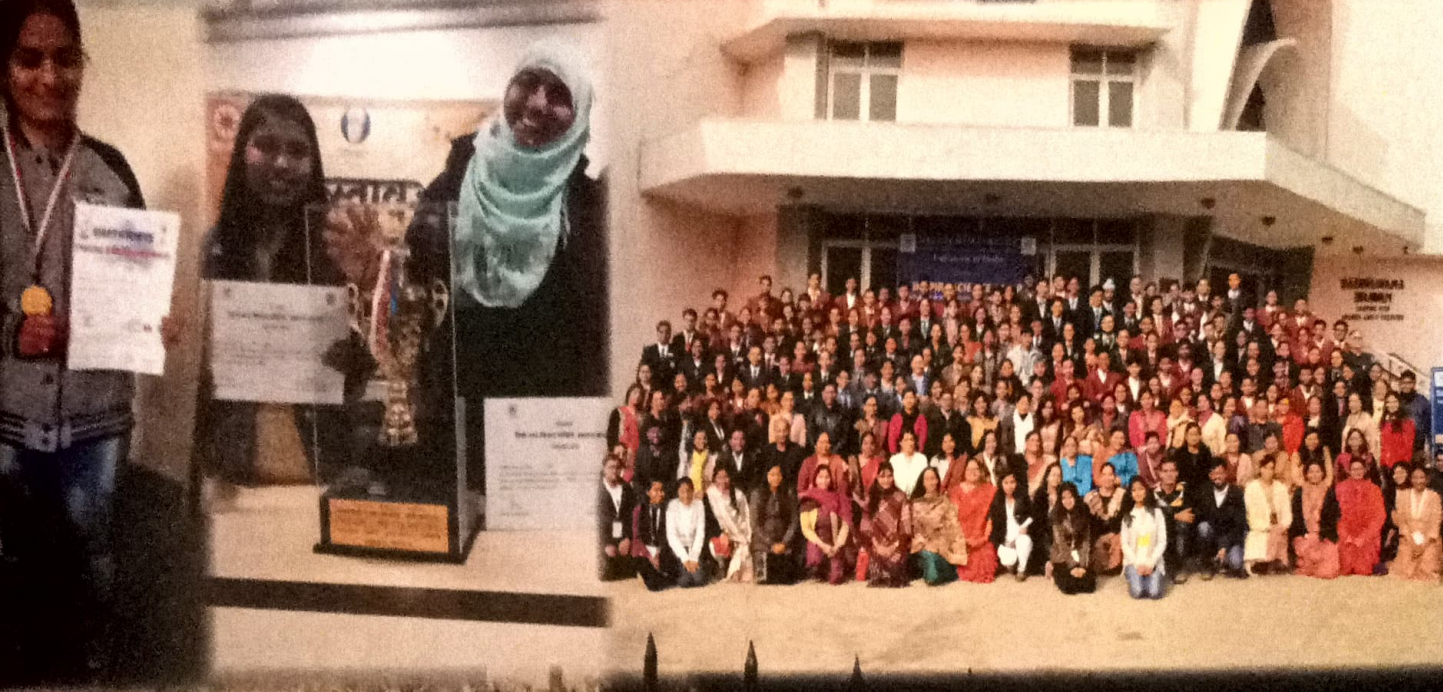
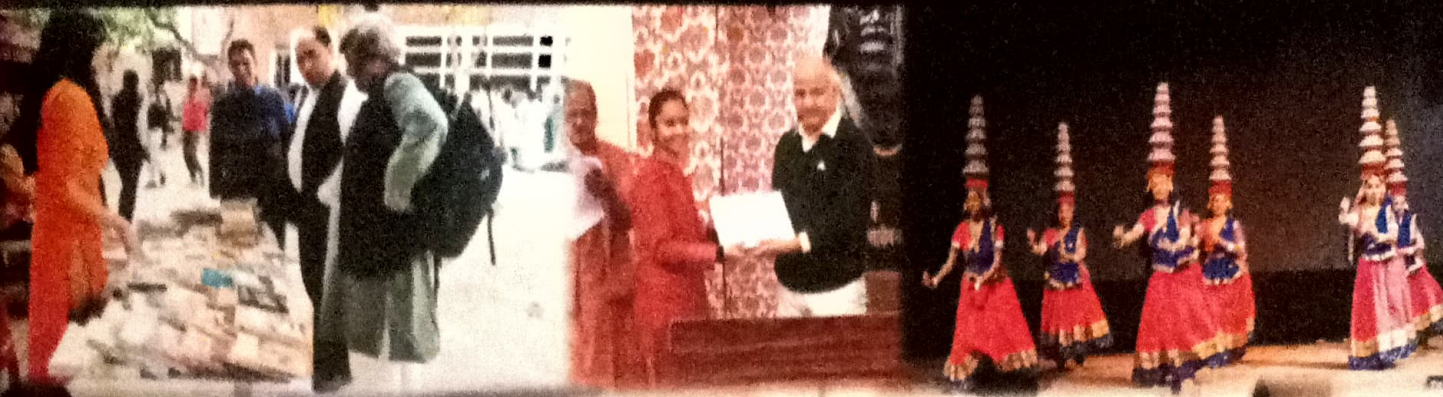

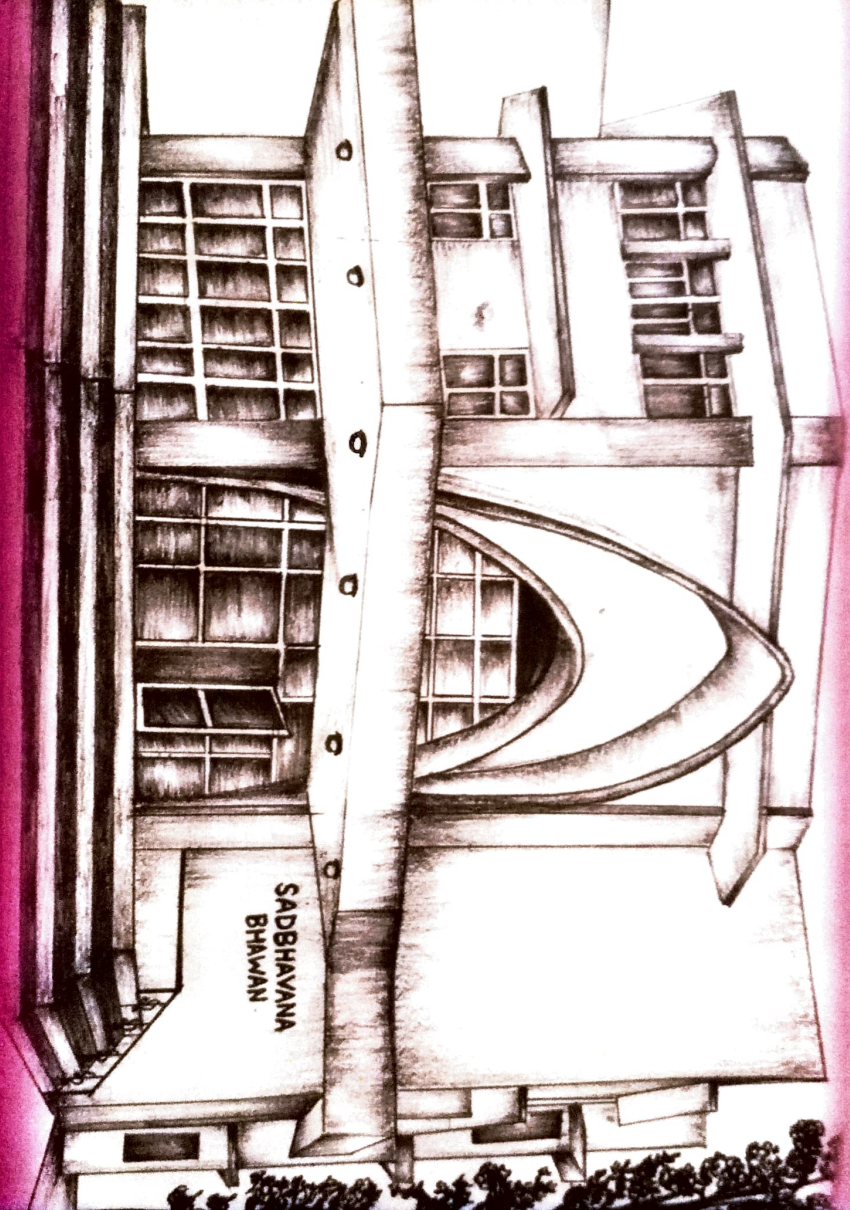
