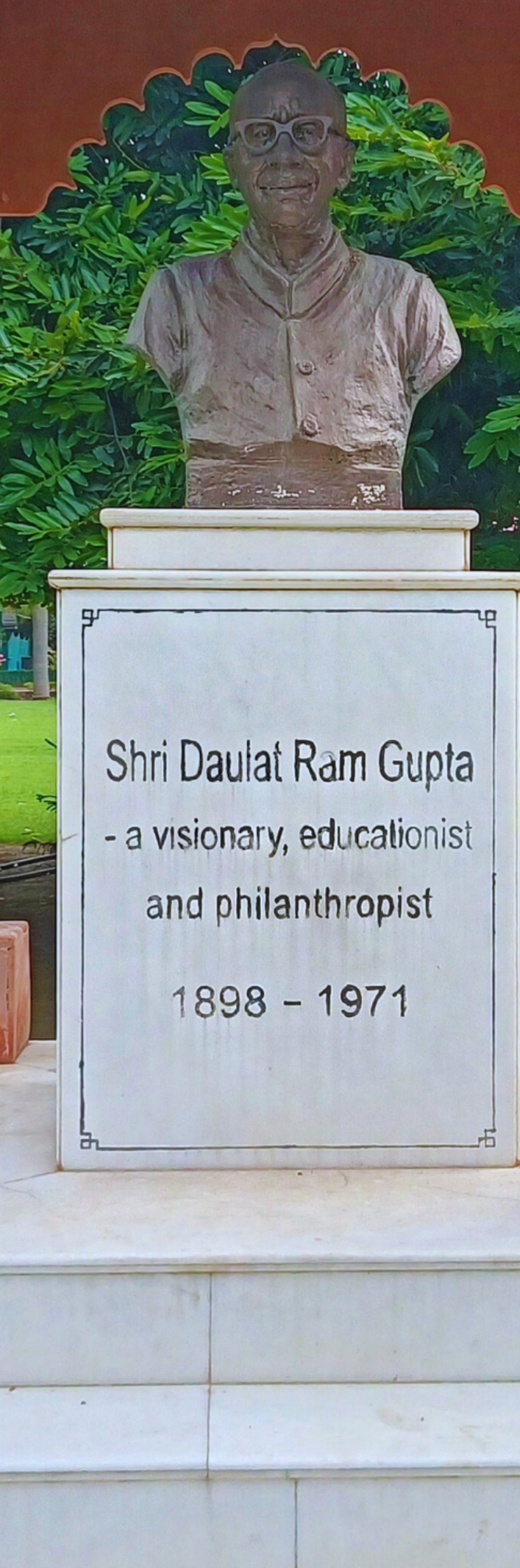

Daulat Ram College, founded in 1960 by an educationist, the late Shri Daulat Ram Gupta, is a prestigious women's college of the University of Delhi. The College imparts education towards degrees at the Bachelor's level in Arts, Commerce and Science and Master's level in Arts.

The Science courses were introduced in 1968 which led to the construction of the science block and well-equipped science laboratories. The commerce and M.A. courses in many subjects, as well as new courses in B.A. (Honours) and B.A. (Pass), were subsequently added. Further, expansion of the college took place with the introduction of B.Sc (Honours) in Biochemistry, Chemistry, and Mathematics and Office Management and Secretarial Practice (OMSP) subjects in B.A. (Pass). OMSP was later replaced by Entrepreneurship and Small Business (ESB).

The College also offers add-on diploma and certificate courses in Foreign Languages, and Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid. Currently, there are 18 departments with state-of-the-art facilities, about 188 teaching staff, 131 non-teaching staff and more than 4000 undergraduate students and 200 postgraduate students as a part of the DRC family. The college holds a leading position both in academics as well as in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Students participate in various societies, including NSS, Sports and NCC. The In-House Skill Development Programmes and Counselling offered by the college assist students in dealing with daily challenges and creating an identity for themselves. Along with their classroom teaching, the highly qualified and experienced teachers of the college have been at the forefront of various prestigious research projects sponsored by ICSSR, ICPR, UGC, CSIR, and DRDO where the students also get an opportunity to participate, contribute and learn.

The college truly provides a holistic experience to its students by working on their intellectual, emotional and spiritual development. The college's progress in the last couple of years has been meteoric.

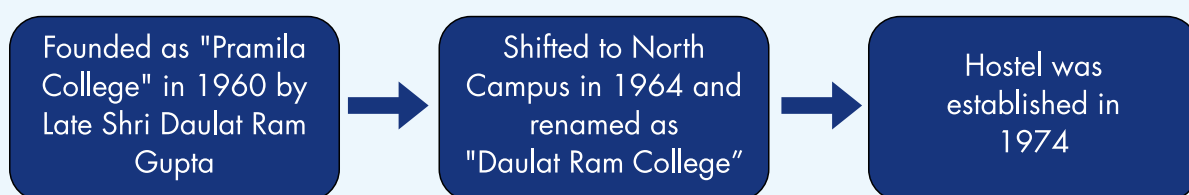

About the College

Mission { The goals and objectives of Daulat Ram College are to educate, engage, inculcate, and instill moral values with modern education in students, to help develop their personality and interpersonal skills.

Vision { The vision of Daulat Ram College is enshrined in its motto 'ऋते ज्ञानान्न मुक्तिः' that translates into 'Salvation through Knowledge'. The college seeks to disseminate knowledge in science, commerce, and liberal arts among girl students to make them empowered women capable of bringing societal change.



Shri Daulat Ram Gupta, a visionary educationist, conceived the college as an institution aiming to provide inclusive education to young women. Starting with around 350 students and 13 teachers in 6 departments, the college has now evolved into a versatile and dynamic institution with more than 4000 students coming from across the world, around 188 teaching and 130 non-teaching staff and 19 departments offering a diverse range of courses. The institution envisages to provide value-based education focusing on holistic growth and development by enhancing higher learning in Science, Commerce, and Humanities. It has been widely acclaimed for its academic achievements and co-curricular initiatives.

The college has a beautiful landscaped green campus with multiple facilities that support a viable, diversified and integrated culture for the development and growth of our cohort. With a distinguished faculty, the college remains at the forefront of delivering high quality education. It has well equipped and technologically advanced laboratories such as **Zebrafish Lab Facility, Drosophila Resource Centre, and Psychology Resource Centre**, facilitating major research projects sponsored by ICSSR, ICPR, UGC, CSIR and DRDO. As a leading institution, it envisages ICT facilities and has well equipped computer labs, besides Wi-Fi enabled lecture theatres/classrooms with LCD projectors. The **Psychology Resource Centre** provides various resources to students and staff through the Counselling Centre, Mental Health Centre, Positive Psychology Centre, Capacity Building Centre and Value Education Centre. The **Centre for Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid** runs add-on courses and a legal services clinic.

The **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)** is an integral part of our pedagogy that sustains and enhances the quality of our academic pursuits. The 'academic calendar' pertaining to various events such as international and national conferences, seminars, symposiums, colloquiums and curricular development initiatives ensures active participation of students, providing an immersive and inspiring environment of holistic teaching, learning, and research.

The **Library**, an integral part of academic pursuits, boasts of a renowned collection of more than one lakh volumes, journals, periodicals, books, newspapers, alongside a digital database. We also take pride in the rich Braille Section possessed by our library.

The **In-house Skill Development Programs** with an interdisciplinary approach, aim to provide training to students promoting life skills, learning abilities and healthy development along with learning ICT tools. The **Placement Cell** works with dedication and enthusiasm to provide top internship and recruitment opportunities to students.

Department associations, various societies and cells annually publish magazines and newsletters such as Expressions (the English department's annual publication), Mansi (Hindi department's hand-written magazine), Shreshtha (Women Development Cell's annual publication), Psytrack (Psychology department's magazine), Math Punch (Mathematics department's magazine), Naissance (Placement Cell's magazine), Optima (Economics department's magazine) and so on, with scholarly contributions from students as well as teachers. In addition to these, the college publishes Pramila, its annual magazine, with three language components - English, Hindi and Sanskrit.

The **Centre for Foreign Languages** established in 2005 offers part time certificate/diploma/advance diploma courses in several languages such as French, German, Spanish, Italian, Chinese, Japanese and Korean to students across colleges. The courses are conducted in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies and the Department of South Asian Studies, University of Delhi.

As a quintessence of inclusive education, **Daulat Ram College Hostel**, established in 1974, is a resource, dedicated to sharing and preserving integrated learning and growth of students across diverse cultures. The **Sadbhavana Bhawan**, a centre for sports, art and culture is one of the best auditoriums in the campus which hosts various events such as theatre, cultural performances, international integration programmes, conferences, annual day programmes, Manjari (the annual inter-college festival) and many more. An open-air **amphitheatre**, located at the centre of the college building, which after renovation came to be known as 'Rangshala', encourages students to organise and participate in a wide variety of theatrical, musical and cultural events. The state-of-the-art **conference hall** is specially designed for academic interaction and professional engagements programs.

The **multipurpose sports complex** cum fitness centre offers facilities for various sports events and has produced several athletes and players at the state, regional and national levels. The college also organises Paralympics which have been instrumental in providing opportunities to specially-abled students to participate and compete at inter-college level. The infrastructure of the college is sensitised to the needs of specially abled students and staff. The **Equal Opportunity Cell** and **Enabling Unit** create a socially conducive environment that facilitates inclusive interpersonal and academic interactions.

The **Recycling Unit** has paper recycling machines and leaf shredder machines to make the college a zero-discharge campus. The **Eco Club** (Dhara) generates awareness regarding practices of keeping the college green and clean. The **Cyber Cell** creates awareness to judiciously use and explore the challenges and opportunities offered by cyber space.

Various societies under Extra Curricular Activities Committee such as **Debating Society** (Debsoc), **Dramatics Society** (Memesis), **Fine Arts Society** (Spectra), **Film and Photography Society** (Magic Lantern and Sepia), **Music and Dance Society** (Indian - Alahyaa, Annhad, and Western- Encore, Zenith), **Quiz Society** (Tajagna), **Poetry Society** (Imagism), and **Fashion Society** (Debonair) contribute in many ways to the continued endeavour of enhancing talent. To maintain the legacy of excellence, our dedicated teachers and students work

relentlessly to organise and participate in a plethora of curricular and extracurricular activities, with the Youth Parliament, MUNs and the College Play being the most distinct genres. The annual **Daulat Ram Gupta Memorial Debate**, a tribute to our legendary founder, plays a key role in stimulating and cultivating critical thinking among students across colleges.

The **Gandhi Study Circle** actively engages in comprehending and contemplating the different facets of the life of Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi to inculcate Gandhian values among the college fraternity. The **Women Development Cell** (Pragati) educates and empowers students by building awareness about gender-based discrimination and develops their understanding of women's rights. The **Gender Champion Cell** also plays a significant role in creating positive social norms to improve the well-being of women and achieving long-term and sustainable social change. To inspire young minds, cultivate the values embedded in Indian heritage and culture, the SPIC MACAY programmes have remained a regular feature of Daulat Ram College since 1984. Payment of Fees

Identity Card

Every student is issued an identity card by the College. It is mandatory for students to carry it every day. In case of any kind of indiscipline, the I-card will be confiscated. In case of loss of I-card the students are advised to intimate the college office immediately. Duplicate I-card will be issued on payment of Rs. 500/- Any change of address or phone no. should also be notified by the student.

Discipline

Students will be governed as per Ordinance XV-B of the University Calendar.

Concession/Waiver of Fees for Persons with Disabilities (PwBD)

Candidates with physical disabilities pursuing various programmes of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centres, and Institutions/Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fees and other University fees, except Admission fees, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity Card fees (As per amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University).

- a) PwBD Candidates who meet the cut-off for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD Candidate.
- b) As per the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels/Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fees and charges except refundable caution fees and the mess fees. Persons with Physical Disabilities who are students shall pay 50% of the Mess fees and the remaining 50% of their Mess Fees will be met by the University of Delhi. Similar norms are adopted by our college in respect of PwBD students residing in the hostel.
- c) PwBD students who are getting fellowships/financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fees/charges/mess fees subject to the following conditions. All admitted SC/ST, OBC, EWS, PwBD students in colleges who are eligible for fellowships should submit their scholarship forms to the requisite office by February for timely processing.

Relevant University Ordinances

Successful Candidates will be required to abide by the Ordinances of the University and will be required to provide a written undertaking to this effect at the time of admission. A few extracts of important ordinances are reproduced here.

ORDINANCE XV-B: Maintenance of discipline among Students of the University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify on this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - a. Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
 - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons
 - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
 - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes
 - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women
 - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner
 - g. Wilful destruction of institutional property
 - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
 - i. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
 - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/ her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students-
 - a. be expelled; or
 - b. be, for a stated period rusticated; or
 - c. be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
 - d. be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
 - e. be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he /she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.

6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself / herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he /she submits himself / herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed therein by the University.

ORDINANCE XV-C: Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/ Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
 - a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
 - b. Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students.
 - c. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
 - d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
 - e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause above, the Proctor may also suo motu enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c), the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.

ORDINANCE XV-D/The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at work place and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected there with incidental thereto.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment;

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace. For details, please see the website

Internal Complaints Committee

Under Gazette notification of Government of India, University Grants Commission (Prevention, prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women employees and students in higher educational institutions) Regulations, 2015 has been notified which is binding University and Colleges.

The Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India has also published a "Handbook on Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace" which describes the issues like what is workplace sexual harassment, its prevention, prohibition and redressal along with the global norms and good practices following in this regard.

With reference to UGC letter No.F.91/9/2015 (GS/MHRD) dated 5th July 2016, College has constituted an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) through a written order under the above Regulations.

Under-Graduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF - 2022)

Keeping in mind the underlying principles of National Education Policy 2020, the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework-2022 (UGCF-2022) of the University of Delhi has been structured to provide opportunities to students across disciplines to pursue research, innovation, apprenticeship, social outreach, entrepreneurship and many similar areas of knowledge and creativity.

Every discipline offers five categories of courses of study, viz. Discipline Specific Core courses (DSCs), Discipline Specific Electives (DSEs), Generic Electives (GEs), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and Value Addition Courses (VAC) with multiple exit options as per NEP 2020.

Discipline Specific Core is a mandatory course of study to be pursued by a student. For award of single discipline specific Honours degree DSCs shall be the core courses of that discipline. To pursue an Honours degree programme in a 'Field of Multidisciplinary Courses of Study' the DSCs shall comprise of core credit courses of more than one discipline. In the fourth year of such honours degree programmes students will study only one discipline and hence the DSC courses in the VII and VIII semesters shall be of one discipline and not a combination of these three disciplines. Please refer to the framework given as Illustration –I in Table-6 of UGCF 2022 Based on NEP 2020.

Generic Electives shall be a pool of courses which is meant to provide multidisciplinary or interdisciplinary education to students. GEs shall consist of a pool of courses offered by various disciplines of study (excluding the GEs offered by the parent discipline), in groups of odd and even semesters, from which a student can choose. In case a student opts for DSEs beyond her discipline specific course(s) of study, such DSEs shall be treated as GEs for that student.

Ability Enhancement course (AEC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) & Value Addition Course (VAC) are a pool of courses offered by all the Departments in groups of odd and even semesters from which students can choose. A student who desires to make Academic Project/Entrepreneurship as Minor has to pick the appropriate combination of courses of GE, SEC, VAC, & Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/ Community (IAPC) which shall be offered in the form of various modules as specified in the scheme of studies.

A student pursuing four-year undergraduate programme in a specific discipline (Core course) shall be awarded an appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she secures in that Discipline at least 50% of the total credits i.e., at least 88 credits in that Discipline out of the total of 176 credits. He/she shall study 20 DSCs and at least 2 DSEs in eight semesters. A student may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from seven GE courses in that discipline. For example, if a student pursuing B.A. (Honours) History chooses seven GE courses of Political Science out of a total of ten GE courses and writes dissertation, she shall be awarded on successful completion of VIII Semester, Major in History and Minor in Political Science.

A student pursuing a four-year undergraduate programme in more than one discipline as Core Course (for example B.A. Social Sciences/ Humanities, B.Sc. Life Sciences, B.Sc. Physical Sciences, B.Sc. Mathematical Sciences, B.Com. and such other programmes) shall be awarded an appropriate Honours degree with Major in a Discipline on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she secures in that Discipline 80 credits out of a total of 176 credits. He/she shall study 6 DSCs and at least 3 DSEs in that discipline in the first six semesters and 2 DSCs, 6 DSEs and write a dissertation in that discipline in the VII and VIII semesters. A student may be awarded Minor in a discipline, on completion of VIII Semester, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of that

discipline. For example, a student pursuing four-year B.A. (Honours) Social Sciences/Humanities with Major in History (after securing at least 80 credits in History), may be awarded Minor in Hindi if she earns 28 credits from six DSCs and one DSE of Hindi (up to VI semester), on successful completion of VIII Semester.

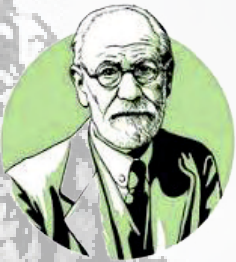

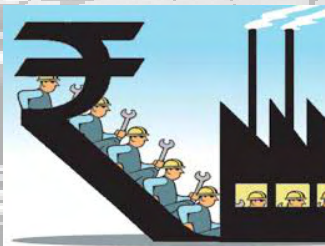

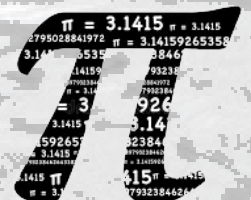

प्रमुख विशेषताएँ: हिंदी विभाग में साहित्य, संस्कृति और रचनात्मकता का सुंदर समन्वय होता है। हस्तलिखित पत्रिका 'मानसी' छात्राओं की अभिव्यक्ति का सशक्त मंच है। विभाग द्वारा 43 वर्षों से 'आचार्य हजारीप्रसाद द्विवेदी भाषणमाला' आयोजित की जाती है। देश के प्रतिष्ठित साहित्यकारों से संवाद की परंपरा यहाँ जीवित है। यहाँ अध्ययन, सृजन और विमर्श को समान महत्व दिया जाता है।

हिन्दी ऑनर्स पाठ्यक्रम महाविद्यालय में सन् 1964 से विधिवत रूप से आरंभ हुआ। इससे पूर्व 1960 से 1963 तक हिन्दी विषय पासकोर्स का अभिन्न अंग था। प्रारंभ से ही इस पाठ्यक्रम का उद्देश्य न केवल साहित्य और भाषा के अध्ययन को प्रोत्साहित करना रहा है, बल्कि समयानुकूल इसमें रोजगारपरक और बौद्धिक दृष्टिकोण से उपयोगी विषयों का समावेश भी होता रहा है। इसके माध्यम से छात्राएँ साहित्यिक अध्ययन के साथ-साथ समाज, संस्कृति, भाषा और संप्रेषण के क्षेत्र में भी दक्षता प्राप्त करती हैं। यही कारण है कि हिन्दी ऑनर्स करने वाले विद्यार्थियों के लिए रोजगार के अनेक विकल्प उपलब्ध हैं, जैसे- अध्यापन, शोध, अनुवाद, पत्रकारिता, जनसंचार, रेडियो-टीवी, रंगमंच, विज्ञापन, हिन्दी कम्प्यूटिंग, जनसंपर्क अधिकारी, लेखन, प्रशासनिक सेवाएँ आदि। हिन्दी विभाग का वातावरण शैक्षणिक और रचनात्मक गतिविधियों से समृद्ध रहता है। 'हिंदी साहित्य परिषद' द्वारा प्रतिवर्ष विभिन्न प्रतियोगिताओं के आयोजन के साथ-साथ हस्तलिखित पत्रिका 'मानसी' का विमोचन किया जाता है, जिसमें छात्राओं की रचनात्मक अभिव्यक्ति को स्थान मिलता है। वर्ष 1980 से 'आचार्य हजारीप्रसाद द्विवेदी स्मारक भाषणमाला' के आयोजन द्वारा छात्राओं को प्रसिद्ध साहित्यकारों व आलोचकों से संवाद का अवसर प्रदान किया जाता है। साहित्य अध्यापन का कार्य शोध कार्य में रूचि रखने वाले समर्पित अनुभवी प्राध्यापकों द्वारा किया जाता है, जो स्वयं को क्रियाशील बनाये रखने के साथ-साथ विभिन्न अकादमिक गतिविधियों, कार्यशालाओं, राष्ट्रीय और अंतर्राष्ट्रीय संगोष्ठियों में भाग लेते रहते हैं। राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति 2020 के अंतर्गत आरंभ हुए चार वर्षीय स्नातक पाठ्यक्रम में हिन्दी भाषा को और अधिक समृद्ध किया गया है। अब हिन्दी न केवल ऑनर्स विषय के रूप में, बल्कि क्षमता संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (AEC), सामान्य वैकल्पिक (GE), कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (SEC) और मूल्य संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (VAC) के रूप में भी पढ़ाई जाती है। बी.ए. प्रोग्राम और बी.कॉम. प्रोग्राम में विद्यार्थियों के भाषा-स्तर के अनुसार हिन्दी 'क', 'ख', और 'ग' के रूप में पाठ्यक्रम में निर्धारित है। इस नए ढांचे में हिन्दी भाषा और साहित्य के विविध पक्षों के साथ-साथ अन्य भारतीय भाषाओं की कालजयी कृतियों को भी स्थान दिया गया है, जिससे छात्राओं को समकालीन विषयों, सामाजिक सरोकारों और सांस्कृतिक विविधताओं को गहराई से समझने की प्रेरणा मिलती है। हिन्दी ऑनर्स पाठ्यक्रम केवल अकादमिक अध्ययन तक सीमित न रहकर छात्राओं के सर्वांगीण विकास का सशक्त माध्यम बनता है। हिंदी विभाग शिक्षण, शोध और साहित्यिक गतिविधियों के समन्वय से छात्राओं को स्वतंत्र अनुसंधान, रचनात्मक लेखन और अकादमिक उत्कृष्टता की ओर प्रेरित करता है।

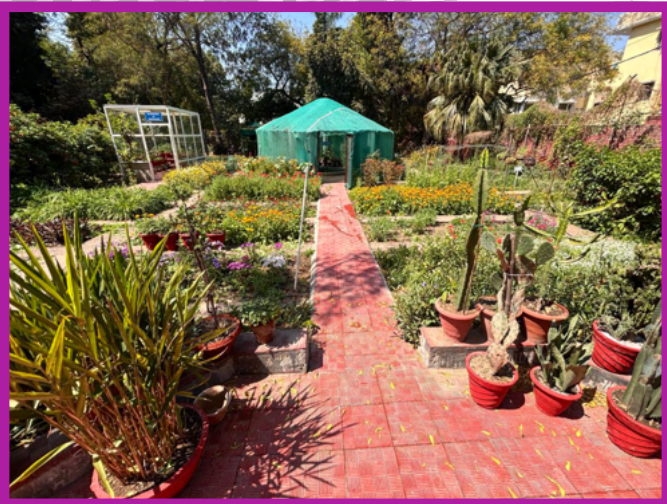

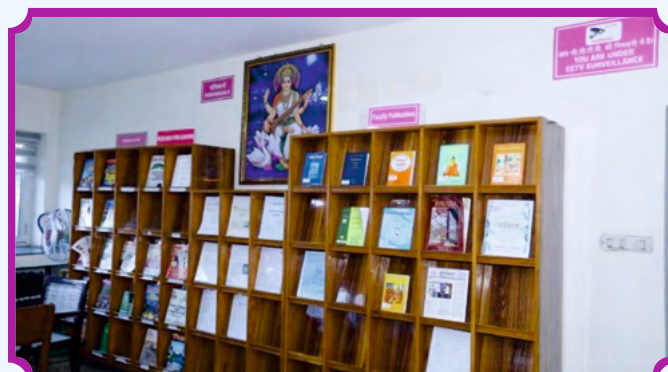

Library



The college library holds over 1 lakh books on various subjects and interests of its users. The advanced-level software, namely KOHA (Library automation and management system), is used for library management and creating a digital platform for library users. Research Facilities and Laboratories



Drosophila Resource Centre, Zoology Department



The **Drosophila Resource Centre** in the Department of Zoology was set up by Dr. Chitra Bhasin. Since its inception in 2013 the centre has been providing hands-on training to undergraduate students to introduce the students to this interesting insect- *Drosophila*. It is a favorite model organism and is used extensively to study disciplines like genetics and developmental biology. Students also learn the nuisances of setting up and maintaining stocks in the lab. Every year the centre provides hands-on training of basic genomics and proteomics using *Drosophila* to students. The basic aim of this centre is to provide laboratory exposure to students interested in pursuing research.

The centre also provides internships to graduate and undergraduate students who intend to have exposure to experimental laboratories.

Zebrafish Lab Facility



The **Zebrafish lab facility** was set up in October 2015, jointly by the Biochemistry department and Zoology department in collaboration with CSIR-IGIB, Mathura Road, Delhi, and Sansriti Foundation, Delhi. The facility has been funded by Star Innovation projects DU, Star College project DBT, Govt. of India, and Innovation projects DU. It was developed with the aim of providing an alternative in vivo non-invasive model system for science education, teaching and research.

The state-of-the-art temperature and photo-period controlled facility houses an automated re-circulatory fish habitat system, RO water plant, stereo-microscopes, inverted microscope with digital display screen (Evos) and fluorescent microscope (Nikon). Apart from on going research projects, the facility provides training in zebrafish model system to faculty and students. Till date ~ 150 faculty members and ~1000 students from various science streams from different Delhi University Colleges have participated in various workshops and training programs conducted by the zebrafish lab facility.

Summer internship/ training programs, skill development programs are available to under-graduate and postgraduate students to get hands-on training and research experience. Zebrafish lab facility also serves as a resource center to provide zebrafish and embryos to other colleges/ departments and research institutes to support teaching and law practicals.

Plant Tissue Culture Research Facilities



The Department of Botany has a well equipped Tissue Culture Lab maintained for more than two decades. The Tissue Culture Research Lab is mainly used for training the final year students to micropropagate species of elite trees and also for research projects based on micropropagation of rare and medicinally important plants. Teachers and trained Lab staff help to carry out experiments smoothly.

Culture Room with Horizontal Laminar- air-flow cabinet to raise in vitro Plant Tissue Cultures under sterile conditions, Room Thermometer, Hygrometer and Culture Rack Trolleys fitted with fluorescent lights and automatic timer.

Instrument cum Preparation Room with basic equipments like High Precision Digital Balance, pH meters, Orbital Shakers, Hot Plates, BOD, Ultra Centrifuge machines, Double Distillation Unit, Hot Air Oven, Vertical and Horizontal Autoclave, Refrigerator and Deep Freezer, Microtome, Simple, Compound,, Dissection and High Resolution Microscopes with In-built Camera, Inverted Binocular, Separate Wash Area for washing and rinsing of glasswares. Green House Facility with controlled conditions of light, humidity and temperature for establishment of in vitro grown plantlets in soil. There is always scope for further improvement of Plant Tissue Culture Research Facilities in the near future.



Neuropharmacology, Drug Delivery and Cancer Research Laboratory (NDCRL)

The NDCRL, formerly known as NDDL, was established in 2018 under the guidance of the late Dr. Amar Jyoti. His vision was to raise the research profile of Daulat Ram College.

The lab conducts training and internship programs titled "Fundamental Techniques in Cancer Research" for UG, PG, and Ph.D. students, introducing them to experimental cancer biology research and building foundational skills in the life sciences.

The lab's initiatives continue to inspire students to pursue excellence in science and technology.

Centre for Foreign Languages

All these Certificate, Diploma & Advance Diploma Courses are conducted in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, Department of South Asian Studies, University of Delhi.

Aquaculture Centre for Ornamental Fish



The Aquaculture Laboratory offers practical training under Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) to promote sustainable aquaculture and entrepreneurship. The following Courses are offered:

1. Aquaculture Entrepreneurship: Training in modern and traditional aquaculture techniques and sustainable water management and ornamental plant cultivation.
2. Ornamental Fish Culture: Aquarium decoration, fish breeding, and nutritional observation. Gain practical knowledge on breeding and culture of various ornamental fishes. Maintenance and management of optimum water quality for healthy fish production.
3. Fish Feed Formulation: Indigenous ingredient identification and optimized feeding strategies. Monitor the fishes to analyze the impact of formulated feeds on fish growth, so we can optimize feeding strategies that improve fish health.
4. Fish Breeding and Larviculture: Broodstock maintenance and live feed usage for larvae survival. Breeding of the following fishes: guppy, molly, poller parrot, etc.

Skill Development Centre in Drosophila and Zebrafish Model Organism



The Centre was established in 2023 with the seed grant of RS. 10 lakhs received from Skill Enhancement Courses committee (SEC), University of Delhi with the vision and mission to create a skill trained pool of students who are future ready to embark on a career path in biomedical research labs, and Pharma and Biotechnology Industry. To skill train them in animal husbandry, breeding, handling and application of Drosophila, and zebrafish model organisms as research models. The centre further aims to provide research Internship opportunities to students to gain research experience and upgrade skill sets in research methodologies and Data analysis and presentation. Various opportunities are provided to help them develop commercially viable tool kits for Bio-materials and technology transfer, to develop and maintain stocks and mutant strains of animal model systems.

The Centre serves as a Central resource centre for providing technical support, bio-materials, and tool kits to other colleges and institutes to perform advance experiments in Cell Biology, Developmental Biology, neurobiology, genetics, toxicology, Molecular Biology and drug discovery.

The Centre is successfully running the Skill enhancement course (SEC) course: "Drosophila and Zebrafish Model Organisms in Biological studies" under UGCF 2020 since 2023 in each semester.

More than 1000 students from DRC, SVC, DBC, SRCASW and NIET (Pharmacy College), Noida, AIIMS have been skill trained in Drosophila and Zebrafish model systems.

The Center published a Practical Lab Manual for the SEC course: Drosophila and Zebrafish Model Organism in Biological Studies, authored by Prof. Padmshree Mudgal, Dr. Neeru Dhamija, and Dr. Anita Goel (Department of Biochemistry, Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi) in 2024. This Practical lab Manual would serve as a resource material for the teaching faculty and provide ready hand out material for students.

The students and faculty associated with the Skill Development Center participated in Skill, Startup and Entrepreneurship Expo in DU, Oct. 4-6th Oct 2024. The Center was awarded The Potential for Excellence Award.

Skill Development Centre on Hydroponics and Aeroponics



Established by the Department of Botany in 2023 under the guidance of Professor Rekha Kathal, the centre aims to promote the principles of sustainable farming through Hydroponics and Aeroponics.

This year, the centre has efficiently trained 35 students from diverse science streams such as Botany, Life Sciences, and Zoology from Delhi University. The training sessions, which include hands-on experiences in media preparation, instrumentation, certification, and marketing, have proven highly beneficial, as reflected in positive student feedback.

Currently, the centre is cultivating vegetables such as lettuce and herbs like Basil and Brahmi using both vertical grow towers and horizontal units with Nutrient Film Technology.

From February 24 to March 1, 2025, the centre conducted a Skill Development Programme titled “Hydroponics and Aeroponics – The Future of Sustainable Farming” under the coordination of Dr. Sunita George and Dr. Kamlesh Kumari. The program featured expert speakers from industrial and government sectors, providing students with technical knowledge and entrepreneurship skills. It also guided them on obtaining grants from funding agencies.

Add-On Courses

1. Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid



The college is offering an Add-on Certificate Course on “Legal Literacy, Awareness and Aid” in collaboration with statutory Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLISA). This 3 Month course aims to educate the learners from diverse disciplines and backgrounds, particularly from non-law field about the theoretical and practical aspects of the legal framework.

The Course plan includes sessions on Women and Children Laws, Human Rights Law, Legal procedure and services in India delivered by eminent members from judicial and legal fraternity along with specially designed modules focusing on the field visits such as Police Station, Family Court, Tihar Jail, Mediation Centre, Civil Court etc.

The Certificate course is open to ALL, with minimum eligibility being passing the Senior Secondary School Examination with 50% marks. Moreover, such course is now an integral requirement in the College and University education system and the basic precept of National Education Policy 2020.

The registration for the fifth batch of Certificate Course will tentatively commence from August 2025

2. Courses in Foreign Languages

Daulat Ram College Centre for Foreign Languages offers part time Certificate/ Diploma/Advance Diploma Courses in the following Foreign Languages to those who wish to develop their skills and fluency in both speaking and writing these languages.

1. French
2. German
3. Spanish
4. Italian
5. Chinese
6. Japanese
7. Korean

Advance Diploma Courses are offered only to those who have qualified the Diploma Course in the relevant language and Diploma Courses are open to those who have qualified the Certificate Course in the concerned language. Students who are seeking admissions in Advance Diploma in German/Spanish/French/Italian language and have passed the Certificate/Diploma Course from Institutions other than Delhi University/Gap year cases are required to clear the entrance test conducted by the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, Delhi University.

All these Certificate, Diploma & Advance Diploma Courses are conducted in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, Department of South Asian Studies, University of Delhi.

The college will follow the University calendar in all matters related to academics. The annual examination is held as per the schedule announced by the University of Delhi and the students are required to fulfil all criteria laid down by the respective department.

There are 50 seats in the college. A minimum of 20 students will be deemed to constitute a section to start a course. The college reserves the right to withdraw a course if a sufficient number of students have not applied for it.



Skill Development Programs 2025-26



Daulat Ram College is the pioneer college in initiating In-House Skill Development Programs in the University since 2015. Each year skill development programs are organised to impart training in technical, academic and vocational skills that will foster innovative thinking and creativity. The programs are aimed to provide active learning experiences and by engaging in various skills development programs through on-hands approach. The programs facilitate new skills as well as provide an opportunity to upgrade specific skills that will be beneficial to the students not only in their academic pursuits but also equip them with ideas for entrepreneurship. The programs focus on providing Skills promoting Professional Competency (videography, academic writing, research skills, Career/Education Counseling, Developing innovation skills, Digital support training etc); Acquiring Technical Skills in Digital environment (Computer literacy, Communication skills, Programming languages, Software skills, Psychometry, Artificial Intelligence, nanotechnology, etc) and Skills for contributing to Community Growth and Prosperity (Community development, personality development, Social /life skills, Lifestyle practices, Health Awareness programs). SDP on Basic ICT tools is organised every year for the incoming first year students to provide extensive two day training in the use of various programs as G-suits, collaborating on google doc, editing Media, making Power-point presentations, accessing materials on google classroom and submitting assignments, conducting tests, analysis and graphical presentations of data etc. The students were given ample assignments and evaluated on the skills learned.
